HIGHLIGHTS ON LABOUR FORCE, 2012

- The Caymanian Islands labour force expanded by 3.2 percent in 2012, reflecting growth in both the Caymanian and Non-Caymanian population.
- Caymanians in the labour force increased at a faster pace in 2012 (4.1%) compared to Non-Caymanians (2.4%).
- In 2012, the labour force participation rate improved to 86.7 percent as compared to 82.8 percent in 2011. This was the case for all age groups except the 25-34 years who experienced a decline in labour force participation.
- The number of persons employed grew by 3.2 percent, as Caymanian employment expanded by 3.3 percent and Non-Caymanian by 3.2 percent. Among the employed, only 1.8 percent considered themselves underemployed.
- The unemployment rate was 6.2 percent in 2012 compared to 6.3 percent in 2011. The unemployment rate among Caymanians was 10.5 percent while for Non-Caymanians the rate was 2.4 percent. By age group, the highest unemployment rate was among the 15 24 years old.



1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings on the 2012 Labour Force Survey (LFS). Since 2005, the LFS has been conducted on a yearly basis in October. Previous to that, the LFS was conducted twice a year in April and October. Financial constraints have led to a reduction in the frequency of the Survey.

The Labour Force Survey has been used to provide information on the characteristics of persons in the labour force. The concepts used in the survey are in accordance with the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines and therefore, the indicators produced from the Survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The remaining sections of this report present the methodology (Section 2), the main findings with emphasis on the profile of the labour force, and those that are out of the labour force (Section 3) and other findings on training, expenses & remittances and housing characteristics (Section 4). Where possible, the data are disaggregated by sex, age and status and comparisons are made with results of the 2011 Labour Force Survey.

2. METHODOLOGY

Planning and execution of the 2012 Labour Force survey (LFS) was done by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department of the Ministry of Finance, District Administration, Works, Land and Agriculture of the Cayman Islands Government.

The ESO's Household Register, which is comprised of a listing of all households and dwelling units countrywide, provided the sampling frame for the survey. This register had a total of approximately 24,000 entries comprising of all households counted in the 2010 Census and the results of updates conducted in August 2011 and September 2012 on dwellings that were previously counted as under construction and vacant. A sample of 1,725 household addresses was randomly selected for the survey.

Sample size

The original sample size for the 2012 Cayman Islands Labour Force Survey is 1,725 households representing about 7 percent of all households.

Fieldwork

A total of 17 persons were trained to conduct interviews over a four-week period starting October 8, 2012 and ending on November 12, 2012. The trained interviewers comprised staff members of the ESO and external contract workers. Two interviewers from Cayman Brac were trained to conduct interviews on the Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman).



Sample design

A stratified random sample design was used with households selected from all of 277 enumeration areas (EAs) spread across all districts. Within each district, the households were selected with equal probability and the final sample represented approximately 7 percent of the households within the respective district; the number of households in the district was drawn from the recently updated Household Register. The probability of selection for the sample households in each district can be expressed as follows:

$$P_h = m_h / M_h$$

Where:

P_h =probability of selection for the sample households in the h-th stratum (district)

 M_h = total number of households in the sample frame for the h-th stratum

m_h = the number of sample households selected in the h-th stratum

Weights

The basic sampling weight, or expansion factor, is calculated as the inverse of this probability of selection. The weight can be expressed as follows:

$$W_h = (M_h/m_h)$$

Where:

 W_h = basic weight for the sample households in the h-th stratum

The weights are also adjusted to take account of non-responding households. The final weight (W'h) for the sample households in h-th stratum can be expressed as follows:

$$W'_{h} = W_{h} * (m''_{h}/m'_{h})$$

Where:

m'h = total number of valid sample households selected in the h-th stratum (excluding any vacant, derelict/under construction, short term rentals and vacation home housing units in the sample)

m"h = total number of sample households with fully and partially completed questionnaires in the h-th stratum

The weights are then used as the expansion factor for the number of individuals counted during the household interviews. As in 2011, the Non-Caymanian labour force was adjusted based on work permit data.

Data Processing

The survey returns were processed internally by ESO staff members: scanning was done using Cardiff Teleform and editing with CS Pro (Census and Survey Processing System). A data file was then created with information from all households who completed the interview (fully and partially). Indicators were generated from this file using SPSS (Statistical Package for Social Sciences).

Margin of error and rounding off

The estimates were computed with a 2.5 percent margin of error. The estimates published in this report are rounded to the nearest whole number. The sum of the individual rounded items may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding off. As practiced in previous LFS, estimates of 25 or lower (but not zero) have been suppressed as indicated by "..." or regrouped as they are considered to be unreliable to be useful.

