## 1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings on the 2013 Labour Force Survey (LFS). Since 2005, the LFS has been conducted on a yearly basis in October. Prior to that, the LFS was conducted twice a year in April and October. Financial constraints have led to a reduction in the frequency of the Survey.

The Labour Force Survey has been used to provide information on the characteristics of persons in the labour force. The concepts used in the survey are in accordance with the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines and therefore, the indicators produced from the Survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The remaining sections of this report present the methodology (Section 2), the main findings with emphasis on the profile of the labour force, and those that are out of the labour force (Section 3) and other findings on training, expenses & remittances and housing characteristics (Section 4). Where possible, the data are disaggregated by sex, age and status and comparisons are made with results of the 2012 Labour Force Survey.

#### 2. METHODOLOGY

Planning and execution of the 2013 Labour Force survey (LFS) was done by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department of the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development of the Cayman Islands Government.

The ESO's Household Register, which is comprised of a listing of all households and dwelling units countrywide, provided the sampling frame for the survey. This register had a total of approximately 26,000 entries comprising of all households counted in the 2010 Census and subsequent updates including the most recent (July to August 2013) on dwellings that were previously counted as under construction and vacant.

#### Sample design

A stratified random sample design was used with households selected from all of 277 enumeration areas (EAs) spread across all districts. Within each district, the households were selected with equal probability and the final sample represented approximately six percent of the households within the respective district; the number of households in the district was drawn from the recently updated Household Register. The total number of households sampled was 1,691. The probability of selection for the sample households in each district can be expressed as follows:

#### **Fieldwork**

A total of 20 persons received a one-week training to conduct the survey. The reference week for the survey was the week ending October 5, 2013. The data collection took place over a sixweek period starting October 6, 2013 and ending on November 12, 2013. The trained interviewers comprised staff members of the ESO and temporary survey staff. Two trained interviewers from Cayman Brac conducted interviews on the Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman).

## Weights

A population estimate for 2013 was derived using administrative data including 2013 natural increase (births minus deaths) and immigration data. The basic sampling weight, or expansion factor, was then calculated based on the estimated population and the sample population adjusted for non-responses at the household level.

# **Data processing**

The survey returns were processed internally by ESO staff members: scanning was done using Cardiff Teleform and editing with CSPro (Census and Survey Processing System). A data file was then created with information from all households who completed the interview (fully and partially). Indicators were generated from this file using SPSS (Statistical Package for Social Sciences).

## Margin of error and rounding off

The estimates were computed with a 2.5 percent margin of error. The estimates published in this report are rounded to the nearest whole number. The sum of the individual rounded items may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding off. As practiced in previous LFS, estimates of 25 or lower (but not zero) have been suppressed as indicated by "..." or regrouped as they are considered to be unreliable to be useful.

#### 3. MAIN LABOUR FORCE FINDINGS

In 2013, the population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 55,691. There were 32,765 Caymanians and 22,926 non-Caymanians. The labour force was comprised of 38,483 persons, with 36,070 of them employed and 2,413 unemployed. The labour force participation rate was 83.0 percent while the unemployment rate was 6.3 percent. The unemployment rate and labour force participation rate varied by sex and status (Tables 2 and 3). Figure 1 illustrates the composition of the population and the labour force.



#### **3.1 POPULATION ESTIMATES**

In 2013, the estimated population stood at 55,691, a decrease of 1,041 persons or 1.8 percent compared to 2012. The majority of Cayman's population lives in Grand Cayman, particularly in George Town which accounted for 52.3 percent. Bodden Town had 20.2 percent of the population while West Bay had 19.3 percent. The Sister Islands' (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman) combined population accounted for 3.5 percent.

The average household size was 2.4 persons per household and varied by district. Bodden Town had the highest with 2.7 persons and the Sister Islands the lowest with 2.2 persons.

## Sex and Age

The estimated population according to sex distribution in 2013 comprised 51.3 percent females and 48.7 percent males (Table 5).

Children younger than 15 years old accounted for 16.8 percent of the population while the elderly (65 years or older) represented 7.0 percent (Table 5). These two groups together are referred to as the 'dependent population' which accounted for 23.8 percent. In comparison to 2012 it showed no change in the proportion of dependents.

The working age population which is the age group from 15 to 64 years old accounted for 76.2 percent of the population. Persons in this age group are usually working or looking for work and are said to be in their 'productive years'. It is on this group that children and elderly



depend. Therefore, the distribution of the population by age indicates a dependency ratio of one to three, i.e., for every dependent person there are three persons in the working age population.

