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1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings on the 2011 Labour Force Survey (LFS). Since 2005, the LFS has been conducted on a yearly basis in October. Previous to that, the LFS was conducted twice a year in April and October. Financial constraints have led to a reduction in the frequency of the Survey.

The Labour Force Survey has been used to provide information on the characteristics of persons in the Labour Force. The concepts used in the survey are in accordance with the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines and therefore, the indicators produced from the Survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The remaining sections of this report present the methodology (Section 2), the main findings with emphasis on the profile of the labour force, and those that are out of the labour force (Section 3) and other findings on training, expenses & remittances and housing characteristics (Section 4). Where possible, the data are disaggregated by sex, age and status and comparisons are made with results of the 2010 Census of Population (2010 Census).



2. METHODOLOGY

Planning and execution of the 2011 Labour Force survey (LFS) was done by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department of the Ministry of Finance, Development and Tourism of the Cayman Islands Government.

The ESO's Household Register, which is comprised of a listing of all households and dwelling units countrywide, provided the sampling frame for the survey. This register had a total of approximately 24,000 entries comprising of all households counted in the 2010 Census and the results of updates conducted in August 2011 on dwellings that were previously counted as under construction and vacant. A sample of 1,672 household addresses was randomly selected for the survey.

The reference period of the LFS was the week ending October 15th 2011 while the actual survey was conducted during the period October 9th to November 20th 2011. Data collection was completed by the staff together with trained contracted enumerators.

The overall response rate was 78.2 percent, considering that some of the sampled households turned out to be out of scope.

After the data were processed, a data file was created with all the households that completed the LFS. The labour force indicators were generated from this file.

The estimates published in this report are rounded to the nearest whole number. The sum of the individual rounded items may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding off. As practiced in previous LFS, estimates of 25 or lower (but not zero) have been suppressed as indicated by "…" or regrouped as they are considered to be unreliable to be useful.



3. MAIN LABOUR FORCE FINDINGS

The main findings of the LFS indicate that the population of the Cayman Islands was 55,517 in 2011. There were 31,325 Caymanians compared to 24,192 non-Caymanians. The labour force was comprised of 37,620 persons, with 35,267 of them employed and 2,353 unemployed.



The labour force participation rate was 82.8 percent while the unemployment rate was 6.3 percent. The unemployment rate varied by sex and status. Figure 1 illustrates the composition of the population and the labour force.

3.1 **Population estimates**

A comparison of the 2010 and 2011 population estimates indicate an increase of 481 persons or 0.9 percent. The majority of Cayman's population lives in Grand Cayman, particularly in George Town (51.4%). West Bay has 20.3 percent of the population while Bodden Town has 19.0 percent. The Sister Islands' (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman) combined population accounted for 4.1 percent.

Sex and Age

The sex distribution in this Report was assumed to be the same as that in the 2010 Census where females comprise 50.5 percent of the population while males make up 49.5 percent (Table 5).

Children younger than 15 years old accounted for 18.1 percent of the population while the elderly (65 years or older) represented 4.9 percent. These two groups together are referred to as the 'dependent population'.

Those 15 to 64 years old (also known as working age population) accounted for 76.9 percent of the population. Persons in this age group are usually working or looking for work and are said to be in their 'productive years'. It is this group that children and elderly depend on for their livelihood. Therefore, the distribution of the population by age indicates a dependency ratio of one to three, i.e., for every dependent person there are three persons in the working age population.

Status

The proportion of Caymanians increased slightly from 56.3 percent to 56.4 percent, and in absolute terms the number increased by 346 persons from 2010 to 2011. Their sex and age distribution is different compared to that of the Non-Caymanian population. Among Caymanians, 75.2 percent were in the working-age population compared to 90.4 percent among Non-Caymanians (Appendix Table 1.3). This is expected since Cayman has a high proportion of foreign-born nationals that supply labour in various sectors of the economy.

3.2 Labour Force

The labour force, otherwise referred to as the 'current economically active population', is comprised of persons in the working-age population who worked, as well as those who at the time of the survey, did not have a job, but were available and willing to work. There were 37,620 persons who were either working or looking



and available for work in 2011. This figure represents a 0.8 percent increase compared to 2010. The increase in the labour force was due an increase of 1.1 percent in the number of Caymanians and 0.6 percent of non-Caymanians entering the labour market.

Sex and Age

The labour force shows no change in the overall males to female composition. The distribution in 2011 was similar to 2010. The 35 to 44 years old accounted for 33.2 percent of the labour force in 2011, followed by the 25-34 years old which comprised 25.2 percent. In comparison with the distribution in 2010, the 34-44, 45-54 and the 15-24 years old posted increases.

Status

The distribution of the labour force by status in 2011 indicated that 47.1 percent were Caymanian and 52.9 percent were Non-Caymanian (Table 6). Further analysis by sex shows that there were more Non-Caymanian males (54.8%) than Caymanian males (45.2%) in the labour force (Appendix Table 2.5). A similar trend is also shown among females in the labour force.



