

FOREWORD

Through a list of 41 tables, supporting commentary and analysis, this report on the 1999 Cayman Islands Population and Housing Census provides a summary of the findings of the exercise. The tables presented here are by no means an exhaustive list of the data available from the census, but they do portray information that will be more frequently utilised. Further information is available on request from the Statistics Office.

The information from the census provides one more set of data to assist in the planning and provision of services to the residents of the Cayman Islands.

Without the hard work and dedication of the Census Office Staff, the 200 supervisors, enumerators, trainers, and the coding, editing and data entry team, this exercise could not have been completed. The efforts of the Census Advisory Committee and others for their input on the content of the questionnaire, the staff of the Government Information Services, the Chamber of Commerce and members of the private sector for their contribution to census publicity, were also all greatly appreciated.

The census exercise would have been meaningless without the participation and cooperation of the people of the Cayman Islands. I would like to thank all of those persons who took time out to ensure that they were counted and included.

INTRODUCTION

The 1999 Census of Population and Housing was conducted on October 10, 1999. The Census operation was marred by two events during that month. Torrential downpours, which continued into November, hampered the enumeration exercise. A riot at Northward Prison and the escape of prisoners from that institution also hampered the fieldwork. These events contributed to slowing down the Census process and resulted in an extension of the deadline for the collection forms.

The Statistics Office had scheduled a post-enumeration survey for January 2000, but instead conducted a "Clean Up" survey when it became apparent that the response rate for the initial exercise was unsatisfactory. A total of 2,425 dwelling units were revisited after the Visitation Records from the field staff had identified them as potential households. After this exercise was completed, it was determined that there was a 9 percent under count, with George Town and North Side being the areas most severely affected. The figures presented in this publication take this under count into consideration by weighting the results by district.

Coding and editing of the questionnaires began in February 2000. Coding was completed in May. Editing continued until October as data entry revealed errors that needed to be checked and corrected.

An independent estimate (39,860) of the population using the natural increase (births – deaths), Immigration Department data and other administrative data provided an assessment of the Census exercise. The two figures differed by less than 500 individuals.

As in the previous two Censuses, questionnaires were delivered to households and the forms completed by the occupants. The 1999 Census questionnaire was more detailed than either the 1979 or 1989 forms and was designed to use Optical Mark Reading (OMR) technology for data entry. This technology while considerably reducing data entry errors required field staff to be more vigilant at the time of collection.

The Census counted all persons present in the Cayman Islands on Census Day (the "de facto" population) as well as residents abroad providing that they had not been overseas for a continuous period of over 1 year.

The questionnaire for the 1999 Census repeated many of the questions from 1989 but sought to collect additional information relevant to the needs of the society. As a result, questions were asked on computer availability and internet access in the home, hours spent on unpaid household activities, disability, remittances abroad, health insurance and pensions. The question on income was expanded to include income from sources other than employment.

The questionnaire was divided into 3 sections and contained of 71 questions. The sections are as follows:

Identification 1 question

Housing 24 questions

Personal 46 questions

The Identification Section was used to list all persons who resided in the household by sex and age. A question for identifying households that engaged in agricultural activity was also asked in this section. This information will be used in an Agricultural Census.

The Housing Section consisted of nine new questions. Two questions on access to technology within the home, two on the use of homes for business purposes, one each on repairs to households, energy for lighting, fuel for cooking and two aimed at measuring the cost of shelter.

The Personal Section was significantly increased and fourteen new questions were asked. These included four questions on disability, one each on union status, health insurance, unpaid household activities, religion, daycare supervision for children under 5 years of age, months worked in the Cayman Islands during 1998, remittances abroad and pensions, and two on language spoken. Additionally, the question on Caymanian Status was broadened to incorporate citizenship and the income question expanded to provide information on income other than employment income.

DEFINITIONS

This section provides definitions used in the questions from which the census variables have been derived. Variables whose meanings are clear have not been included. Residents were provided with a written "Guide" to assist them in completing the questionnaire. The "Guide" also provided answers to some commonly asked questions. The questionnaire also provided instructions on how to interpret the questions. A copy of the main questionnaire is shown at Attachment I.

RESIDENT POPULATION

The term "resident" applies to all persons who had lived or who, by virtue of their job or other circumstances, intended to live in the Cayman Islands for six months or more.

