1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings of the 2014 Labour Force Survey (LFS). Since 2005, the LFS has been conducted on a yearly basis in October. Prior to that, the LFS was conducted twice a year in April and October. Financial constraints have led to a reduction in the frequency of the Survey.

The Labour Force Survey has been used to provide information on the characteristics of persons in the labour force. The concepts used in the survey are in accordance with the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines and therefore, the indicators produced from the Survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The remaining sections of this report present the methodology (Section 2), the main findings with emphasis on the profile of the labour force, and those that are out of the labour force (Section 3) and other findings on expenses and housing characteristics (Section 4). Where possible, the data are disaggregated by sex, age and status and comparisons are made with results of the 2013 Labour Force Survey.

2. METHODOLOGY

Planning and execution of the 2014 Labour Force survey (LFS) was done by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department of the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development of the Cayman Islands Government.

The ESO's Household Register, which is comprised of a listing of all households and dwelling units countrywide, provided the sampling frame for the survey. A full update of the register was conducted between May and August 2014 on all dwellings located in the Cayman Islands and 21,189 were deemed to be households. A sample of 1,416 household addresses was randomly selected for the survey.

Sample design

The Cayman Islands was divided into six strata along the same geographical lines as the Districts of the Cayman Islands. Cayman Brac and Little Cayman were combined to form the stratum Sister Islands.

Probability proportionate to population size, as revealed in the 2010 Population and Housing Census was used when allocating the number of selected households across strata. Households were randomly selected from all of the 277 enumeration areas (EAs); within each district, the households were selected with equal probability, and the final sample represented approximately 6.0 percent of households within respective districts. The selected households



from each district were drawn from the recently updated Household Register. The probability of selection for the sampled households in each district can be expressed as follows:

$$P_h = m_h / M_h$$

Where:

P_h =probability of selection for the sample households in the h-th stratum (district)

 M_h = total number of households in the sample frame for the h-th stratum

m_h = the number of sample households selected in the h-th stratum

Fieldwork

Staff from the ESO conducted six evenings of training for the fieldwork phase of the LFS. A total of 26 persons received training for six days on how to conduct the LFS using tablets; however, only 23 persons were selected to conduct interviews on Grand Cayman. On the Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman), three persons were trained for one day on how to conduct the LFS using paper questionnaires. Only two persons were selected to conduct interviews. The trained interviewers comprised staff members of the ESO and temporary survey staff.

The reference week for the survey was the week ending October 4, 2014. The data collection took place over a six-week period starting October 5, 2014 and ending on November 12, 2014.

Weights

A population estimate for 2014 was derived using administrative data including 2014 natural increase (births minus deaths) and immigration data (work permits and change of status). The basic sampling weight, or expansion factor, was then calculated based on the estimated population and the sample population adjusted for non-responses at the household level.

Data processing

The survey returns were processed internally by ESO staff members: data capture and coding were conducted using tablets and the ESO Mobile LFS Project (LFSPrj) software developed by Howard Hamilton (ICT Consultant). Edit checks were conducted using CSPro (Census and Survey Processing System) and SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences). Data were verified with cross-referencing information stored on the tablets or with a phone call to the respondent. A data file was then created with information from all households who completed the LFS interview (fully and partially). Indicators were generated from this file using SPSS.

Standard Errors for Main Estimates

Given the nature of the sample design used in the LFS, the estimates were computed with a 2.5 percent margin of error. The estimates published in this report's tables are rounded to the nearest whole number or person. The sum of the individual rounded numbers may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding.

The estimates presented in this report are all liable to sampling error. Their absolute sampling error increases with their magnitude, while the relative error decreases the greater the size of the estimate. Generally, the smaller the *Relative Standard Error* (or *Coefficient of Variation*) the more reliable is the estimate. Because of this, comparisons of the larger estimates may be used with confidence but small estimates must be treated with caution. Consequently, estimates of 25 or lower (but not zero) have been suppressed as indicated by "..." or regrouped as they are considered to be unreliable or not useful.