Labour Force Participation Rate

The overall labour force participation rate (LFPR)¹ was 82.8 percent (Table 7). Non-Caymanians overall had a higher labour force participation rate (91.0%) than their Caymanian counterparts (75.1%), (Tables 7). This is expected since Non-Caymanians who do not have a work permit or government contract to participate in the labour force are required to leave the country.

As the educational level increased, participation in the labour force also increased all the way to college/university level, except among women. The rate ranged from 30.2 percent among those with no qualification to 90.8 percent among those with post secondary education. Labour force participation among those with a college/university education was 90.0 percent. The participation rate of males is higher compared to females across all educational attainment categories.

3.3 Employed

The employed consists of those persons in the labour force who worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week. Persons who, for some reason or the other, did not work during the reference week, but had a job are also categorized as members of the employed labour force. Such persons were temporarily absent from work.

The number of employed labour force in 2011 was 35,267, 0.8 percent higher compared to 2010. This rate of increase matched that of the labour force but was lower than the corresponding rates for the population (0.9%).

Sex and Age

There were 143 more males and 142 more females employed in 2011 than in 2010 (Table 8). The sex distribution of the employed population was 51.0 to 49.0 percent



in favour of the males (Table 9). Those in the 35 to 44 age group accounted for the biggest share of the employed (34.0%). The youth and the elderly represented 6.9 and 2.0 percent of the employed, respectively.

Status

In 2011, employed Caymanians numbered 15,969 and accounted for 45.3 percent of the employed. A comparison with the 2010 figures indicates that the number of employed Caymanians increased by 176 or 1.1 percent (Table 8). Subsequently their proportion of the employed increased slightly from 45.2 percent in 2010 to 45.3 percent in 2011.

Employed Caymanians males and females experienced an increase in absolute terms by 85 and 91 persons between 2010 and 2011.

In 2011, employed Non-Caymanians showed an increase in employment by 108 persons or 0.6 percent. They also continued to account for majority of employed



persons. Both employed Non-Caymanians males and females recorded growth in 2011 over 2010 by 57 and 50 persons respectively.

Hours of Work

The employed worked an average of 42.7 hours per week. Males on average, worked almost three hours longer per week than females while Non-Caymanians worked generally two hours longer than the Caymanian (Appendix Tables 3.17 and 3.18).

Category of Worker

The employed worked mainly as paid employees (91.8%), while 7.6 percent had their own business as self-employed with or without employees. Males (10.6%) were more likely than females (4.4%) and Caymanian (12.9%) more likely than non-Caymanians (3.1%) to have their own business (Tables 10 and 11).

Occupation


The top five occupations in 2011 were service and sales workers (19.4%), elementary occupation (16.3%), professionals (15.1%), technicians and associate professionals (13.9%) and craft and related trade workers (10.3%) (Appendix Tables 3.13 and 3.14). Further analysis by sex and status indicates varying patterns. Males were mostly employed as craft and related trades worker (19.4), technical and service and sales workers (16.0%), technicians and associate professionals (13.5%). The patterns for females showed they were mostly employed as elementary occupation (23.3%), service and sales workers (22.9%), and as technical and associate professionals (17.0%).

Caymanians were mainly employed as technicians and associate professionals (17.1%), professionals (16.7%) and managers (15.2%), while non-Caymanians were mostly employed in elementary occupations (24.3%), as service and sales workers (23.0%) and professional (13.8%).

Industry

About 50 percent of the employed populations were engaged in one of the following industries: wholesale and retail trade (12.0%), activities of households as employers, (10.7%), construction (10.6%), financial services (9.7%) and public administration activities (7.8%) (Appendix Table 3.15). Males were mainly engaged in the construction sector (19.3%), wholesale and retail trade (13.0%) and public administration activities (8.5%), while females were mainly engaged in activities of households as employers (18.6%), financial services (13.3%), and wholesale and retail trade (11.0%).





Caymanians were mainly in financial services (15.9%), public administration activities (14.0%), and wholesale and retail trade (11.8%) (Appendix Table 3.16). Non-Caymanians were mainly employed in the following industries; activities of households as employers (17.5%), wholesale and retail trade (12.2%) and construction (11.6%).



Income

The majority of employed persons earned \$2,400 or more per month (47.4%) (Tables 12 and 13). The proportion was higher among employed males (51.1%) compared to employed females (43.7%) earning this same income range. In the highest income range, i.e. \$7,200.00 or more per month, there were more males than females (9.4% compared to 5.1%). Caymanians (59.7%) were more likely than non-Caymanians (37.3%) to have earned \$2,400.00 or more per month.

3.5 Unemployed

Based on the ILO guidelines, a person of working age is deemed to be unemployed if he/she is without a job, but is currently available for work and has been seeking employment within a specified recent time period. In 2011 there were 2,353 unemployed persons, which is 1.0 percent higher compared to 2010. The unemployment rate² is an indicator of the extent to which the supply of labour in the labour market exceeds the demand. In 2011, the unemployment rate was 6.3 percent compared to 6.2 percent in 2010.