DWELLING UNIT

For the purposes of this census, a dwelling unit is synonymous with living quarters. A dwelling unit is therefore defined as a structurally separate and independent place of abode. The essential features of dwelling units are *separateness* and *independence*. An enclosure may be considered separate if, surrounded by walls, fences and covered by a roof. Occupants can then isolate themselves from others in the community for the purposes of sleeping, preparing and taking meals, and protecting themselves from environmental hazards. Such an enclosure may be considered independent when it has direct access from the street, from a public or communal staircase, a passage, gallery or grounds, allowing occupants to move in or out of their dwelling unit without passing through someone else's premises.

HOUSEHOLD

A household comprises *EITHER*:

- ★ one person living alone; or
- ★ a group of persons (not necessarily related) living at the same address **AND** with common housekeeping.

Common housekeeping means sharing at least one meal a day *OR* sharing a living room. This concept is used for persons sharing an apartment or house together.

In most cases, the dwelling unit will also be the household. There are cases however, where this is not the case. In the Cayman Islands, *rooms in dwelling units are rented individually by the 'owner.'* While these persons may share a common living area, *EACH ROOM WAS TREATED AS A SEPARATE HOUSEHOLD.*

This definition varies from the one used in the 1989 Census. In 1989 a dwelling unit containing four individuals sharing a common living area but renting separately from the landlord, would have been treated as one household. In 1999, this would have constituted four households.

AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITY

These activities include the rearing of cattle, pigs, goats, rabbits and poultry, bee-keeping, aquaculture and the operation greenhouses and nurseries. The cultivation of backyard herb or vegetable gardens, fruit trees, ornamentals and field crops were also included as well as any other agricultural operation not previously identified.

REPAIRS

Minor and major repairs indicate that some part of the dwelling is damaged or not operating properly.

Minor repairs were defined as having to replace missing or loose floor tiles, bricks or shingles and repairing broken windows.

Major repairs were defined as structural repairs to walls, floors or ceilings, the installation of a new roof or the replacement of external siding.

RELATIONSHIP TO FIRST PERSON

Person in each household were categorised by their relationship to the first person recorded on the questionnaire. Generally this was a responsible adult regarded as the head or leader of the household. In cases where the traditional family type structure was absent, as in the case of persons sharing apartments, the first person contacted was recorded as the "First Person".

MARITAL STATUS

The legal definition for marital status was used in this exercise in a slight departure from the definitions used in the 1989 Census.

COMMON LAW

Persons living together as husband and wife but not legally married fell into this category.

YEAR OF ARRIVAL

The year in which the person last arrived to reside in the Cayman Islands. For individuals who lived in an out of the Cayman Islands, the year of arrival was the latest year in which they arrived to take up residence.

LONG STANDING ILLNESS

This term was used in the question on disability and referred to chronic health problems of six months or more duration, which limited free activity by the individual.

INCOME

All questions relating to income on the Census questionnaire were pre-coded in ranges. The income data provided in this report has been derived using the following assumptions.

The income question was relative to the calendar year 1998. As such persons who earned income during 1998 but had left prior to the Census are not included in these calculations.

SUMMARY OF THE 1999 CENSUS RESULTS



A total of 40,786 persons spent the night of October 10, 1999 in the Islands. Of this total there were:

37,651 residents in private homes 390 residents in institutions 688 visitors staying in private homes and 2,057 visitors staying in accommodation establishments.

- > 1,369 residents spent Census night outside of the Cayman Islands.
- The resident population of the Cayman Islands on Census night stood at 39,410 of which 390 were institutionalized.
- The non-institutionalized resident population numbered 39,020 and was distributed as follows:

All tables in the remainder of this report have been compiled on the basis of the non-institutionalized population.

➤ The population of the Cayman Islands grew by 55.4 percent over the 1989 Census figure of 25,355 or at an average annual rate of 4.5 percent. At this rate of growth the population of the Cayman Islands will double by the year 2015. On a District basis Bodden Town registered the highest growth and North Side the lowest. Average annual growth by District over the period is as follows:

- The number of households in the Cayman Islands increased to 14,907 in the 1999 Census from a total of 8,115 in 1989. These figures are not strictly comparable as the definition of a "household" was modified for the 1999 Census.
- Average household size in the Cayman Islands declined from 3.1 in the 1989 Census to 2.6 in 1999.



