PREFACE

The Government of the Cayman Islands decided to conduct its own Population Census for the year 1979, and a request was made through the "British Executive Service Overseas" for a suitable officer to assume the responsibilities of training, planning and conducting the Census, collection of data and processing through to the printed volume.

The Census programme was planned into 3 stages, in order that a 100% enumeration could take place, the planning was as follows:-

STAGE 1 - MAPPING TERRITORIES

The Lands and Survey Department provided detailed maps at a scale of 1–500 covering the three islands. These were then planned by the Census Advisor into 10 Census Districts and 79 Enumeration Areas, giving a workload to each Enumerator of approximately 60 dwellings of various mix.

STAGE 2 - ENGAGEMENT

Engagement of staff took place on the 21st August, 1979, comprising, viz:-

Grand Cayman

8 Supervisors and 74 Enumerators

Cayman Brac

1 Supervisor and 11 Enumerators

Little Cayman

1 Supervisor/Enumerator

Each Supervisor and Enumerator were duly sworn to an Oath of Secrecy as to information learned during their Census duties.

STAGE 3 - TRAINING

Stage 1

Training was conducted in 3 stages:

Field Survey – 2 hour Training Class and then 4 days in the Field with maps, to update maps, and get to know the territory – this resulted in an increase of approximately 850 additional properties being updated on the maps, and passed to Lands and Survey Department. All properties are detailed in the Census Record books.

 $Stage \ 2 \qquad \quad - \quad Delivery - 2 \ hour \ Training \ Class \ and \ then \ 6 \ days \ in \ the \ field \ to \ deliver \ Census \ Forms.$

Stage 3 - Collection - 4 hour Training Class and then from Census Day 8th October 1979 to 22nd October 1979 to collect all Census Forms and to ensure that a total Enumeration had taken place.

The Success of the Census Programme was due in no small measure to the excellent co-operation received from the Local Press, Radio Cayman and the Public at large.

PREPARATION OF DATA

Approximately 5,000 Household Forms and 300 Visitors Forms were vetted and moulded into their right categories and then Coded for computerisation. This has taken 8 months to completion for printing. The Census Tables with the exception of "Section "A" Table A7 (which is de facto) have been compiled on a purely de jure basis throughout, this was necessary due to the incomplete details provided by visitors.

COMMENTS

The Caymanian population (including those with Status) represents 80.7% and others (excluding visitors) 19.3%. If one accepts the child bearing age as between 18 and 39 years the annual rate of 230 children is rather low i.e. 3199 females between 18-39 years equals .07 children per female. The total married females between 18-39 years = 1976 which again only gives a birth rate of 12.8% or .13 children per person.

Projecting these figures over 10 years we will have a further decline in birth rate and an increase in the age range of 50-70 years. The present birth rate has been at 1.8% or 18 per 100 for the past 3 years with Cayman Islanders and taking their present age range of 50-70 years we have 1870 persons, when projected to 1989 we will have 2639 persons, an increase of 41.1%.

In 1970 we had 2.5 Caymanian to 1 non-Caymanian and in 1979 we have 3.8 Caymanians to 1 non-Caymanian in the active work force, this is a growth rate of 4.8 to 1 in favour of Caymanians over the past 9 years.

It should be noted that of the 580 seeking work a good proportion are between ages of 60-68 it is broken down as follows:-

Again at the time of the Census there were a number of persons who normally work in the Hotel Industry who were laid off, due to seasonal reasons and the 2 hurricanes David and Frederick which also agitated the picture. I would estimate the actual figure of true unemployed to be nearer 150, taking the 580 seeking work by district the results are:-
