1. INTRODUCTION

This Report presents the results of the Occupational Wage Survey (OWS) 2017. The Economics and Statistics Office (ESO) conducted the OWS 2017 covering all types of establishments from October 2017 to February 2018, and households with employees from November 2017 to April 2018. There were 1,270 respondents to the OWS 2017 who supplied the data for 19,215 employees represented in this Report.

This Report mainly shows the average and other statistical description of (i) monthly basic earnings (basic salary and wages including overtime pay during the reference month which is September 2017 for most respondent employers, and July 2017 for hotels and restaurants); and (ii) monthly total compensation comprising of basic earnings and other compensation types during the reference month (acting or duty allowance, commission, bonus, gratuities and tips). These are shown for each 4-digit occupation code in the International Standard Classification of Occupations (2008 Revision) by industry.

1.1 Cabinet mandate

The conduct of the Occupational Wage Survey (OWS) 2017 was approved by the Cabinet on September 19, 2017, in accordance with the Statistics Law (2016 Revision). Prior to the approval, the then Minister of Education, Employment and Gender Affairs, recommended to Cabinet in September 2015 the conduct of such survey as part of a broad set of recommendations towards the "Implementation of the Minimum Wage Regime for the Cayman Islands." The recommendation was derived from the Minimum Wage Advisory Committee's (MWAC) Report that "new wage data collection methods should be introduced."

Specifically, the MWAC Report concluded that data on wages are "best collected in establishment surveys and censuses because establishments can draw upon business records when reporting." The only available data on current wages in the country are not from establishments, but from households, as reported in the Labour Force Surveys (LFS).

1.2 Purpose of OWS 2017

The purpose of OWS 2017 is to develop an Islands-wide baseline database of employment and compensation in public and private sectors for all occupations. It is intended for the following uses:

- a) reviewing the structure of employment and occupation by nationality status (Caymanian, Permanent Resident With Rights to Work, Non-Caymanian) in the various industries¹;
- b) reviewing employee compensation and benefits across industries and occupations, and

¹ The original design of the OWS was to classify all employees into four nationality status: Caymanian; Non-Caymanian Married to Caymanian/Residency and Employment Rights Certificate (RERC) Holder; Permanent Resident (PR); and Non-Caymanian. However, there were many occupation codes with too few RERC and PR employees to classify further across industries. These were, therefore, combined with the Non-Caymanian group.





c) estimating the cost of labour by industry or sub-industries.

1.3 Previous occupational wage surveys

The OWS 2017 is the first OWS that has as its scope all types of employers in the Cayman Islands: core government, statutory authorities and government-owned companies, private sector (profit and non-profit) entities and households as employers.

However, there were previous OWS that covered samples of the business establishments in the private sector. In 2003, the Caribbean Labour Market Information System (CLMIS) project was launched as an initiative spearheaded by the International Labour Organization (ILO) in an effort to seek to build and enhance the capacity for the production and use of labor market information in the English-speaking Caribbean. Through the successful implementation of this project, countries can be in a better position to generate reliable, timely, and internationally comparable labour market information (LMI) for use at various levels whether national, regional, or international levels. The Cayman Islands, though not included in the original project scope, participated by conducting the first survey – the Occupational Wage Survey in 2003 - as a component of this project. This was conducted by the former Department of Employment Relations.

The reference month was August 2003. The target sample included approximately 263 local businesses, data was received from 232 establishments yielding a response rate of 90.6 percent. The second OWS was conducted in 2005, with September 2005 as the reference period for the survey among salaried workers. The survey among wage earners had the 24th to 30th September 2005 as the reference period and covered 280 establishments of the targeted sample of 300 establishments with a response rate of 93.3 percent.

1.4 Organization of the Report

Section 2 of this Report presents a summary and the highlights of the survey returns. Section 3 presents the methodology including survey design, key concepts, definitions, the statistical descriptions, limitations and general caveats in using the data. Section 4 provides the main findings on basic earnings, and Section 5 comprises the main fndings on total compensation. Section 6 summarizes the findings on the provision of allowances and benefits by employers. Section 7 provides a list of the occupations in alphabetical order and their respective 4-digit ISCO codes, which is intended to assist readers in searching for the tables of their interest. The Appendix presents the Tables showing the detailed basic earnings and total compensation for all occupations.