Youth unemployment rate remained the highest compared to other subgroups of the unemployed. Males and those in the 15 to 24 age group continue to experience high levels of unemployment rate in 2011. The unemployment rate among males remained at 6.7 percent in 2011. The elderly experienced the highest increase in unemployment rate from 5.9 percent in 2010 to 8.8 percent in 2011.

The unemployment rate among Caymanian was estimated at 9.8 percent in 2011, the same as in 2010. Non-Caymanian unemployment rate also remained at 3.1 percent in 2011.

Sex and status

The unemployed were mainly males (54.8%), younger than 35 years (48.1%) or Caymanians (73.6%) (Appendix Tables 4.1 and 4.2). It is expected that the unemployed will be mainly Caymanians especially since non-Caymanians are required to leave the country when their work permit or government contract is not renewed, and they do not have permanent resident status.

Education and other information

The majority of the unemployed had high school or lower level education (72.0%) and had worked before (75.1%) (Appendix Tables 4.4 - 4.6). More than 50 percent of the unemployed were without work 12 months or more, while almost one in every six never had a job. On the whole, they have been without work for longer than six months and have relied mainly on financial support from spouse/partners, parents, or other relatives and friends (Appendix Tables 4.14 and 4.15).




3.6 Persons not in the labour force

Those who were of working age (15 plus years old) and not working, not available to work and did not seek work were classified as being not in the labour force. This total numbered 7,830, 1.1 percent higher compared to 2010 (Table 15). The increase came from Caymanian 1.2 percent and Non-Caymanian 0.7 percent.

Persons not in the labour force are mainly females (61.0%), youth (32.1%), or elderly (25.1%) or Caymanians (74.9%) (Appendix Tables 5.1 to 5.3). The majority of these persons had high school or lower level education (68.2%). (Appendix Tables 5.4 and 5.5)

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The reasons given by most of the persons for being out of the labour force were studies (33.9%), retirement (33.3%) or home/family duties (15.7%) (Figure 3). A comparison by sex indicates that males not in the labour force were slightly more likely than their female counterpart to be in school (50.8% vs. 49.2%) (Appendix Table 5.6). Conversely, females not in the labour force were more likely than males to be engaged in home duties (88.2% vs. 11.8%). Overall, females (61.0%) compared to males (39.0%) were more likely to be classified as not in the labour force. The main means of financial support for persons not in the labour were parents (32.4%), spouse/partner (20.8%) and pension (12.5%). (Appendix Table 5.22).



4. OTHER FINDINGS

4.1 Training

Of the entire population age 15 and above, 28,366 or 62.4% indicated having trained for an occupation. Majority of those trained (91.3%) are in the labour force while 8.7 percent are not economically active (Table 16). There are more males than females, non-Caymanian than Caymanian who received training (Table 17).

Among the employed 69.7 percent said that they have received training (Appendix Table 3.6). Employed males (73.0%) were more likely than the employed females (66.2%) to have received training, and employed Caymanians (71.4%) were more likely that the Non-Caymanians (68.3%) to have received training.

The employed males received training mainly as craft and related workers (29.4%) and as technician and professionals (22.3%) while the employed females received



training mainly as service and sales workers (24.9%) and as professionals (24.7%) (Appendix Table 3.7).

Among the unemployed, 1,318 (or 56.0% of all unemployed) received training (Appendix Table 4.16). The unemployed males were more likely to have received training as craft and related workers and on the job, while the unemployed females received training mainly as technical and associate professionals and at foreign institutions.

4.2 Expenses and Remittances

Questions on expenses abroad and remittances were included in the LFS questionnaire to get an indication of the effects of such activities on the economy. The information collected is used by the ESO as an input in the estimation of the annual Balance of Payments.

When asked about the number of trips taken abroad in the past 12 months, 54.5 percent stated that they have had at least one trip (Appendix Table 6.1). They spent an average of \$1,920.52 on food, hotel and entertainment, gifts and personal effects per trip for the year (Appendix Table 6.2).

Among those who stated that they sent money abroad, 46.7 percent sent less than \$2,000.00 for the year, while 28.3 percent sent \$2,000 to \$4,000 (Appendix Table 6.3). The main mode of transferring money abroad was by Western Union/ Money Gram/Money Express (70.8%), followed by wire transfers/draft/money order (23.3%) (Appendix Table 6.4).

4.3 Housing Characteristics

The estimated number of households in the Cayman Islands fell from 22,760 in 2010 to 22,143 in 2011 (Table 18). Majority of the households are located in George Town.

A majority of households (52.3%) owned their homes, while 41.5 percent rent their homes (Appendix Table 7.5).

Majority of the households have internet connectivity (65.6%), cable/satellite television (73.0%), and air-condition (88.0%) (Appendix Table 7.7). Only 44.3 percent of households reported having house insurance. About 3 of every 5 households (59.7%) have no land-line telephone, but almost all (98%) have at least one cell phone (Appendix Table 7.8). At least one of every four households (71.5%) had a computer and only 19.9 percent had no vehicle.

In 2011, the mean monthly rent reported for accommodation furnished or unfurnished was CI\$ 882.03 and the mean rental value for owner occupied dwelling was CI\$ 2,004.96 (Appendix Table 7.9).