#### Status

The proportion of Caymanians increased from 56.8 percent in 2012 to 58.8 percent in 2013, or by 564 persons (Table 5). Among Caymanians, 77.7 percent were in the working age population compared to 90.0 percent among Non-Caymanians (Appendix Table 1.5). This is expected since the local economy has a high proportion of expatriates that supply labour in various sectors of the economy.



#### **3.2 LABOUR FORCE**

The labour force, otherwise referred to as the 'current economically active population', is comprised of persons in the working-age population who worked, as well as those who at the time of the survey, did not have a job, but were available and looking work. In 2013, there were 38,483 persons who were in the labour force. This figure represents a less than one percent (0.8%) decline when compared to the previous year. The overall decrease in the labour force was due to a decline of 6.0 percent among non-Caymanians in the labour market. However, there was an increase of 4.9 percent in the number of Caymanians (Table 6).

# Sex and age

In 2013, females accounted for 49.7 percent and males accounted for 50.3 percent of the labour force. The sex distribution of the labour force did not change significantly when compared to 2012.



The age group 35 to 44 years accounted for 29.1 percent of the labour force in 2013, followed by the 45-54 years (24.4%).

## Status

The labour force distribution by status in 2013 indicated that 50.2 percent were Caymanians and 49.8 percent were Non-Caymanians (Table 6).

# Labour Force Participation Rate

The overall labour force participation rate (LFPR)<sup>1</sup> was 83.0 percent (Table 7). Non-Caymanians overall had a higher labour force participation rate (91.8%) than their Caymanian counterparts (75.8%). This is expected since the majority of Non-Caymanians are imported labour and with the absence of work are required to leave the country.

Labour force participation increased directly with educational attainment, as lower levels of education had lower participation rates in general. The rate ranged from 45.3 percent among those with no qualifications to 90.7 percent among those with post-secondary education. Labour force participation among those with a college/university education was 88.8 percent. The participation rate of females is lower than their male counterparts across all educational attainment categories.

#### **3.3 EMPLOYED**

The employed consists of those persons in the labour force who worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week, which was the week ending October 5, 2013. Persons who, for some reason or the other, did not work during the reference week, but had a job were also categorized as members of the employed labour force. Such persons were temporarily absent from work.



In 2013, the number of employed in the labour force was 36,070 and approximately one percent lower compared to 2012. The overall decrease is mainly a result of a 6.7 percent drop in the number of employed Non-Caymanians.

# Sex and Age

There were 315 fewer females and 16 fewer males employed in 2013 than a year ago (Table 8). Those in the 35 to 44 age group accounted for the biggest share of the employed (30.3%). The youth and the elderly represented 6.7 and 2.9 percent of the employed, respectively.

#### Status

Employed Caymanians in 2013 totalled 17,501 and accounted for 48.5 percent of the employed. A comparison with the 2012 figures indicates that the number of employed Caymanians increased by 1,008 or 6.1 percent (Table 8). This proportion of employed Caymanians is an increase compared to 2012 (45.3%).

In 2013, employed Non-Caymanians totalled 18,569 and accounted for 51.5 percent of the employed persons. A comparison with 2012 showed a decrease of 1,339 persons or 6.7 percent (Table 8). Both males and females recorded declines of 1,054 and 285 respectively.

# Hours of Work

The employed worked an average of 41.7 hours per week. Males on average, worked 4 hours longer per week than females while Non-Caymanians worked 1 hour longer than the Caymanians (Appendix Tables 3.25 and 3.26).

#### Category of Worker

The employed worked mainly as paid employees (91.5%), while 8.5 percent had their own business as self-employed with or without employees. Among employed males, 12.0 percent were self-employed, while among females 5.1 percent were self-employed. Caymanians (14.2%) were more likely than non-Caymanians (3.1%) to have their own business (Tables 9 and 10).

# Occupation




Figure 2: Employment by Occupation (%), 2013

The top five occupations in 2013 were service and sales workers (19.6%); professionals (17.6%); technicians and associate professionals (14.3%); elementary occupations (13.4%); and craft and related trades workers (12.0%) (Figure 2). Analysis by sex and status indicates varying patterns. Males were mostly employed as craft and related trades workers (23.1%); professionals (14.4%); service and sales workers (13.7%); and technicians and associate professionals (13.6%). The pattern for females showed they were mainly employed as service and sales workers (25.5%); professionals (20.8%); and elementary occupations (17.6%), (Appendix Table 3.19 and 3.20).