2. SUMMARY OF RETURNS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- 1.1 There were 19,215 employees whose compensation data were received from employers and were processed for inclusion in this Report, of which 10,398 were Caymanians, and 8,793 were Non-Caymanians²; 9,238 were males and 9,947 were females. The OWS employees count represented 47 per cent of the total employment estimated from the results of the Labour Force Survey Fall 2017.
- 1.2 There are 282 occupational classifications represented in this Report based on the 4-digit International Standard Classification of Occupations (2008 Revision, ISCO) codes. The highest number of employee returns by occupation were:
 - **♣** Food and beverage servers/waiters 694
 - ♣ Cleaners and helpers in offices, hotels and other establishments 641
 - ♣ General office clerks 559
 - ♣ Finance managers 509
 - ♣ Accountants, auditors, financial controllers, etc. 506
- 1.3 The highest number of employee returns were from the following industries:
 - \blacksquare Public administration and defense (mainly the central government) -2,766
 - ♣ Accommodation and food services 2,518
 - **♣** Financial and insurance activities 2,336
 - ♣ Professional, scientific and technical activities (mainly legal and accounting) 2,355
- 1.4 The employee returns came from all types of major organizations in the Islands as follows:
 - ♣ Core government 3,812
 - ♣ Statutory authorities and government-owned companies 2,322
 - ♣ Private sector (profit and non-profit) 12,699
 - ♣ Households as employers 382

Average monthly basic earnings

- 1.5 The average monthly basic earnings (comprising of salary or wages and overtime pay only) in the Cayman Islands was \$3,979.
- 1.6 The average for Caymanian employees was \$4,208 while the average for Non-Caymanian employees was \$3,707.
- 1.7 Male employees had an average monthly basic earnings of \$4,017 while female employees had \$3,934.
- 1.8 Employees from the following industries had the highest average monthly basic earnings:
 - ♣ Professional, scientific and technical activities (mainly legal and accounting) \$6,556

² Some employees had no indicated nationality status





- **♣** Financial and insurance activities \$5,960
- 1.9 Employees from the following industries had the lowest average monthly basic earnings:
 - ♣ Activities of households as employers \$924
 - ♣ Agriculture, forestry and fishing \$1,488
- 1.10 The median monthly basic earnings was \$3,311; this is lower than the average monthly basic earnings indicating that majority of the employees (61.5%) had earnings less than the average basic earnings of \$3,979.
- 1.11 The top 5 occupation (at 4-digit ISCO) with the highest average earnings were:
 - **♣** Judges;
 - **↓** Lawyers, attorneys, barristers, etc;

 - ♣ Policy and planning managers; and
 - Dentists

(Appendix Table A7 shows the basic earnings of each occupation)

- 1.12 Among the occupations with the lowest-earning average earnings were:
 - Musicians, singers and composers;
 - ♣ Domestic cleaners and helpers;
 - **♣** Sweepers and related labourers;
 - ♣ Hand launderers and pressers; and
 - Beauticians and related workers.

Average total compensation

- 1.13 The average monthly total compensation (comprising of basic earnings plus commissions, bonuses, gratuities, tips, acting/duty allowances) in the Cayman Islands was \$4,550.
- 1.14 The average total compensation for Caymanian employees was \$4,696 while the corresponding average for Non-Caymanian employees was \$4,379.
- 1.15 Male employees had an average monthly compensation of \$4,707 while female employees had \$4,396.
- 1.16 Employees from the following industries had the highest average monthly total compensation:
 - ♣ Professional, scientific and technical activities (mainly legal and accounting) \$7,231
 - **♣** Financial and insurance activities \$6,555
- 1.17 Employees from the following industries had the lowest average monthly compensation:
 - ♣ Activities of households as employers \$1,058
 - ♣ Agriculture, forestry and fishing \$1,736





- 1.18 The median monthly total compensation was \$3,667; this is lower than the average monthly compensation indicating that majority of the employees (64.6%) had total compensation less than the average of \$4,550.
- 1.19 The occupation groups (at 4-digit ISCO) with the highest average total compensation were
 - **♣** Judges:
 - Web and multimedia developers;
 - **♣** Dentists:
 - ♣ Specialist medical practitioners; and
 - Manageing directors and chief executives

(Appendix Table A8 shows the total compensation statistics for each occupation).

