

The Cayman Islands' Labour Force Survey Report Fall 2009

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1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings on the 2009 Labour Force Survey (LFS) and the Pilot Census. Since 2005, the LFS has been conducted on a yearly basis in October. Previous to that, the survey was conducted twice per year in April and October. Financial constraints have led to a reduction in the frequency of the Survey.

The Labour Force survey has been used to provide information on the characteristics of persons in the Labour Force. The concepts used in the survey are in accordance with the international Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines and therefore, the indicators produced from the survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The Pilot Census was conducted simultaneously with the 2009 LFS. Its main purpose was to test various aspects for the implementation of the 2010 Population and Housing Census including the questionnaire, document flow, field supervision and data processing.

The remaining sections of this report presents the methodology (Section 2) and main findings with emphasis on the end of year population estimates and a profile of the labour force, employed, unemployed and those that are out of the labour force (Section 3). Where possible, the data are disaggregated by sex, age and status and comparisons are made with previous 2008 LFS findings.



2. METHODOLOGY

Planning and execution of the two surveys were done by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department of the Ministry of Finance, Development and Tourism of the Cayman Islands Government.

The ESO's Household Register, which is comprised of a list of all households countrywide, provided the sampling frame for the survey. This register was last updated in August 2009 and had a total of approximately 20,000 households. A sample of approximately 1,500 households was randomly selected for the LFS and a Pilot Census. One in every 10 of the selected households was administered the Pilot Census questionnaire. The Pilot Census questionnaire included some of the same basic demographic and labour force questions as the LFS questionnaire.

The reference period of the LFS and the Pilot Census was the week ending October 11th 2009 while the actual survey was conducted during the period October 12^{th to} November 24th 2009. Data collection was done by the staff together with experience contracted enumerators. As a test for the supervision of fieldwork for the 2010 Census, five persons served as field supervisor with the responsibility of supervising at least three enumerators. Each enumerator also had an opportunity to serve as field supervisor for at least one week. This model also tested the flow of documents before and after data collection.

The overall response rate for the labour force Survey and the Pilot Census was 79.5 per cent, with Bodden Town recording the highest response (89.6%) and North Side (68.6%) the lowest. West Bay also recorded relatively low response (72.3%).

The response rate is lower compared to 2008 (86%). One of the main contributing factors to the decrease in response is the high number of vacant households (9%) and households where there were 'no contacts' (4%) after several attempts.

When the data were processed for both the LFS and Pilot Census, these files were merged to create one database with all the households that completed the LFS or the Pilot Census questionnaire. The population estimates and labour force indicators were generated with combined files.

The estimates published in this report are rounded to the nearest whole number. The sum of the individual rounded items may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding off. As practiced in previous LFS, estimates of 25 or lower (but not zero) have been suppressed as indicated by "....." or regrouped as they are considered to be too unreliable to be useful.



3. MAIN LABOUR FORCE FINDINGS

The main findings of the LFS and the Pilot Census indicate that the population of the Cayman Islands was 52,830 in 2009. There were 31,165 Caymanians compared to 21,665 non-Caymanians. The Labour Force was comprised of 36,100 persons, with 33,920 of them employed and 2,180 unemployed.






The Labour Force Participation Rate was 84.2 percent and Unemployment Rate was 6.0 per cent. These rates varied by sex and status as seen in the Tables 1.2 and 1.3. Further analyses of these indicators are presented below.

3.1 Population estimates

A comparison of the 2008 and 2009 population estimates indicate a decrease of 4,179 persons or 7.3 per cent. The negative movement in the population is in the expected direction, since other administrative data support such a movement. Data on work permits¹ issued indicate a decrease of approximately 3,000 or 11.3 per cent between 2008 and 2009.

The majority of Cayman's population lives in Grand Cayman and particularly in George Town (52%). West Bay has 21.6 per cent of the population while Bodden Town has 15.2 per cent. Cayman Brac and Little Cayman's combined population accounted for 5.4 per cent.




Figure 2: Population Distribution by District, 2009

Sex and Age

In 2009, there were more males than females in the population and their distribution has remained the same compared to 2008. Children younger than 15 years old accounted for 18.8 per cent of the population while the elderly (65 years or older)

represented 5.3 per cent. These two groups together are referred to as the 'dependent population'.

Those 15 to 64 years accounted for 76 per cent of the population. Persons in this age group are usually working or looking for work and are said to be in their 'productive years'. It is this group that children and elderly depend on for their livelihood. Therefore, the distribution of the population by age indicates a dependency ratio of one to three, i.e., for every dependent person there are three persons in the working age population.

Status

The proportion of Caymanians increased from 56 to 59 per cent, although their absolute number has decreased during the same period, 2008 to 2009. Their sex and age distribution is different compared to that of the Non-Caymanian population (Table 2.3). Among Caymanians, 67 per cent were in the working-age population compared to 88 per cent among Non-Caymanians (Table 2.4). This is expected since Cayman has a high proportion of foreign born nationals that supply labour in various sectors of the economy.