3. MAIN LABOUR FORCE FINDINGS

In 2012, the population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 56,732. There were 32,201 Caymanians compared to 24,531 non-Caymanians. The labour force was comprised of 38,811 persons, with 36,401 of them employed and 2,410 unemployed.

The labour force participation rate was 83.7 percent while the unemployment rate was 6.2 percent. The unemployment rate and participation rate varied by sex and status (see Tables 2 and 3). Figure 1 illustrates the composition of the population and the labour force.



3.1 POPULATION ESTIMATES

In 2012, the population estimates stood at 56,732, an increase of 1,215 persons or 2.2 percent compared to 2011. The majority of Cayman's population lives in Grand Cayman, particularly in George Town which accounted for 53.2 percent. Bodden Town had 19.6 percent of the population while West Bay had 18.1 percent. The Sister Islands' (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman) combined population accounted for 3.8 percent.

These estimates also showed that Bodden Town is now the second largest district in the Cayman Islands, moving from 19.0 percent of the total population in 2011 to 19.6 percent in 2012. West Bay declined from 20.3 percent of the total population in 2011 to 18.1 percent in 2012.

The average household size was 2.3 persons as compared to 2.4 persons per household revealed in the Population Census conducted two years ago. East End has the highest household size, followed by Bodden Town.

Sex and Age

The estimated population according to sex distribution in the 2012 comprised 51.1 percent females and 48.9 percent males (see Table 5).

Children younger than 15 years old accounted for 18.3 percent of the population while the elderly (65 years or older) represented 5.9 percent. These two groups together are referred to as the 'dependent population' which accounts for 24.2 percent of the total population.



The working age population which is the age group from 15 to 64 years old accounted for 75.8 percent of the population. Persons in this age group are usually working or looking for work and are said to be in their 'productive years'. It is this group that children and elderly depend on for their livelihood. Therefore, the distribution of the population by age indicates a dependency ratio of one to three, i.e., for every dependent person there are three persons in the working age population.

Status

The proportion of Caymanians increased from 56.4 percent to 56.8 percent, and in absolute terms the number increased by 876 persons from 2011 to 2012. Among Caymanians, 76.2 percent were in the working age population compared to 89.0 percent among Non-Caymanians (Appendix Table 1.7). This is expected since the local economy has a high proportion of expatriates that supply labour in various sectors of the economy.



3.2 LABOUR FORCE

The labour force, otherwise referred to as the 'current economically active population', is comprised of persons in the working-age population who worked, as well as those who at the time of the survey, did not have a job, but were available and willing to work. There were 38,811 persons who were either working or looking and available for work in 2012. This figure represents a 3.2 percent increase compared to the previous year. The overall increase in the labour force was due to an increase of 4.1 percent in the number of Caymanians and 2.4 percent of non-Caymanians entering the labour market (see Table 6).

Sex and age

In 2012, females accounted for 49.9 percent as compared 48.8 percent in the previous year and males accounted for 50.1 percent lower than the 51.2 percent recorded in 2011. The age group 35 to 44 years accounted for 31.8 percent of the labour force in 2012, followed by the 25-34



years old which comprised 25.1 percent. In comparison with the distribution in 2011, all age groups increased except the 34-44 and the 45-54 age groups.

Status

The labour force distribution by status in 2012 indicated that 47.5 percent were Caymanians and 52.5 percent were Non-Caymanians (see Table 6). Additionally, analysis by sex shows that there were more Non-Caymanian males (55.3%) than Caymanian males (44.7%) in the labour force (Appendix Table 2.5).

Labour Force Participation Rate

The overall labour force participation rate (LFPR)¹ was 83.7 percent (see Table 7). Non-Caymanians overall had a higher labour force participation rate (93.4%) than their Caymanian counterparts (75.0%). This is expected since the majority of Non-Caymanians are imported labour and with the absence of work are required to leave the country.

Labour force participation increases directly with educational attainment, as lower levels of education had lower participation rates in general. The rate ranged from 28.7 percent among those with no qualification to 91.0 percent among those with post-secondary education. Labour force participation among those with a college/university education was 89.6 percent. The participation rate of female is lower than their male counterparts across all educational attainment categories.

3.3 EMPLOYED

The employed consists of those persons in the labour force who worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week. Persons who, for some reason or the other, did not work during the reference week, but had a job were also categorized as members of the employed labour force. Such persons were temporarily absent from work.

In 2012, the number of employed in the labour force was 36,401 and 3.2 percent higher compared to 2011. This growth occurred as more Caymanians and Non-Caymanians were employed as the economy strengthened.