Caymanians were mainly employed as service and sales workers (17.7%); technicians and associate professionals (17.4%); professionals (16.9%); and managers (14.5%). Non-Caymanians were mainly employed as service and sales workers (21.4%); elementary occupations (20.6%); and professionals (18.2%).

# Industry




Figure 3: Employment by Industry (%), 2013

The top six industries accounted for 62.2 percent of the employed labour force, these were: wholesale and retail trade (13.6%); construction (11.5%); financial services (9.8%); accommodation and food service activities (9.4%); activities of households as employers (8.6%); and professional, scientific, and technical activities (8.1%) (Figure 3). Males were mainly engaged in construction (22.4%); wholesale and retail trade (15.0%); and public administration (8.2%), while females were mainly engaged in activities of households as employers (16.2%); financial services (12.4%); wholesale and retail trade (12.3%); and professional, scientific, and technical activities (11.7%), (Appendix Tables 3.21 and 3.22).

Caymanians were mainly in financial services (14.9%); wholesale and retail trade (12.5%); and public administration activities (12.0%) (Appendix Table 3.20). Non-Caymanians were mainly employed in the following industries: activities of households as employers (14.9%); accommodation and food service activities (14.8%); wholesale and retail trade (13.3%); and construction (12.0%).

#### Income

Approximately 47.5 percent of employed persons earned \$2,400 or more per month (Tables 11 and 12). The proportion was higher among employed males (48.8%) compared to employed females (46.2%) earning this same income range. Caymanians (57.6%) were more likely than Non-Caymanians (38.0%) to have earned \$2,400.00 or more per month. In the highest income range, i.e. \$7,200.00 or more per month, there were more males (9.0%) than females (5.6%) and more Caymanians (8.2%) than non-Caymanians (6.4%).

#### 3.4 UNDEREMPLOYMENT

'Underemployment' is defined as 'Involuntary part-time' work, where workers who could (and would like to) be working for a full work-week can find only part-time work. The underemployed accounted for 1.6 percent of the employed in 2013 (Table 13). Underemployment was 1.7 percent for males and 1.5 percent for females. Caymanians had a higher rate of underemployment (2.6%) than Non-Caymanians (0.7%). The majority (66.9%) of underemployed persons were in the 35-64 years age group. More than half of the underemployed had high school level education (Appendix Table 4.1).

#### 3.5 UNEMPLOYED

Based on the ILO guidelines, a person of working age is deemed to be unemployed if he/she is without a job, but is currently available for work and has been seeking employment within the reference period. In 2013 there were 2,413 unemployed persons, and the unemployment rate was 6.2 percent. The unemployed were mainly males (57.3%), younger than 35 years (52.6%) or Caymanians (79.9%). Overall, there was no significant change in the number of employed persons between 2012 and 2013. However, there were 108 fewer unemployed Caymanians and 111 more unemployed non-Caymanians during that period.

# Sex, age and status

Youth (15 to 24 years) unemployment rate (24.2 %) remained the highest compared to other subgroups of the unemployed, and males (6.7%) continued to experience higher unemployment rate than females (5.8%). The unemployment rate among Caymanians was 9.4



percent, which is lower compared to the 10.5 percent in 2012. Among non-Caymanians, the 2013 unemployment rate was 3.1 percent, an increase compared to 2012 (2.4%).

# Education and other information

Approximately one in every four (24.5%) unemployed persons had post-secondary or higher level education. Among unemployed Caymanians, 20.0 percent of them had this same level of education compared to 38.2 percent of unemployed non-Caymanians.

A majority (87.2%) of the unemployed stated that they had worked before, and approximately 65 percent have been without work for six or more months, (Appendix Tables 5.14 and 5.15). They had worked mainly as sales and service workers (22.2%); craft and related trades workers (18.2%); and clerical support workers (13.4%) (Appendix Table 5.18)

When asked about their main means of job search, the unemployed persons' most popular responses were to send resume (58.1%); ask friends (54.4%); and contact employer (44.8%). To a lesser extent, they registered with the National Workforce Development Agency (NWDA) (22.5%) and checked websites (21.2%). Caymanians (25%) were more likely than the non-Caymanians (13%) to have registered with the NWDA.

The top five preferred occupations that the unemployed were looking for were service and sales (23.1%), clerical support (22.8%), craft and related works (16.0%), technicians and associate professionals (7.3%) and professionals (6.5%).

The top five preferred industries where the unemployed looked for work were construction (20.3%), accommodation and food service activities (17.8%), wholesale and retail trade (15.1%), public administration (7.7%), and financial services (6.7%) (Appendix Table 5.11).

