1. Preface

force:

The Cayman Islands Labour Force Survey (LFS) was designed to measure the characteristics, levels and trends of employment, unemployment and labour force in the Cayman Islands. This survey is being conducted bi-annually most years since 1992. The reference period for this edition of the LFS was the week ending October 6th 2007 while the actual survey was conducted during the period October 7th to November 12th 2007.

Planning and execution of the survey was done by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department of the Portfolio of Finance and Economics of the Cayman Islands Government. Data collection was done by the staff together with experienced contracted enumerators. The ESO Census and Survey Supervisor supervised the field interviews while data entry and processing were implemented by the ESO staff with some technical assistance from an International Consultant.

This LFS Report is very similar to the LFS Report 2006 and includes data sets in the following areas:

- Employment: the following data sets for employed persons are shown: (a) employment by industry; (b) employment status whether employed or self employed with employees; (c) estimated earnings per month; (d) hours of work by industry; (e) employment by occupation classes;
 Unemployment: the duration of unemployment is presented
- Persons not in the labour

data on characteristics of persons who are of working age but not in the labour force during the reference period are presented in this report: (a) demographic characteristics; (b) means of financial support; and (c) reasons for not seeking work.

In addition, frequency distribution tables on the socio-economic characteristics of sampled households are also shown, including:

- Household size;
- Number of personal trips abroad and costs of trips abroad;
- Money sent abroad and money received from abroad;
- Households operating/owning a small business; and
- Type and tenure of dwelling.

When comparing LFS 2006 with LFS 2007 it should be noted that LFS 2006 was carried out in spring (reference period late April) and LFS 2007 was carried out in the autumn (reference period beginning of October).





2. Definitions

Household

A private household consists of one or more persons (not necessarily related) living together and sharing at least one of the main daily meals or common housekeeping. In general, therefore, a household will comprise a father, mother and children living together.

Labour Force

The labour force is composed of those members of the non-institutional population (i.e. those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary, retirement homes) 15 years of age and over, whom during the reference week were employed or unemployed.

Employed

Employed persons are those who, during the reference week, did any work for pay or profit; that is, paid work in the context of an employer – employee relationship, or of self-employment. It also includes unpaid family work defined as unpaid work which contributed directly to the operation of a farm, business or professional practice, owned or operated by a related member of the household. Based on guidelines of the International Labour Organization (ILO), work can be for as little as an hour during the reference week; it excludes domestic housework but includes those temporarily (4 weeks or less) away from their jobs.

Unemployed

Unemployed persons are those who, during the reference week:

- A) Were without work, had actively looked for work in the past four weeks and were available for work.
- B) Had not actively looked for work in the past four weeks but had a new job to start in four weeks or less and were available for work.

Not in the Labour Force

Those persons in the non-institution population (i.e. those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary, retirement homes) -15 years of age and over -who, during the reference week, were neither employed nor unemployed.





Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate represents the number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force. The unemployment rate for a particular group (age, status sex, etc.) is the number unemployed in that group expressed as a percentage of the labour force for that group.

Participation Rate

Participation rate is the number of persons in the labour force as a proportion of the working age population. The participation rate for a particular group (age, status sex, etc.) is the number of persons in the labour force in that group expressed as a percentage of the working age population for that group.

Employment/Population Ratio

The employment/population ratio represents the number of persons employed expressed as a percentage of the population 15 years of age and over. The employment/population ratio for a particular group (age, sex, marital status, etc) is the number employed in that group expressed as a percentage of the population for that group.

Part-time Workers

Those who are employed and usually work less than 30 hours per week. This would include students who were 15 years of age and over who work less than 30 hours per week.

Underemployed

Those who usually work less than 30 hours per week because those are the only hours available and were actively seeking and were available to work additional hours.

Rounding and Suppression

Estimates published are rounded to the nearest whole number but all derived values (totals, averages, rates, ratios, etc) are calculated from un-rounded figures. Therefore the sum of individual rounded items may not equal the total. In addition the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding. As practiced in previous LFS, estimates of 25 or lower have been suppressed as indicated by "…" as they are considered to be too unreliable to be useful.





3. Methodology

The statistics contained in this report are based on information obtained through a sample survey of households. A sample of representative households were drawn at random from a sampling frame based on the ESO's Household Register. The total number of households in the sampling frame was 21 208. Interviews were conducted during October 7th – November 12th given that the reference week was the week ending October 6th 2007.

Sampled dwellings declared "out of scope", "vacant" and "unable to find" were not replaced with new households inasmuch as the sampling design already considered such possibilities. The number of households which fully or partially completed the survey was 1,253.


The following table depicts the district distribution of samples by district:

5. Summary of Results

The results of this edition of the Labour Force Survey (LFS) are presented in two sets: the first set of tables consist of Tables 1 to 17B, while the second set is comprised of frequency distribution tables. The frequency tables are best understood if studied together with the corresponding questions in the LFS 2007 questionnaire, which is available at the ESO website: www.eso.ky.

5.1 Population

The total population of Cayman Islands was estimated at 53,886 persons (see Table 1A).

Table 1A also shows that the estimated total number of males during the reference period was 26,773 (or 49.7%) while the total number of females was 27,113 (or 50.3%). Of the total population during the reference week, 60.1 percent (or 32,367) were Caymanians, and 39.9 percent (or 21,519) were Non-Caymanians (Please see Tables 1A and Chart 1).