- 1.20 On the other hand, among the lowest-earning occupations were
 - Musicians, singers and composers;
 - Domestic cleaners and helpers;
 - Child care workers;
 - ♣ Ships' deck crews and related workers; and
 - ♣ Field crop and vegetable workers.





3. METHODOLOGY

3.1 Survey research and development

Based on research by the ESO Social Statistics Unit, occupational wage surveys in other countries followed the recommended methodology by the International Labour Organization (ILO). The preparation of the OWS 2017 was therefore guided by the occupational wage survey forms that followed the ILO methodology including that for Trinidad and Tobago; the Cayman Islands' Occupational Wage Survey 2005 by the Department of Employment Relations; and the Barbados' Survey of Employment, Earnings and Hours, Labour Cost and Occupational Wage Rates.

The draft OWS 2017 forms and definitions were reviewed by the Caribbean regional office of the ILO. Revisions to the draft forms were introduced after consultations with officials of the Ministry of Human Resources, officials of the Ministry of Education who were previously involved with the MWAC, and a few private sector representatives who attended the consultation at the Chamber of Commerce conference room on October 16, 2017.

3.2 Survey design

The OWS was administered among all establishments in the private and public sectors of the Islands, as listed in the Business Register of ESO. It was also administered to households with employees; the list of such households was generated from LFS databases of the ESO.

There were two Forms for the establishments, with the following set of questions

Form A: Summary of Employment, Allowances and Benefits. This is a summary sheet of the establishment's total employment as of the reference period (September 2017 for all establishments except hotels and restaurants which had a reference period of July 2017), categorized by sex; nationality status; type of compensation (salaried or wage earner); and terms of contract (open-ended; fixed; or temporary); allowances and benefits.

Form B: Employee Characteristics, Work Hours, Remuneration and Benefits

This form was filled up for each employee as of the end of the reference month and comprises questions on:

- i) employee characteristics, i.e., nationality status, age, sex;
- ii) highest education or training;
- iii) occupation or job title and main description; and
- iv) compensation, benefits and work hours.

The Forms were filled-up and returned using one of the following methods:

a) manual – paper forms mailed to establishments were manually filled, and handdelivered or mailed;





- b) electronic forms were sent via email or downloaded from the ESO website, and returned to the ESO electronically with several layers of electronic security; and
- c) interview some forms were filled up by ESO officers as requested by the establishment based on an interview with the respondent (s).

Most respondents provided their returns or were interviewed by February 2018 (this deadline was extended from the original end-November 2017 deadline in response to requests from businesses).

Households with employees were interviewed by trained ESO enumerators using a simplified version of the OWS form during the period November 2017 to April 2018.

The Portfolio of Civil Service provided the consolidated returns for the central government Ministries and Departments, the Legislature and Judiciary.

3.3 Confidentiality of OWS data

A major concern among respondents was the confidentiality of their employees' data. Hence, employee names were not requested; instead, the responding establishment was asked to use a simple self-administered anonymous ID/numbering system. Establishments were also not identified in their forms by their corporate names but by an anonymous ID system assigned by ESO which is confidential in accordance with the Statistics Law.

As in all surveys of ESO, individual data from OWS 2017 is handled in accordance with the Statistics Law: these are confidential, and should be used exclusively for statistical purpose; they cannot be provided to third parties outside of ESO, and they are exempt from Freedom of Information (FOI) requests. Only the aggregate representation of the data is reported and published via this Report. Multiple layers of security protect the ESO databases from third-party access. ESO computer systems are also protected from malicious activities through cybersecurity screening of transmitted data in accordance with the Cayman Islands Computer Misuse Law (2015 Revision) and the Information and Communications Technology Law (2017 Revision).

