










Chart: 9.01: The 2008 CPI Basket Expenditure Weight by Division



- 6. The Rescue Organic Fertilizers were introduced in 2008. In 2010 DoA ceased imports of these products in deference to a private sector company that took up the product line.
- 7. Sales in 2011 represented sales of remaining inventory after importation ceased.
- 8. The introduction of protected agriculture (tropical shade houses) in 2009 and subsequent expansion in 2010 necessitated the importation and sale of a range of specialized fertilizers shown at the bottom of the table