SOCIAL AND DEMOGRAPHIC

The average age of residents in the Cayman Islands in the 1999 Census was 32.8 years. In 1989 the figure was 31 years. A comparison of average age by district for the last two censuses is as follows:

- 2,740 persons or 7 percent of population were under the age of five. Of these 2,113 or 77 percent were Caymanians.
- > 7,598 persons or 19 percent of the population were under the age of 15. Of these 5,988 or 79 percent were Caymanians.
- > 2,195 persons or about 6 percent of the population were 65 years or older. 83 percent of these, or 1821 persons were Caymanians.
- Cayman Brac registered the highest proportion of elderly persons with 15 percent of the population being 65 years and over. North Side, East End, Little Cayman and West Bay followed with 11, 10, 8 and 6 percent respectively.
- The proportion of males to females has remained virtually unchanged from the 1989 Census. 51 percent of the population were female and 49 percent male as was the case in 1989. In 1999 there were 19,987 females and 19,033 males.
- ➤ 53 percent of the population were Caymanian, either through parentage or grants of status for other reasons. This has declined from 67 percent in 1989. A comparison of the percentage of Caymanians in the population by district for the last two censuses is as follows:

- The number of Caymanians in the country grew at a modest rate of 1.9 percent per annum between 1989 and 1999. The Caymanian population grew from 16,868 in 1989 to 20,491 in 1999.
- Over the same period the non-Caymanian population more than doubled, growing at 8.2 percent per annum. The number of non-Caymanians living in the Cayman Islands on Census day was 18,529 up from 8,387 in 1989.
- ➤ 48 percent of the resident population (15,040), 15 years and over were legally married. A further 38 percent fell into the never married category.
- ➤ 10 percent of the resident population, 15 years and over (3,161) were recorded as living in a "Common Law" relationship.
- ➤ 23 percent of residents over the age of one (9,071) had lived elsewhere one year ago. Of these, 5,870 had changed residences within the Cayman Islands.
- ➤ 1673 residents reported they were suffering from some form of disability. 37 percent of those reporting disabilities (622) were 65 years and over. A further 20 percent or 340 persons were between the ages of 50 and 64.
- > 85 percent of residents were covered by Health Insurance.
- The majority of residents, 94 percent, spoke English most often at home. For another 3 percent (1,249) the language most often spoken was Spanish.
- ▶ 6,450 persons were full time students in the Cayman Islands. Of these, 5,116 or about 80 percent were Caymanians.
- ➤ 15 percent (533) of the persons at school full time in the Cayman Islands attended daycare,/nursery/pre-school.
- > 51 percent (3,321) of the full time school population in the Cayman Islands attended primary school.
- 36 percent (2,326) of the persons at school full time in the Cayman Islands attended middle or high school.
- > 51 percent (3271) of the persons at school full time in the Cayman Islands were male. The remainder, (3179) were female.
- ▶ 495 residents of the Cayman Islands were attending school full time overseas. These comprised of 270 females and 225 males.
- The average time spent on doing unpaid housework by residents of the Cayman Islands 15 years and over was 10.5 hours per week. Females spent 13.5 and their male counterparts 7.2 hours.
- The residents of East End, North Side and Cayman Brac spent more time on unpaid housework than those of the other districts. On average these residents spent 13.5, 13.1 and 12.0 hours per week respectively.