3.4 Response rate

Returns to the survey came from 1,466 entities and households of which 1,270 (or 20.2%) supplied the employee data; 196 of the surveyed entities were struck off as they were no longer in business, or had no employees or with self-employed owners. The total number of employees from the returns was 19,215; the response rate and employee count classified by industry³ are

³ The industry classification is based on the International Standard Industry Classification of All Economic Activities (ISIC) (Revision 4). This is the international reference classification of productive activities. Its main purpose is to provide a set of activity categories that can be utilized for the collection and reporting of statistics according to such activities. ISIC has provided guidance to countries in developing national activity classifications and has become an important tool for comparing statistical data on economic activities at the international level.





shown in Table 3.1. Despite the seemingly low overall response to the survey, the number of employees accounted for approximately 47 per cent of the employed labour force as estimated by Labour Force Survey Fall 2017.

3.5 Data processing

The survey returns were processed internally by ESO staff members. Some of the data capture was entered directly into Microsoft Excel and emailed to the ESO. The mailed or hand delivered data was entered by ESO staff using an Excel-based data entry program developed internally by ESO staff. Coding of occupations and industries were also conducted internally using the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) 2008 and the International Standard





Industrial Classification (ISIC) (Rev 4), respectively. Edit checks were conducted using Microsoft Excel. Data were verified through follow-up phone calls and emails to respondents. Verification was also done statistically by comparing actual individual data with the computed mean⁴ for specific occupation and industry categories; outlier returns were then further verified. Some occupation titles were not too clear and required further research.

A merged data file was created with information from all households, public and private sector organizations, and not-for-profit organizations. Indicators were generated from this merged data file using Microsoft Excel functions, and the final tables presented in this Report were prepared using Microsoft Excel.

3.6 Key concepts and definitions used in the tabulation of results

- **a.** Employees respondents were asked to include all employees (full-time and part-time) as of the reference month stated in Section 3.2. Employees are those workers who hold explicit (written or oral) or implicit employment contracts that give them a basic remuneration (i.e. cash or in kind). Such persons typically work under direct supervision of or according to the guidelines set by the owner(s) or persons in the owners' employment. The following are excluded from this definition:
 - Working proprietors;
 - Silent or inactive partners;
 - Non-salaried Board of Directors:
 - Directors and managerial staff who are remunerated predominantly by a share of profits;
 - Unpaid family workers;
 - Consultants and sub-contracted workers not on the company's payroll; and
 - Workers with employment contracts but are on no pay leave (e.g. extended sick leave without pay)

The following are included as employees:

- Salaried directors and management not predominantly remunerated by a share of profits;
- Probationary workers;
- Part-time, casual and temporary workers;
- Paid apprentices and trainees;
- Persons on paid vacation, sick, maternity and other leave;
- Persons working away from the establishment (overseas) but paid by and under its control; and
- Workers with employment contracts but are on required leave with pay. Required leaves are those arising from the employer's decision to investigate or discipline the employee.

⁴ Means, median and the standard deviation were calculated using only employees with reported income; therefore the employees count differs from the employees with reported income.

Employees may have the following terms of contracts:

- Regular employees with open-ended (no time limit) these are regular employees for whom the contracts specify no particular date of termination.
- Regular employees with fixed-term contracts these are employees who have contracts (or succession of contracts) for one year or more as at 30th September 2017, or as at 31st July 2017 for hotels and restaurants. The latter was chosen as it was deemed that the month of September was a low economic activity month for the typical hotel and restaurant.

• Temporary employees including

- employees in seasonal employment who hold explicit or implicit contracts of employment; and
- b) all other employees who hold explicit or implicit contracts of employment which have a duration period of less than one year or which is expected to have a duration period of less than one year.
- **b. Monthly basic earnings** this comprises basic salary and wages <u>including overtime pay</u> during the reference month. Respondents were also asked to include the dollar value of basic salary in kind.
- **c. Total compensation** this comprises basic earnings and other compensation types during the reference month: acting or duty allowance, commission, bonus, gratuities and tips.