3.2 Labour Force

The labour force, otherwise referred to as the 'current economically active population', is comprised of persons in the working-age population who work, as well as those who at the time of the survey, did not have a job, but were available and willing to work. There were 36,100 persons who were either working or looking and available for work in 2009. This figure represents a 7.4 per cent decrease compared to 2008, which is the same as the decrease in the population.

Sex and Age

The labour force continues to have more males than females and the distribution in 2009 was similar to 2008. Youth (15 to 24 years old) accounted for 8.1 per cent of the labour force in 2009, which was also similar to 2008. Those in the 25 to 34 and 35 to 44 age groups were the only two groups to experience a decrease in their share of the labour force. The decrease was higher among the 25 to 34 age group, from 30.4 percent in 2008 to 27.2 per cent in 2009.

Status

The distribution of the labour force by status indicated that 50.3 per cent were Caymanian and 49.7 per cent were Non-Caymanian in 2009 (Table 2.4). Further analysis by sex shows that there were more Non-Caymanian males (51.1%) than Caymanian males (48.9%) in the labour force, while the reverse was so among females in the labour force (51.8% Caymanians vs. 48.2% Non-Caymanians).

Educational Attainment

Less than one half (44.2%) of the labour force has a post-secondary or higher education. Females (47.6%) were more likely than males (40.9%) and Non-Caymanians (49%) more likely than Caymanian (39.3%) to have this level of education (tables 2.6 and 2.7). Compared to 2008, these figures indicate a slight decrease in the proportion of the labour force with post secondary or higher education. The decrease was experienced by both sexes and among Caymanians and Non-Caymanians.




Figure 3: Percentage of the Labour Force with Post Secondary Education, 2008 and 2009



Labour Force Participation Rate

The labour force participation rate² was 84.2 per cent. The rate for Non-Caymanians was higher for males (88%) compared to females (80.6%). Non-Caymanians overall (92.5%) had a higher labour force participation rate than their Caymanian counterparts (77.3%), (Tables 2.8). This is expected since Non-Caymanians who do not have a work permit or government contract to participate in the labour force are required to leave the country.

As the educational level increased, participation in the labour force also increased, up to post secondary educational (Table 2.8). The rate ranged from 67.2 per cent among those with primary or lower education to 94.5 per cent among those with post secondary education. Labour force participation among those with a college/university education was 87.8 per cent.

3.2 Employed

The number of employed labour force³ in 2009 was 3,533 or 9.4 per cent lower compared to 2008. This rate of decrease was higher that the corresponding rates for the population and the labour force.

Sex and Age

The sex distribution of the employed population was 50.5 to 49.5 per cent in favour of the males. Those in the 35 to 44 age group accounted for the biggest share of the employed (30.6%), while the youth and the elderly represented 7.2 and 2.5 per cent of the employed, respectively (Table 3.1). Compared to 2008, employed males decreased by 11.6 per cent which was more that 1.5 times higher that the decrease experienced by the employed females (7.2%) during the same reference period.

³ The employed consist of those persons in the labour force who worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week. Persons who, for some reason or the other, did not work during the reference week, but had a job are also categorized as members of the employed labour force. Such persons were temporarily absent from work.

Status

In 2009, employed Caymanians numbered 16,374 and accounted for 48.3 per cent of the employed. A comparison with the 2008 figures indicates that the number of employed Caymanians decreased by 143 or 0.9 per cent. Although their number decreased slightly, their proportion of the employed increased by four percentage points, from 44.1 percent in 2008.

Employed Caymanians females were the only sub-group to have not experienced a decrease between 2008 and 2009. Employed Caymanian males had a 2.5 per cent decrease.

Employed Non-Caymanians were more affected by the decrease in employment. Although they still account for the majority of employed persons, their share has decreased from 55.9 per cent in 2008 to 51.7 per cent in 2009. Most affected were employed Non-Caymanians males who experienced an 18.1 per cent decrease during the 2008/2009 period, compared to a 13.9 per cent decrease among their female counterpart.

Hours of Work

The employed worked an average of 42.5 hours per week. Males on average, worked almost two hours longer per week than females while Non-Caymanians worked almost three hours longer than the Caymanian (tables 3.6 and 3.7).



Category of Worker

The employed worked mainly as paid employee (92.45%), while 7.3 per cent had their own business. Males (10.95%) were more likely than females (3.8%) and Caymanian (12.9%) more likely than non-Caymanians (2.2%) to have their own business (tables 3.8 and 3.9).

Occupation

The two main occupations in 2009 were professionals (24.6%) and craft and related workers (14.2%). However, further analysis by sex and status indicates different patterns. Caymanians (27.5%), females (27.2%), and Non- Caymanians (21.8%) were all mainly employed as professionals. However, males were mainly employed as craft and related workers (26.7%).

The second main occupation was different for these sub-groups. For Caymanians, it was legislators, senior officials and managers, while for the females and Non-Caymanians it was sales/service/elementary workers. The second main occupation for males was professionals (tables 3.10 and 3.11).