Standard Errors, Confidence Intervals and Coefficients of Variation (C.V.) of the estimates for key variables for the October 2014 LFS are shown in the Tables 2 and 3.

3. MAIN LABOUR FORCE FINDINGS

In 2014, the population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 58,238. There were 33,447 Caymanians and 24,791 Non-Caymanians. The labour force was comprised of 39,582 persons, with 37,723 of them employed and 1,859 unemployed. The labour force participation rate was 82.6 percent while the unemployment rate was 4.7 percent. The unemployment rate and labour force participation rate varied by sex and status (Tables 4 and 5). Figure 1 illustrates the composition of the population and the labour force.



3.1 POPULATION ESTIMATES

In 2014, the estimated population stood at 58,238, an increase of 2,491 persons or 4.5 percent compared to 2013. The majority of Cayman's population lives in Grand Cayman, particularly in George Town which accounted for 51.7 percent. Bodden Town had 20.5 percent of the population while West Bay had 19.4 percent. The Sister Islands' (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman) combined population accounted for 3.2 percent (Table 6).

The average household size was 2.7 persons per household and varied by district. North Side had the highest with 3.3 persons and the Sister Islands the lowest with 2.1 persons.

Sex and Age

The estimated population according to sex distribution in 2014 comprised 51.4 percent females and 48.6 percent males (Table 7).

Children younger than 15 years old accounted for 17.8 percent of the population while the elderly (65 years or older) represented 6.5 percent (Table 7). These two groups together are referred to as the 'dependent population' which accounted for 24.3 percent. In comparison to 2013 it showed a slight increase of 0.5 percentage point in the proportion of dependents.

The working age population which is the age group comprising persons who are 15 years and older accounted for 75.7 percent of the population. Persons in this age group are usually working or looking for work and are said to be in their 'productive years'. It is this group that



children and elderly depend on. Therefore, the distribution of the population by age indicates a dependency ratio of one to three, i.e., for every dependent person there are three persons in the working age population.

Status

The proportion of Caymanians decreased from 58.8 percent in 2013 to 57.4 percent in 2014 although there was an increase of 649 Caymanians (Table 7). Among Caymanians, 76.9 percent were in the working age population compared to 89.5 percent among Non-Caymanians (Appendix Table 1.5). This is expected since the local economy has a high proportion of expatriates that supply labour in various sectors of the economy.



3.2 LABOUR FORCE

The labour force, otherwise referred to as the 'current economically active population', is comprised of persons in the working-age population who worked, as well as those who at the time of the survey, did not have a job, but were available and looking work. In 2014, there were 39,582 persons who were in the labour force. This figure represents a 2.8 percent increase when compared to the previous year. The overall increase in the labour force was due to an increase of 1.8 percent in Caymanian labour force participation and 3.7 percent in the number of Non-Caymanians (Table 8).

Sex and age

In 2014, females accounted for 51.3 percent and males accounted for 48.7 percent of the labour force. When compared to 2013, the number of males reduced by 0.3 percent while the number of females rose by 5.9 percent (Table 8).



The age group 35 to 44 years accounted for 27.1 percent of the labour force in 2014, followed by the 45-54 years (25.4%).

Status

The labour force distribution by status in 2014 indicated that 49.7 percent were Caymanians and 50.3 percent were Non-Caymanians (Table 8).

Labour Force Participation Rate

The overall labour force participation rate (LFPR)¹ was 82.6 percent (Table 9). Non-Caymanians overall had a higher labour force participation rate (89.7%) than their Caymanian counterparts (76.6%).

Labour force participation increased directly with educational attainment, as lower levels of education had lower participation rates in general. The rate ranged from 48.0 percent among those with primary and below qualifications to 89.0 percent among those with a college/university education. Labour force participation among those with post-secondary education was 88.9 percent. The participation rate of females is lower than their male counterparts across all educational attainment categories except the post-secondary and middle categories.