More than one half (54%) of the unemployed persons have received training for a specific occupation. However, the majority of those who received training (61%) did so before 2009. Approximately 10 percent of unemployed Caymanians have received ongoing or current training in 2013 (Appendix Tables 5.24).

The unemployed (60.4%) relied mainly on parents or spouse/partners for financial support. A further 14.1 percent relied on their savings and investment, and 10.2 percent on other families and friends (Appendix Tables 5.22).



#### 3.6 PERSONS NOT IN THE LABOUR FORCE

Those who were of working age (15 plus years old) and not working, not available to work and did not seek work were classified as being not in the labour force. A total of 7,865 persons were not in the labour force, the majority of whom were 65 years or older (34.1%) or younger than 25 years (33.1%). The main reason given by persons younger than 25 years old for being out of the labour force were studies/in training (91.0%) while the elderly reported being retired (87.6%)(Table 18).

Persons not in the labour force consisted mainly of females (58.6%), the elderly (34.1%) and youth 15-24 years (33.1%) (Appendix Tables 6.2 and 6.3). The majority of these persons had high school or lower level education (68.2%) (Appendix Tables 6.4).



Most males not in the labour force were in retirement (39.7%) or in school/training (38.2%). Females not in the labour force were also mostly in retirement (34.5%), in school/training (31.1%) or engaged in home duties (22.3%) (Appendix Table 6.6). The main means of financial support for persons not in the labour force were parents (32.5%), spouse/partner (18.9%) and pension/veteran/seaman benefits (18.0%) (Appendix Table 6.18 and 6.19).



#### 4. OTHER FINDINGS

#### **4.1 SIZE OF BUSINESS**

Employed persons were asked, 'How many persons are employed at ..... place of work?' This close ended question had four applicable responses, ranging from 1-10 to 50 or more. The results, which indicate the size of businesses where they work, revealed that most of the employed persons (40.2%) worked in small businesses with 1-10 employees and 30 percent worked in big businesses with 50 or more employees.

Further analysis by industry shows that employed persons in the construction industry worked mainly in small construction businesses (54.2%). Those who worked in administrative and support services (49%); restaurants and mobile food services activities (45.1%); and wholesale and retail trade services (43.1) were also more likely to have worked in small businesses with 1-10 employees.

In contrast, persons who worked in accommodation (64.2%); financial and insurance activities (53.5%); professional scientific and technical activities (53.4%); human health and social work activities (53.3%); and public administration industries (53%) were more likely to have worked in big companies with 50 or more persons.

#### 4.2 SOCIAL SERVICES AS A MAIN MEANS OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The 2013 LFS results indicate that of the total 46,348 persons in the working age population (15 years or older), 10, 278 or 22.2 percent of them were not working. Among those who were not working, 813 or 7.9 percent of them relied on Social Services for their main means of financial support. Those relying on social services support were mainly females (75.8%) and the elderly (56.4%). Almost all the recipients of social services support are Caymanian (95.3%). The unemployed accounted for 20 percent of those receiving this type of financial support (Table 19).

It should be noted that only persons who were not working were asked about their main means of financial support. Therefore, persons who are working and also receiving assistance from social services, as well as children, are excluded from this count.

## **4.3 EXPENSES AND REMITTANCES**

Questions on expenses abroad and remittances were included in the LFS questionnaire to get an indication of the effects of such activities on the economy. The information collected is used by the ESO as an input in the estimation of the annual Balance of Payments.



In 2013, 29.6 percent of individuals stated that they have had at least one trip abroad within the last twelve months (Appendix Table 7.1).

There were 19,633 persons who stated they sent money abroad (Appendix 7.3). Of these, 52.9 percent sent less than CI\$2,000.00 for the year, while 24.8 percent sent CI\$2,000 to CI\$4,999. The main mode of transferring money abroad was by money transfer agents (75%), followed by bank wire transfers/draft/money order (23.3%) (Appendix Table 7.4).

#### 4.4 HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

The majority of households (48.4%) owned their homes, while 47.4 percent rented their homes (Table 19).

Majority of the households had internet connectivity (63.9%), computer (72%), cable/satellite television (71.3%), and air-condition (89.3%). Only 48.1 percent of households reported having house insurance. About 3 of every 5 households (59.1%) had no land-line telephone, but almost all (98.8%) had at least one cell phone.

In 2013, the mean monthly rent reported for accommodation furnished or unfurnished was CI\$1,276.45 and the mean rental value for owner occupied dwelling was CI\$1,841.12 (Appendix Table 8.7).