Sex and Age

There were 1,057 more females and 78 more males employed in 2012 than a year ago (Table 8). Those in the 35 to 44 age group accounted for the biggest share of the employed (32.7%). The youth and the elderly represented 7.0 and 2.6 percent of the employed, respectively. (Table 9)

Status

Employed Caymanians in 2012 totalled 16,493 and accounted for 45.3 percent of the employed. A comparison with the 2011 figures indicates that the number of employed Caymanians increased by 524 or 3.3 percent (see Table 8). However, the share of employed Caymanians to total employment remained the same as in 2011.

Employed Caymanian females increased by 689 while males declined by 165 when compared to a year ago.

In 2012, employed Non-Caymanians who accounted for majority of the employed persons (54.7%) showed an increase of 611 persons or 3.2 percent. Both males and females recorded growth of 243 and 368 persons respectively.



Hours of Work

The employed worked an average of 42.4 hours per week. Males on average, worked almost three hours longer per week than females while Non-Caymanians worked generally two hours longer than the Caymanians (Appendix Tables 3.21 and 3.22).

Category of Worker

The employed worked mainly as paid employees (91.6%), while 8.1 percent had their own business as self-employed with or without employees. Among employed males, 11.6 percent were self-employed, while among females 4.6 percent were so employed. Caymanians (15.0%) were more likely than non-Caymanians (2.3%) to have their own business (Tables 10 and 11).

Occupation




Figure 2: Employment by Occupation (%), 2012

The top five occupations in 2012 were service and sales workers (21.1%), professionals (16.4%), elementary occupation (13.7%), technicians and associate professionals (13.4%) and craft and related trade workers (11.5%) (Figure 2). Analysis by sex and status indicates varying patterns. Males were mostly employed as craft and related trades worker (22.0%), service and sales workers (15.9%), professionals (14.7%), and technicians and associate professionals (13.1%). The pattern for females showed they were mainly employed as service and sales workers (26.2%), elementary occupation (19.1%), and professionals (18.1%).

Caymanians were mainly employed as technicians and associate professionals (17.6%), professionals (16.5%), service and sales workers (15.8%) and managers (13.8%). Non-Caymanians were mainly employed as service and sales workers (25.5%), elementary occupations (19.0%).

Industry




Figure 3: Employment by Industry (%), 2012

The top six industries accounted for 56.3 percent of the employed labour force, these were: wholesale and retail trade (12.8%), construction (10.5%), activities of households as employers, (9.2%), financial services (8.9%), general public administration activities (7.8%) and professional, scientific, and technical activities (7.1%) (Figure 3). Males were mainly engaged in the construction sector (19.6%), wholesale and retail trade (14.1%) and public administration activities (8.1%), while females were mainly engaged in activities of households as employers (17.2%), financial services (11.8%), and wholesale and retail trade (11.6%).

Caymanians were mainly in financial services (14.4%), wholesale and retail trade (12.4%), and public administration activities (11.8%) (Appendix Table 3.20). Non-Caymanians were mainly employed in the following industries: activities of households as employers (14.8%), wholesale and retail trade (13.2%) and construction (11.9%).

Approximately one in every two residents employed in the financial and insurance (56.5%) and real estate (54.7%) were aged below 40. The median age in those industries were 38 and 39 respectively. The restaurants and mobile food service industry had the highest proportion of employees below aged 30. Water supply, sewage and waste management, and mining and quarrying had respectively 71.7 percent and 67.6 percent of their employee 50 years and over.

Income

Approximately 46.4 percent of employed persons earned \$2,400 or more per month (Tables 13 and 14). The proportion was higher among employed males (51.7%) compared to employed females (40.9%) earning this same income range. In the highest income range, i.e. \$7,200.00 or more per month, there were more males (1,562) than females (735). Caymanians (58.2%) were more likely than Non-Caymanians (36.6%) to have earned \$2,400.00 or more per month.

3.4 UNDEREMPLOYMENT

'Underemployment' is defined as 'Involuntary part-time' work, where workers who could (and would like to) be working for a full work-week can find only part-time work. The underemployed accounted for 1.8 percent of the employed in 2012. Underemployment was 2.4 percent for males and 1.3 percent for females. Caymanians had a higher rate of underemployment (2.2%) than Non-Caymanians (1.5%). The majority of underemployed was among the age groups 35-44 and 45-54, who together accounted for 58.4 percent of total underemployment. More than half of the underemployed had high school level education.