3.3 EMPLOYED

The employed consists of those persons in the labour force who worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week, which was the week ending October 4, 2014. Persons who, for some reason or the other, did not work during the reference week, but had a job were also categorized as members of the employed labour force. Such persons were temporarily absent from work.

In 2014, the number of employed in the labour force was 37,723 and approximately 4.5 percent higher compared to 2013. The overall increase is mainly a result of a 5.4 percent rise in the number of employed Non-Caymanians and a 3.5 percent rise in the number of employed Caymanians (Table 10).

Sex and Age

There were 1,301 more females and 316 more males employed in 2014 than a year ago (Table 10). Those in the 35 to 44 age group accounted for the biggest share of the employed (27.9%). Persons aged 15 to 24 years and the elderly represented 5.6 and 3.5 percent of the employed, respectively.

Status

Employed Caymanians in 2014 totalled 18,127 and accounted for 48.1 percent of the employed. A comparison with the 2013 figures indicates that the number of employed Caymanians increased by 609 or 3.5 percent (Table 10). This proportion of employed Caymanians decreased by 48.5 percent compared to 2013.

In 2014, employed Non-Caymanians totalled 19,595 and accounted for 51.9 percent of the employed persons. A comparison with 2013 showed an increase of 1,007 persons or 5.4 percent (Table 10).

Hours of Work

The number of hours worked by the respondent was captured using two approaches. The first approach is the *Usual Hours* worked and the second, *Actual Hours* worked. Usual Hours worked is defined as the typical number of hours worked during a normal workweek by the respondent at his/her job(s). Actual hours worked is defined as the exact number of hours worked during the reference period of September 28 to October 4, 2014 by the respondent at his/her job(s). Usual and Actual Hours worked includes all hours spent on work activities, overtime hours but excludes vacation leave, sick leave, public holidays and other forms of paid or unpaid leave.

The employed usually worked an average of 43.2 hours per week. Males on average, worked 2.1 hours longer per week than females while Non-Caymanians worked 2.9 hours longer than Caymanians (Appendix Tables 3.18 and 3.19). However, the employed actually worked an average of 41.2 hours based on the reference week. Males on average, worked 2.2 hours longer per week than females while Non-Caymanians worked 1.6 hours longer than Caymanians (Appendix Tables 3.20 and 3.21).

Employment Status

The employed worked mainly as paid employees (88.6%), while 10.6 percent had their own business as self-employed with or without employees. Among employed males, 14.6 percent



were self-employed, while among females 6.7 percent were self-employed. Caymanians (15.7%) were more likely than non-Caymanians (5.8%) to have their own business (Tables 11 and 12).

Occupation




Figure 2: Employment by Occupation (%), 2014

The top six occupations in 2014 which comprised 84.6 percent of total employment were service and sales workers (19.8%); professionals (17.1%); technicians and associate professionals (14.3%); elementary occupations (12.6%); craft and related trades workers (10.4%); and managers (10.4%) (Figure 2). Analysis by sex and status indicates varying patterns. The largest share of employed males by occupation worked as craft and related trades workers (19.6%); professionals (16.1%); service and sales workers (15.1%); and technicians and associate professionals (13.4%). The pattern for females showed that employed as service and sales workers (24.3%); professionals (18.1%); elementary occupations (17.2%); and technicians and associate professionals (15.1%), (Appendix Table 3.12).

The largest industry share of Caymanians were employed as technicians and associate professionals (19.5%); clerical support workers (14.8%); managers (14.7%); and professionals (14.2%). Non-Caymanians were mainly employed as service and sales workers (25.5%); professionals (19.9%); and elementary occupations (17.5%), (Appendix Table 3.13).