Chart 1: Population Characteristics








Chart 2: Population Age Distribution*

The median age is 36 years, which is the same as in LFS 2006.



5.2 Labour Force

Of the total population during the reference week, 36,476 persons were in the labour force (please see Table 2). Of those in the labour force, 35,081 persons (or 96.2%) were employed, while 1,395 (or 3.8%) were unemployed. (Please see Chart 3).




Chart 3: Fall 2007 Labour Force

In terms of nationality, there were 18,466 Caymanians in the labour force (50.6%), while Non-Caymanians numbered 18,010 persons (49.4%). (Please see Table 3A).

Of all the Caymanians in the labour force, 17,406 (or 94.3%) were employed while 1,059 persons (or 5.7%) were unemployed. Of all the Non-Caymanians in the labour force, 17,675 (or 98.1%) were employed while, 336 (or 1.9%) were unemployed. (Please see Tables 3A and 3B).

The unemployment rate is higher than in the spring LFS 2006 (3.8% compared to 2.6%). This could be due to a seasonal effect. The labour market in Cayman Islands is probably better in the spring than in the fall.

It should be noted that the employment pattern by status and by sex is very similar between LFS 2006 and LFS 2007.





Other characteristics of the labour force are as follows:

- The overall participation rate (that is, the proportion of the labour force to the total working age population) was 81.8 percent. The overall participation rate of Caymanians was 74.5 percent, while the overall participation rate of Non-Caymanians was 90.8 percent (see Table 4).
- In terms of gender, there were 18,967 (or 52%) males in the labour force while there were 17,509 of females (or 48%) (see Table 4).
- The top three highest educational attainment of the labour force were high school education (44.3%); university (19.8%); and college (18.7%) (please see Table 5A and 5B).

5.3 Employed Persons

The key characteristic of the employed persons during the survey period are as follows:

- In terms of sex, 18,305 (or 52.2%) were male and 16,776 (or 47.8%) were female (see Table 3A).
- In terms of age, majority of the employed were in the following age brackets: 35-44 years (32.4%), 25-34 years (28.5%) and 45-54 (20.1%) (see Table 6B).




Chart 4: Employment by Age Group*

- Of all the employed persons, 91.9 percent were paid employees and 7.6 percent were self- employed (see Tables 7A and 7B).
- In terms of industry, the top five employers during the survey were (please see Tables 8A and 8B):
 - Construction 16.1%
 - o Real Estate, Renting and Business Activities 12.0%
 - Wholesale and Retail 10.3%
 - o Restaurants and Bars, Hotels and Condominiums 10.0%
 - Financial Services 9.5%
- In terms of earnings, a total of 20,904 persons or (59.6%) were earning \$3,333 and below per month while 11,617 persons (or 33.1%) were earning above \$3,333 per month. Please note that the "not stated" category is quite high for this question (7.3%). The proportion of Caymanians who stated earnings above \$3,333 per month was 37.8% while the proportion for non-Caymanians was estimated at 28.5%. (Please see Tables 9A, 9B and Chart 5)




Chart 5: Earnings of Employed by Nationality



- In terms of occupation classes, the top five classes were (please see Table 10):
 - o Professionals, Technicians and Associate Professionals 25.2%
 - Craft and Related Workers 14.4%
 - Elementary Occupations 13.2%
 - o Clerical 13.2%
 - o Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers 13.1%
- Of all the employed persons, 1,143 (or 3.3%) were part-time employees (see Table 11).
- Majority of the employed (64.7%) worked 40-49 hrs per week (see Table 12 and Chart 6).




Chart 6: Hours Worked per Week for the Employed



5.4 Unemployed Persons

The estimated number of unemployed during the survey period was 1,395 (or 3.8% of the labour force).

The unemployed persons consisted of 1,059 Caymanians (76%) and 336 Non-Caymanians (24%) (see Tables 13A and 13B).




Chart 7: Unemployment by Nationality

In terms of age, the highest unemployment rates were found among the 15-19 years of age (23.1%) and 20-24 years (7.7%).




Chart 8: Unemployment Rates by Age Groups



Majority of the unemployed (56.7%) did not have work for at least six months (see Table 14A and 14B). The main means of support for the unemployed were their spouse/partner (28.6%) or parents (27.1%) (see Table 15A and 15B).

5.5 Persons Not in the Labour Force

The number of persons estimated to be not in the labour force reached 8,140 (Table 16A and 16B).

- Persons over the age of 55 (retirees) was 3,783 or approximately 46.5 percent of those not in the labour force.
- The number of persons between the ages 15 and 54 was 4,225 of which the majority were between the ages of 15 to 19 (23.6%).




Chart 9: Not in the Labour Force by Age*

• The main means of support of persons not in the labour force were parents (26.8%) or spouse (17.3%) (see Table 18).



5.6 General Household Characteristics

Some highlights from the frequency tables were as follows:

- 77.2% of the sampled households had one to three members (Table 21). Note that the average household size was 2.5 persons (2.6 in LFS 2006).
- About 35% of the population sent money abroad during the last 12 months, but only about 5% received money from abroad (Tables 26 and 29).
- Money is usually sent abroad using non-bank money transfer agents (Table 28).
- About 7% of persons aged 15 and older owned/operated a small business (Table 32).
- 37.7% of households lived in detached houses and 31.1% in apartments (Table 39).
- 47.9% of households were dwelling in rented housing while 48.6% owned their dwellings with or without mortgage (Table 40).