3.7 Descriptive statistics

Results of the OWS 2017 are presented in this Report in terms of **monthly basic earnings** and total compensation in CI dollars (\$) using the following statistical descriptions:

- (i) Mean or simple arithmetic average of the samples;
- (ii) The lowest 10 per cent, or lowest decile, represents the value below which the lowest 1/10 of the sample employees are grouped;
- (iii) The 25th percentile represents the dollar value below which the lowest 25 per cent of the samples belong;
- (iv) Median is the dollar value which divides the sample into two equal parts;
- (v) The seventy-fifth (75th) percentile represents the dollar value below which the lowest 75 per cent of the samples belong;
- (vi) Standard deviation: this is shown in some tables; it is a measure of the dispersion of the earnings/total compensation from the mean of the group

3.8 Occupation and industry codes and titles

There are thousands of specific job titles that were submitted by employers, which had to be classified into their <u>closest 4-digit occupation code</u> based on the International Standard Classification of Occupation (2008 Revision). The final count of 4-digit occupation codes included in this Report is 282. A listing of these alphabetically-arranged occupations with their corresponding 4-digit codes appears in Section 7.





Each 4-digit code is associated with a broad, generic occupation title although several occupation titles are in fact included in the code. For example, code 1120 with the broad title "Managing Directors and Chief Executives" includes 64 job/occupation titles such as Heads of Departments, General Manager, Senior Manager, VP Business Development.

Readers should also be careful in interpreting the ILO-provided occupation titles as they may mean differently from the common use of the occupation title. For example, code 6113 has a generic title "Gardeners, Horticultural and Nursery Growers." Although employers may have submitted an employee job title as "gardener," they were provided with a different code 9214 which included "garden labourer" based on the brief job description.

Therefore, data users who are interested in his/her specific occupation's description is encouraged to read the range of occupations that are included in the 4-digit code - this can be downloaded at the ESO website https://www.eso.ky/UserFiles/page docums/files/uploads/international standard classific ation_of.pdf

3.9 Limitations and general caveats

- a. The arithmetic mean and other statistical description includes the earnings and total compensation of full-time and part-time employees.
- b. Tables and narratives which present annual earnings or compensation figures were generated by multiplying the monthly average of the indicators by twelve.
- c. The original design of the OWS was to classify all employees into four nationality status: Caymanian; Non-Caymanian Married to Caymanian/Residency and Employment Rights Certificate (RERC) Holder; Permanent Resident (PR); and Non-Caymanian. However, there were many occupation codes with too few RERC and PR employees to classify further across industries. These were, therefore, combined with the Non-Caymanian group.
- d. Data representing responses of less than three individuals in the survey are suppressed and combined and provided with ISCO codes ending with '999'. Where there are no data available in a table cell, a '-' is placed indicating that no data was submitted, collected or calculated.





4. MAIN FINDINGS: BASIC EARNINGS

4.1 Average basic earnings by industry

The average basic earnings and other statistical description for each occupation appear in Appendix Tables A1, A3, A5, A6, A7, A9 and A11.

The average basic earnings (salary, wages and overtime pay) of surveyed employees was \$3,979 per month or \$47,748 annually. Employees in the industry *Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities* earned the highest with an average of \$6,556 per month, followed by *Financial and Insurance Activities* with \$5,960 per month. On the other hand, the lowest paid employees earned an average of \$924 per month and these were employees of households (domestic helpers, gardeners, etc.).

The monthly median income was \$3,311 or \$39,732 annually.

4.2 Number of employees by average basic earnings




Figure 4.1: Average Annual Basic Earnings and Employee Distribution

There were approximately 11,347 (or 61.5%) employees earning at most the average annual earnings of \$47,748, while some 4,596 employees earned greater than \$59,808 per annum (see Figure 4.1). The number of employees earning the lowest 25th percentile or less (\$22,824 annually) was 4,615, and another 1,847 earned the lowest 10 per cent of average basic earnings (\$12,516 annually).

4.3 Average basic earnings of Caymanian employees

The number of Caymanians employees in the OWS 2017 was 10,398. The industries where most Caymanians were employed were in *Public Administration and Defence* (2,137 employees); *Financial and Insurance Activities* (1,751 employees); *Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities* (mainly *Legal and Accounting*) (1,157 employees); *Transportation and Storage* (916 employees) (see Table 4.2).

Caymanian employees had average earnings of \$50,496 annually or \$4,208 per month. The highest average earnings (\$70,764 annually or \$5,897 per month) are shown among those employed in the *Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (mainly Legal and Accounting)* followed by *Finance and Insurance Activities* with \$66,492 annually or \$5,541 per month (see Table 4.2). Other industries in the top five were: *Utilities (Electricity and Water); Real Estate Activities*; and *Human Health and Social Work Activities (including Medical Services)*.