Industry




Figure 3: Employment by Industry (%), 2014

The top seven industries accounted for 66.5 percent of the employed labour force, these were: wholesale and retail trade (12.0%); accommodation and food service activities (10.8%); financial services (10.0%); construction (9.0%); activities of households as employers (8.7%); professional, scientific, and technical activities (8.0%); and public administration and defence (8.0%) (Figure 3). Males were mainly engaged in construction (16.6%); wholesale and retail trade (12.3%); and accommodation and food services (11.4%), while females were mainly engaged in activities of households as employers (15.7%); financial services (11.8%); wholesale and retail trade (11.7%); and accommodation and food services (10.3%), (Appendix Tables 3.14).

Income

The largest industry share of Caymanians were in financial services (14.8%); wholesale and retail trade (12.9%); and public administration activities (12.4%) (Appendix Table 3.15). While, Non-Caymanians were in the following industries: activities of households as employers (15.2%); accommodation and food service activities (14.7%); wholesale and retail trade (11.1%); and construction (8.9%).

Approximately 56.9 percent of employed persons earned \$2,400 or more per month (Tables 13 and 14). The proportion was higher among employed males (63.1%) compared to employed females (60.6%) earning this same income range. Caymanians (61.8%) were more likely than Non-Caymanians (42.0%) to have earned \$2,400.00 or more per month. In the highest income range, i.e. \$8,400.00 or more per month, there were more males (7.2%) than females (2.4%) and more Non-Caymanians (5.6%) than Caymanians (3.7%).

Size of Business

Employed persons were asked, 'How many persons are employed at place of work?' This close ended question had five applicable responses, ranging from 1 - 5 to 50 or more. The results, which indicate the size of businesses where they work, revealed that most of the employed persons (11,286 or 29.9%) worked in businesses with 50 or more employees and 10,874 persons or 28.8 percent worked in businesses with 1 - 5 employees (Tables 15a and 15b).

Further analysis by industry shows that employed persons in the construction industry worked mainly in construction businesses with 1-5 employees (32.9%). Those who worked in



administrative and support services (29.8%); and wholesale and retail trade services (28.7) were also more likely to have worked in businesses with 1 - 5 employees.

In contrast, persons who worked in accommodation (61.3%); public administration industries (53.7%); human health and social work activities (53.1%); professional scientific and technical activities (48.0%); and financial and insurance activities (42.9%) were more likely to have worked in big companies with 50 or more persons.

3.4 UNDEREMPLOYMENT

'Underemployment' is defined as 'Involuntary part-time' work, where workers who could (and would like to) be working for a full work-week can find only part-time work. The underemployed accounted for 2.9 percent of the employed in 2014 (Table 16). Underemployment was 2.9 percent for males and 3.0 percent for females. Caymanians had a higher rate of underemployment (3.8%) than Non-Caymanians (2.2%). The majority (68.8%) of underemployed persons were in the 35-64 years age group. More than half of the underemployed had high school or higher level education (Appendix Table 4.1).

3.5 UNEMPLOYED

Based on the ILO guidelines, a person of working age is deemed to be unemployed if he/she is without a job, but is currently available for work and has been seeking employment within the reference period. In 2014 there were 1,859 unemployed persons, and the unemployment rate was 4.7 percent. The unemployed were mainly persons who 35 years and older (52.2%), females (50.8%), or Caymanians (84.0%). Overall, the number of unemployed persons between 2013 and 2014 decreased. The decrease in the number of unemployed persons was mainly due to 319 fewer unemployed Non-Caymanians and 240 fewer unemployed Caymanians during that period.

Sex, age and status

The unemployment rate for persons between 15 and 24 years (18.6%) remained the highest compared to other subgroups of the unemployed. Males and females experienced the same rate of unemployment of 4.7%. The unemployment rate among Caymanians was 7.9 percent, which is lower compared to the 9.4 percent in 2013. Among Non-Caymanians, the 2014 unemployment rate was 1.5 percent, a decrease compared to 3.1 percent in 2013.



Education and other information

Approximately one in every three (33.8%) unemployed persons had post-secondary or higher level education. Among unemployed Caymanians, 29.7 percent of them had post-secondary education or higher compared to 55.1 percent of unemployed Non-Caymanians, (Appendix Table 5.7).