Industry

Most of the employed populations were engaged in public administration, health and social work; construction; wholesale; retail; and real estate sectors. Males were mainly engaged in the construction sector (26.8%), while females were mainly engaged in the public administration, education and health sector (18.3%), (Table 3.12)






Figure 4: Employed by Industry, 2009

Caymanians were mainly in the public administration, education and health sector (20.4%) while non-Caymanians were mainly in the construction sector (17.8%), (Table 3.13).

Income

The majority of employed persons earned \$2,400 or more per month (51.2%). The proportion was even higher among employed males (54.5%) earning this same income range, while less than one half (47.5%) of their female counterpart earned the same. In the highest income range, i.e. \$7,200.00 or more per month, there were twice as many males as females (Table 3.15). Caymanians were more likely than the non-Caymanians to have earned \$2,400.00 or more per month (Table 3.16).



3.4 Unemployed

Based on the ILO guidelines, a person of working age is deemed to be unemployed if he/she is without a job, but is currently available for work and has been seeking employment within a specified recent time period. In 2009 there were 2,181 unemployed persons. The unemployed were mainly males (62.7%), younger than 35 years (52%) or Caymanians (82%), (tables 4.1 to 4.3). It is expected that the unemployed will be mainly Caymanians especially since non-Caymanians are required to leave the country when their work permit or government contract is not renewed, and they do not have permanent resident status.

The majority of the unemployed had high school or lower level education (76.7%) and had worked before (86.8%). On a whole, they have been without work for longer than six months and have relied mainly on financial support from spouse/partners, parents, or other relatives and friends (tables 4.5 to 4.12)

The Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate⁴ is an indicator of the extent to which the supply of labour in the labour market exceeds the demand. It also indicates the degree to which the level of national productivity, and hence, the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of a country is below what it could be at any particular point in time. In 2009, the unemployment rate was 6 per cent, an increase of two percentage points compared to 2008.

Youth unemployment rate remained the highest compared to other subgroups of the unemployed. Males and those in the 25 to 34 age group experienced the highest increase in unemployment rate between 2008 and 2009, while the elderly was the only subgroup to have experienced a decrease in unemployment rate during that same period. Unemployment rate among the elderly decreased from 10.9 per cent in 2008 to 5.5 per cent in 2009. This suggests an increase movement out of the labour force by the elderly.

3.5 Persons Not in the Labour Force (PNLF)

Those who were not working, were not available to work and did not seek work were classified as being not in the labour force and numbered 6,752. They were mainly females (62.9%), youth (33.7%) or elderly (28.3%) and Caymanians (78.8%), (tables 5.1 to 5.3). The majority of them had high school or lower level education (72%).




Figure 5: Persons Not in the Labour Force, Main Reasons for Not Looking for Work by Sex, 2009

Most of the persons not in the labour force were students (34.3%), retired/elderly (37.1%) or engaged in home/family duties (11.6%). A comparison by sex indicates that males not in the labour force were more likely than their female counterpart to be in school (43.9% vs. 28.5%). Reversely, females not in the labour force were more likely than males to be engaged in home duties (17.6% vs. 1.4%). Males and females not in the labour force were equally likely to be retired/elderly (Table 5.6).

4. OTHER FINDINGS

4.1 Unpaid House Work

Persons in the working age population (15+ years) were asked about their time spent doing home duties and caring for their own children and the elderly, without pay. The majority spent more than five (5) hours in a week doing housework, while 9.2 per cent stated that they did not spend any time on unpaid housework.

Overall, very little time is spent on caring for own children and the elderly. The figures in tables 7.2 and 7.3 indicate that 64 per cent spent no time on child care and 87.6 per cent spent no time on caring for the elderly. Among those who care for their own children and the elderly, most of them spent less than five (5) hours per week doing so.

4.2 Expenses and Remittances

Questions on expenses abroad and remittances were included in the Labour Force questionnaire to get an indication of the effects of such activities on the economy. The information collected is used by the ESO as an input in the estimation of the annual Balance of Payments.

When asked about the number of trips taken abroad in the past 12 months, 62.3 per cent stated that they have had at least one trip. They spent an average of \$1,305.00 on food, hotel and entertainment, and \$424.00 on gifts and personal effects on all trips for the year (Table 8.1).

Among those who stated that they sent money abroad, 58 per cent sent less than \$2,000.00 for the year, while 23.4 per cent sent \$2,000 to \$4,000, (Table 8.3). The main mode of transferring the money was by wire and money transfers such as Western Union and Money Gram (94.7%).



4.3 Housing Characteristics

Households in the Cayman Islands either own or rent the dwelling they occupy. The mean estimated mortgage for owner-occupied dwelling was \$2,108.00 and the mean rent was \$1050.00 per month.

The majority of the dwellings have internet (64.5%), cable (70.7%) and air conditioning (88.4%). More than one-half have no land-line telephone, but almost all have at least one cell phone. At least one of every four households had a computer and 17 per cent had no vehicle (tables 8.4 to 8.5).

5. CONCLUSION

The 2009 Labour Force Survey Results revealed an overall decrease in the population which may be due to the economic crisis that resulted in the transfer/closing of businesses. This affected the overall labour force participation with increased unemployment rates. Caymanians were most affected.