4.4 Average basic earnings of Non-Caymanians

The average earnings of Non-Caymanians employees was \$44,484 annually or \$3,707 per month across all industries. The range in earnings among Non-Caymanians was wider than that of Caymanians, as the highest income earning sector (*Financial and Insurance Activities*) averaged \$86,820 annually or \$7,235 per month while the lowest earning industry (*Activities of Households as Employers*) averaged \$11,160 annually or \$930 per month

4.5 Average earnings and employment by sex

There was marginal disparity between the average basic earnings of males and females: the average for the former was only higher by \$996 annually. The average annual basic earnings paid to men were \$48,204 while women were paid \$47,208 (see Table 4.2).

The top employment industries for males were: *Public Administration and Defence;* Accommodation and Food Service Activities; and Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (mainly Legal and Accounting). The industries paying the highest average basic





earnings to males were: Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (mainly Legal and Accounting), Finance and Insurance Activities, and Human Health and Social Work Activities.

Female employees were more prevalent in the following industries: Finance and Insurance Activities; Public Administration and Defence; Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (mainly Legal and Accounting); and Accommodation and Food Service Activities. Industries paying the highest average basic earnings to females were: Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (mainly Legal and Accounting), and Finance and Insurance Activities (see Table 4.2).

4.6 Average monthly basic earnings by age

Majority of the surveyed employees (72.9%) were in the age groups between 25 years to 54 years. Employees in the groups between 35 years to 65+ years had average monthly basic earnings that were all higher than the overall mean. The lowest average monthly basic earnings were shown in the age groups 15 to 19 and 20 to 24 (see Table 4.3).

4.7 Occupations with highest and lowest average basic earnings

Table 4.4 shows the top 20 occupations (at 4-digit ISCO) with the highest average earnings led by *judges*; *lawyers*, *attorneys*, *barristers*, *etc.*; *managing directors and chief executives*; *policy and planning managers*; *and Dentists* (see Appendix Table A7 for the basic earnings of each occupation). On the other hand, among the lowest-earning occupations were *musicians*, *singers*





and composers; domestic cleaners and helpers; sweepers and related labourers; hand launderers and pressers; and beauticians and related workers.

4.8 Employment and average basic earnings by firm size

Excluding households as employers, there were 888 firms that submitted employee data for the OWS 2017; of these firms, 48.6 per cent or 432 firms had between 1 and 5 employees; another 163 firms had employee numbers ranging from 6 to 10; and 79 firms had 50 or more employees (see Table 4.5).





The average monthly basic earnings were highest for firms with the number of employees ranging between 11 and 24, followed by firms with 50 or more employees.

Caymanians earned the highest average basic earnings from 'medium-size firms' that is, with employees between 11 and 24. On the other hand, Non-Caymanian had higher average basic earnings from large firms with 50 or more employees.

4.9 Average basic earnings: core government, SAGCs, private sector

The average monthly basic earnings of employees of SAGCs was \$4,383, higher in comparison with those in the private sector (\$3,978) and in core government (\$4,035). As expected, the median for the private sector was much lower compared to the mean, indicating a wide range of basic earnings compared to those in core government and SAGCs.

5. MAIN FINDINGS: TOTAL COMPENSATION

5.1 Average total compensation by industry

The average total compensation and other statistical description for each occupation appear in Appendix Tables A2, A4, A5, A6, A8, A10 and A12.

The average total compensation of employees in this survey which comprised of the average basic earnings (salary, wages and overtime pay) and other compensation (acting/duty allowance, commissions, bonus, gratuities, and tips) stood at \$4,550 per month, or \$54,600 annually (see Table 5.1). Employees in *Professional Scientific and Technical Activities (mainly Legal and Accounting)* had the highest total compensation on the average of \$7,231 per month or \$86,772 annually, followed by *Financial and Insurance Activities* with \$6,555 per month or \$78,660. On average, the lowest paid employees earned \$1,058 per month or \$12,696 annually in the industry *Activities of Households as Employers* (domestic helpers, gardeners, etc.).