The majority (87.7%) of the unemployed stated that they had worked before, and approximately 64.4 percent have been without work for more than six months, (Appendix Tables 5.14 and 5.16). Unemployed persons mainly worked as service and sales workers (27.5%); elementary workers (19.6%); and craft and related trades workers (15.9%), (Appendix Table 5.18).

When asked about their main means of job search, which was a multiple response question, the unemployed persons' most popular responses were to send résumés (65.3%); contact an employer (62.1%); and ask friends (46.5%). Unemployed persons also registered with the National Workforce Development Agency (NWDA) (45.9%) and to a lesser extent checked websites (32.7%). Caymanians (52.5%) were more likely than the Non-Caymanians (9.6%) to have registered with the NWDA (Appendix Table 5.12 and 5.13).

The top five preferred occupations that the unemployed were looking for were service and sales (23.6%), clerical support (18.8%), elementary occupations (16.3%), craft and related works (13.1%), technicians and associate professionals (12.1%), and (Appendix Table 5.9).

The top five preferred industries where the unemployed looked for work were accommodation and food service activities (21.2%), construction (13.8%), wholesale and retail trade (12.1%), professional, scientific and technical activities (10.5%), and financial services (7.6%) (Appendix Table 5.10).

Among the unemployed, 57.6 percent relied mainly on parents or spouse/partners for financial support. A further 14.9 percent relied on their savings and investment, and 12.2 percent on other relatives and friends (Appendix Tables 5.22).



3.6 PERSONS NOT IN THE LABOUR FORCE

Those who were of working age (15 years and older) and not working, not available to work and did not seek work during the reference week were classified as being not in the labour force. A total of 8,314 persons were not in the labour force, the majority of whom were between 15 - 24 years old (33.5%) and 65 years or older (29.1%), (Appendix 6.1). The main reason given by persons between 15 - 24 years old for being out of the labour force were studies/in training (94.5%) while the elderly reported being retired (89.7%) (Table 20).

Persons not in the labour force consisted mainly of females (59.8%), youth 15 - 24 years (33.5%) and the elderly (29.1%) (Appendix Tables 6.2 and 6.3). The majority of persons not in the labour force had high school or lower level education (65.6%) (Appendix Tables 6.6).



Most males not in the labour force were in school/training (45.0%) or retired/elderly (34.0%). Females not in the labour force were also mostly in retired/elderly (31.8%), school/training (31.7%), or engaged in home/family duties (29.9%) (Appendix Table 6.8). The main means of financial support for persons not in the labour force were parents (34.7%), spouse/partner (18.4%) and savings/investments (16.2%) (Appendix Table 6.18 and 6.19).



4. OTHER FINDINGS

4.1 SOCIAL SERVICES AS A MAIN MEANS OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The 2014 LFS results indicate that of the total 47,896 persons in the working age population (15 years and over), 21.2 percent or 10,173 persons were not working. Among those who were not working, 673 or 6.6 percent of them relied on Social Services for their main means of financial support. Those relying on social services support were mainly females (67.8%) and the elderly (49.3%). Almost all the recipients of social services support are Caymanian (90.1%). The unemployed accounted for 26.3 percent of those receiving this type of financial support (Table 21).

It should be noted that only persons who were not working were asked about their main means of financial support. Therefore, persons who are working and also receiving assistance from social services, as well as children, are excluded from this count.

Majority of the households had internet connectivity (69.0%), computer² (75.9%), cable/satellite television (70.1%), and air-condition (89.7%). Half of the households (50.0%) reported having house insurance. About 3 of every 5 households (60.0%) had no land-line telephone, but almost all (98.9%) had at least one cell phone.

In 2014, the mean monthly rent reported for accommodation furnished or unfurnished was CI\$946.00 and the mean rental value for owner occupied dwelling was CI\$2,082.25 (Appendix Table 8.7).