3.5 UNEMPLOYED

Based on the ILO guidelines, a person of working age is deemed to be unemployed if he/she is without a job, but is currently available for work and has been seeking employment within the reference period. In 2012 there were 2,410 unemployed persons, 2.4 percent higher compared to 2011. The unemployment rate² is an indicator of the extent to which the supply of labour in the labour market exceeds the demand. In 2012, the unemployment rate improved slightly to 6.2 percent from 6.3 percent in 2011. (Table 16)

Sex, age and status

Youth unemployment rate (21.2%) remained the highest compared to other subgroups of the unemployed. Males (7.1%) continued to experience higher unemployment rate compared to females (5.3%) in 2012.

The unemployment rate among Caymanians was estimated at 10.5 percent in 2012 while Non-Caymanians unemployment rate was at 2.4 percent.

The unemployed were mainly males (57.3%), younger than 35 years (48.3%) or Caymanians (79.9%).

Education and other information

The majority of the unemployed had high school or lower level education (67.0%) and had worked before (87.2%) (Appendix Tables 5.4 to 5.6). Of the total 1,925 unemployed Caymanians, 1,448 (or 75.2%) had an education attainment of high school or less. (Appendix Table 5.5).

Approximately 51.6 percent of the unemployed who had a job previously and were unemployed were without work for less than 12 months, while another 46.8 percent were unemployed for a year or more which is considered long-term unemployment (Appendix Table 5.10). Generally, 71.6 percent of unemployed persons relied mainly on financial support from spouse/partners, parents, or other relatives and friends (Appendix Tables 5.16 and 5.17).

3.6 PERSONS NOT IN THE LABOUR FORCE

Those who were of working age (15 plus years old) and not working, not available to work and did not seek work were classified as being not in the labour force. Some 7,564 persons were not in the labour force, the majority of whom were younger than 25 and over 65 years (see Table 17 and Appendix Table 6.1). It is reasonable to surmise that most of the under 25 were at school and the over 65 were in the retirement age category. Further, 81 percent of the persons not in the labour force were Caymanians. (Appendix Table 6.2)


Persons not in the labour force were mainly females (60.2%), youth 15 - 24 years (31.0%), and the elderly (30.5%) (Appendix Tables 6.1 to 6.3). The majority of these persons had high school or lower level education (67.3%). (Appendix Tables 6.4 and 6.5)

Most males not in the labour force were in school/training (46.0%) or in retirement (33.4%). Females not in the labour force were mostly in retirement (36.1%), in school/training (25.4%) or engaged in home duties (24.1%). (Appendix Table 6.6). The main means of financial support for persons not in the labour were parents (34.2%), spouse/partner (19.8%) and savings (14.2%). (Appendix Table 6.18 and 6.19).

4. OTHER FINDINGS

4.1 TRAINING

Of the working age population, 30,107 or 64.9% indicated having trained for an occupation (Table 18). Majority of those trained (91.5%) were in the labour force while 8.5 percent were not economically active (Table 18). There were more males than females who received training.

Among the employed 72.0 percent said that they have received training. Employed males (75.6%) were more likely than the employed females (68.4%) to have received training.

The employed males received training mainly as craft and related workers (30.2%) and professionals (22.0%) while the employed females received training mainly as professionals (29.4%) and service and sales workers (28.2%) (Appendix Table 3.9).

Among the unemployed, 1,330 or 55.2% received training. The unemployed males were more likely to have received training as craft and related workers and on the job, while the unemployed females received training mainly as clerical support workers and mainly on the job. (Appendix Table 5.19 and 5.21).



4.2 EXPENSES AND REMITTANCES

Questions on expenses abroad and remittances were included in the LFS questionnaire to get an indication of the effects of such activities on the economy. The information collected is used by the ESO as an input in the estimation of the annual Balance of Payments.

In 2012, 60.4 percent of individuals stated that they have had at least one trip abroad within the last twelve months (Appendix Table 7.1).

There were 19,485 persons who stated they sent money abroad (Appendix 7.2). Of these, 51.4 percent sent less than CI\$2,000.00 for the year, while 25.7 percent sent CI\$2,000 to CI\$4,999. The main mode of transferring money abroad was by money transfer agents (76.8%), followed by bank wire transfers/draft/money order (20.2%) (Appendix Table 7.3).

4.3 HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

The majority of households (49.7%) owned their homes, while 45.6 percent rented their homes (Table 19).

Majority of the households had internet connectivity (65.5%), cable/satellite television (73.2%), and air-condition (89.9%). Only 46.5 percent of households reported having house insurance. About 3 of every 5 households (59.1%) had no land-line telephone, but over 99 percent had at least one cell phone. At least one of every four households (74.3%) had a computer.

In 2012, the mean monthly rent reported for accommodation furnished or unfurnished was CI\$861.34 and the mean rental value for owner occupied dwelling was CI\$2,077.06 (Appendix Table 8.8).