5.2 Number of employees by average total compensation




Figure 5.1: Average Annual Total Compensation and Distribution of Employees

There were approximately 12,043 (or 64.6%) employees earning at most the average annual total compensation of \$54,600, while some 4,657 employees earned greater than \$65,184 per annum (see Figure 5.1). The number of employees with average compensation of the lowest 25th percentile (\$28,284 annually) or less was 4,660, and another 1,865 earned the lowest 10 per cent of average total compensation (\$16,560 annually).

5.3 Average total compensation of Caymanians

Caymanians on average had a compensation of \$56,352 annually or \$4,696 per month (see Table 5.2). The highest paying industries in terms of total compensation for Caymanians were: *Real Estate* with \$6,860 per month or \$82,320 annually which is followed by *Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (mainly Legal and Accounting)* with \$6,386 per month or \$76,632, and *Finance and Insurance Activities* with \$5,945 per month or \$71,340 annually. The other top five industries in terms of compensation were *Utilities (Electricity and Water)*, and *Human Health and Social Work Activities* (including medical services).

5.4 Average total compensation of Non-Caymanians

The average earnings of Non-Caymanians employees was \$52,548 annually or \$4,379 per month across all industries. The range in compensation among Non-Caymanians was wider than that of Caymanians, as the highest income earning sector (*Financial and Insurance Activities*) averaged \$100,608 annually or \$8,384 per month while the lowest earning industry (*Activities of Households as Employers*) averaged \$12,852 annually or \$1,071 per month.

5.5 Average total compensation and employment by sex

The average annual total compensation paid to male employees was \$56,484 while female employees were paid \$52,752 (see Table 5.2). The industries paying the highest average total compensation to men were: *Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (Legal and Accounting), Finance and Insurance Activities, and Human Health and Social Work Activities.* Industries paying the highest average compensation to women were: *Real Estate, Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities (Legal and Accounting), and Finance and Insurance Activities.*





5.6 Average total compensation by age

Employees in the groups between 35 years to 65+ years had average total compensations that were all above the overall mean. The lowest average monthly total compensations were earned by those in the age groups 15 to 19 and 20 to 24 (see Table 5.3).

5.7 Occupations with highest and lowest average total compensation

Table 5.4 shows the top 20 occupation (at 4-digit ISCO) with the highest average total compensation led by *judges*; *web and multimedia developers*; *dentists*; *specialist medical practitioners*; *and managing directors and chief executives* (see Appendix Table A8 for the compensation statistics for each occupation). On the other hand, among the lowest-earning occupations were *musicians*, *singers and composers*; *domestic cleaners and helpers*; *child care workers*; *ships' deck crews and related workers*; *and field crop and vegetable workers*.

5.8 Average total compensation by firm size

Caymanian and Non-Caymanian employees earned the highest average total compensation from 'medium-size firms' that is, with employees between 11 and 24. Among these firms, Caymanians had an average total compensation of \$5,394 while Non-Caymanian earned an average of \$4,766, per month (See Table 5.5).

5.9 Average compensation: core government, SAGCs, private sector

The average total compensation of employees of SAGCs was \$4,905, higher in comparison with those in the private sector (\$4,663) and in core government (\$4,311). As expected, the median for the private sector is much lower compared to the mean, indicating a wider range of compensation compared to those in core government and SAGCs.

Table 5.9 shows a sample of the occupations with their respective data across the three types of employers. It shows, for example, that average compensation of IT Service Managers (code 1330) were almost the same in the private sector but comparatively lower in the core government.

6. PROVISION OF ALLOWANCES AND BENEFITS




Figure 6.1: Benefits and Allowances

Figure 6.1 shows the percentage of employers (excluding households as employers) who indicated providing the various benefits and allowances.

Almost 95 percent of the 875 establishments who submitted data on allowances and benefits as part of the OWS 2017 offered health insurance to employees.

Paid vacation and sick leaves were pervasive among establishments with 92.8 percent and 92.2 percent provision rates, respectively. Three out of every four establishments offered employees compassionate and maternity leaves while paternity leaves had a lower provision rate.

Those providing pension coverage made up approximately 92.2 per cent of the respondent employers.

Among the employee allowances, training and education were given by 47.3 per cent of establishments, followed by telephone allowance (37.1%); transportation (29.1%); and housing allowance (14.3%).