- Residents of the Cayman Islands, 15 years and over, spent an average of 6.4 hours per week on unpaid child care. Females spent 8.9 hours and males 3.7 hours. Excluding those persons who did not spend any time on child care, the average time spent by persons delivering unpaid child care was 19.1 hours, with females spending 22.5 hours and males 13.7.
- ➤ 4,864 or 15.5 percent of persons 15 years and over, reported that they had spent time caring for the elderly without pay. These people spent and average of 5.5 hours per week on this activity with females spending slightly more time than male. Female spent 5.7 hours and males 5.3.
- ➤ There were 26,849 persons in the Labour Force during the week of October 3 9, 1999.
- ≥ 25,506 persons were employed during the week of October 3 9, 1999.
- The proportion of employed males and females in the Labour Force was almost evenly split. There were 12,523 females (49 percent) as compared with 12,983 males (51 percent).
- ▶ 42 percent (10,630) of the employed Labour Force was Caymanian.
- ▶ 850 persons or 3.2 percent of the Labour Force were available for work and seeking a job during the week of October 3 9, 1999.
- A further 493 persons or 1.8 percent of the Labour Force were available for work but did not seek a job during the week of October 3 9, 1999.
- ➤ The construction industry was the largest employer of persons during the period October 3 9, 1999. 3,798 or 15 percent of the employed Labour Force were employed in this sector. Wholesale & Retail, Hotels and Restaurants, Private Households, Finance and Insurance, and Business Services were the sectors that followed, employing 3,319, 2,934, 2,612, 2,533 and 2,404 persons respectively.
- ➤ The Construction sector was also the largest employer of males with 3,625 persons working in this sector. The Household Sector was the largest employer of females providing work for 2,370 females.
- The proportion of single person households was 27% in 1999. This compares with 20% in 1989
- The number of person living alone doubled in 1999 moving from 1630 in 1989 to 3958 in 1999. An expanded definition for a "household", designed to capture the concept of persons renting single rooms within a dwelling unit, is partially responsible for this increase.



Average annual household income in the Cayman Islands in 1998 was CI\$ 52,400. On a per capita basis the figure was CI\$ 20,000. The distribution of household income by District is as follows:

Residents of the Cayman Islands earned about CI\$ 781 million in income during 1998. This figure does not take into account persons who had lived in the Cayman Islands during 1998 but had left the Islands prior to Census Day, October 10, 1999. The distribution by district is as follows:

- On average residents of the Cayman Islands earned CI\$ 30,704 in total income in 1998.
- Caymanian residents on average earned CI\$ 31,751 in total income in 1998.
- Non-Caymanian residents on average earned CI\$ 29,735 in total income in 1998.
- Male residents earned an average of CI\$ 36,584 in total income in 1998.
- Female residents earned an average of CI\$ 24,940 in total income in 1998.
- Caymanian male residents on average earned CI\$ 36,551 in total income and Caymanian females CI\$ 27,372.
- Non-Caymanian male residents on average earned CI\$ 36,616 in total income in 1998. Their female counterparts earned CI\$ 22,523.
- Employment income contributed roughly 90 percent of total income in 1998. Employment income stood at CI\$ 700 million in 1998.

In 1998 self employed males outnumbered female by almost 3 to 1. Of the 2,550 persons earning income from self employment, only 664 were female. Females earned CI\$ 19 million in self employment income while males earned CI\$ 85 million.



- 13 percent of the households in the Cayman Islands engaged in agricultural activity.
- > 72 percent of the households (10,701) in the Cayman Islands used "city water" as their main source of water supply. This was substantially higher than the 30 percent recorded in 1989.
- > 57 percent of households (8,592) used electricity as their main fuel for cooking. 42 percent (6,211) used propane gas.
- ▶ 69 percent of households (10,258) had air conditioning facilities in the household. In 1989 the comparable figure was 42 percent.
- > 74 percent of the households (11,040) in the Cayman Islands had access to telephones.
- ➤ 38 percent of households (5,695) had a computer in the home of which 4,259 or 75 percent were hooked up to the internet.
- 2,311 households or 15 percent of the total number of households were in need of minor repairs, while a further 1,028 or 7 percent were in need of major repairs.
- Rental properties accounted for 49 percent (7,265) of the total number of households on the islands. A further 6 percent were provided "rent free". 22 percent (3,280) were owned outright and 23 percent (3,383) owned with a mortgage. In 1989 rental properties accounted for 41 percent (3,299) of the total, 6 percent were rent free, 31 percent of the households (2,547) were owned outright and 22 percent (1,761) were owned with a mortgage.
- 9,946 persons lived in homes that were owned outright. Of these 7,643 or 77 percent was Caymanian.
- > 11,615 persons lived in homes that were owned with a mortgage. Of these, 8,415 or 72 percent was Caymanian.
- ➤ 15,108 persons lived in rented accommodation. Of these, 3,248 or 21 percent was Caymanian.
- Residents of the Cayman Islands spent about CI\$ 5.9 million monthly on rent or about CI\$ 70.6 million for the year.
- Residents with home mortgages spent an estimated CI\$ 4.8 million monthly on mortgage payments or about CI\$58.2 million in 1999.
