The Cayman Islands Quality of Life Survey Report

Welcome

How should wealth and happiness be measured?
Is wealth best expressed as dollars and cents or through the meaningfulness of experiences?
What is a good balance between financial security and a high quality of life? Is happiness the result of a high quality of life?

This report examines the changing relationship between wealth, prosperity, and quality of life as a measurable concept. It is based primarily on a simple random, representative survey of 1,722 households (3,330 persons age 18+) across all districts in the Cayman Islands. The data collected provided essential insights and a narrative of how the Cayman Islands residents communicate their priorities and redefine the meaning of a good quality of life.

4. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Quality of life score.** The Cayman Islands' quality of life (QOL) was assessed at 84.0%, 1.1% higher than the Fall 2024 survey. This score is based on a comprehensive assessment of various quality-of-life factors. Residents ranked their health and wellness as the most essential quality of life at 35.8 percent, even higher than a year ago by 1.3%. Followed by employment and job quality (17.6%), material living conditions (13.9%), economic and physical safety (13.1%), and leisure and social activities (10.2%). The natural and living environment had the lowest relative importance (9.5%); see Table 1. The overall QOL score among Caymanians was 82.9%, an improvement of 1.2% from a year ago.
- Health and wellness.** The most significant component, health and wellness, had a satisfaction score of 85.2%, reflecting an upward improvement by 0.4%. All components of health and wellness had scores in the 80s, except waiting time for health services, which was 72.6%, albeit 1.7% higher than a year ago. Mental wellness satisfaction (85.4%) increased by 1.0%, which helped propel health and wellness. Caymanians scored their health and wellness at 83.7% higher than the overall average, up 0.8%. However, although most persons were satisfied with the improvement in waiting times for health services at public hospitals and clinics, dissatisfaction was 19.2% and 23.8% among Caymanians, an improvement of 3.2% from a year ago.
- Employment and job quality.** This component scored 83.5%, representing an improvement of 3.0% relative to the Fall 2024 survey. The proportion of satisfied Caymanians under this rubric was 82.0%, up 2.4%. The category benefits from fewer persons being classified as part-time under-employment, although the number of persons outside the labour force who are available for work but not seeking work (disgruntled workers) remained

relatively stable. In addition, more people were satisfied that their income covers the standard of living, while their employable skills (up 1.7%) have improved. The improvement in Caymanian satisfaction stemmed mainly from higher income exceeding the standard of living and higher employment.

4. **Material living conditions.** An estimated 85.4% satisfaction score for households, higher by 0.6% relative to Fall 2024. Caymanians' scores also increased by 0.7% to 85.5%. Overall, living in overcrowded housing decreased, fewer families had bills in arrears, and fewer households were disconnected from household services, which contributed to the score. The score for Caymanians was 0.7% higher, at 84.0%, mainly because fewer Caymanian households had bills in arrears and household services disconnected.
5. **Economic and physical safety.** Economic and physical safety scored 87.1%, up from 85.7% a year ago. Self-assessed poverty decreased from 5.6% in Fall 2024 to 4.7% in Fall 2025, and food insecurity was rated lower at 4.5%, down from 6.8% in Fall 2024. The high score reflects that more respondents expressed satisfaction with a higher standard of living and higher income. Residents' feelings of safety moved from 80.8% a year ago to 85.1% in 2025. For Caymanians, economic and physical safety was 1.8% higher at 86.1%, on account of higher income and greater satisfaction with their standard of living.
6. **Leisure and social activities.** Resident satisfaction was 81.4%, up 0.5% from higher work-life balance, social cohesion, and connections, which measure the interconnectedness of different social groups within the Cayman Islands, and lower levels of loneliness. For Caymanians, the satisfaction score was 80.9%, a slight improvement from the year before. Episodes of loneliness decreased to 23.6% among all residents, with 19.8% among Caymanians.

- 7. Natural and living environment.** Satisfaction with the natural and living environment increased from 75.0% in Fall 2024 to 76.4% in Fall 2025. Respondents' sentiments improved on living and environmental preservation (up 2.6%), natural disasters and emergencies (up 1.3%), household disaster preparedness (up 0.7%), and economic and social development (up 1%). Similarly, Caymanian respondents' sentiments were 1.7% higher at 74.9%, the strongest upward movers were satisfaction with natural disaster management, household disaster preparedness, and economic and social development, including investment in infrastructure, human capital development, and road transportation. Despite the improvements, Caymanians showed strong dissatisfaction with efforts in environmental preservation, road transportation, human capital development, and economic and social development.

HAPPINESS SCORES among the Districts

Sentiments expressed by residents across the various districts are not necessarily directly about their district of residence, as most survey questions asked about their personal circumstances and the Cayman Islands in general, rather than a specific district.

- 8. West Bay:** The West Bay district satisfaction score was 87.7%, the highest among the districts. As shown in the happiness scores table (pg. 4), the district had the highest scores in 4 of the 6 assessment areas and was second in the remaining 2. This indicates that West Bay had some of the highest levels of satisfaction sentiments in the quality-of-life survey. The main sources of dissatisfaction were neighbourhood cultural differences, unfriendly neighbourhoods, and a lack of support for entrepreneurship.

9. **East End:** The East End district scored 87.2%. Overcrowded households were highest in the district, and 51.6% of Caymanians were concerned about travel time on the roads. Other sources of dissatisfaction included adult education and lifelong learning, as well as entrepreneurial and small business support. Nonetheless, they were generally satisfied. East Enders were the most satisfied with leisure and social activities, as well as with the natural and living environment.

10. **George Town:** The main areas of concern that hamper a higher happiness score than the 86.5% achieved include: the need for higher support for entrepreneurship and small businesses, adult education and lifelong learning, road users' knowledge and training, household recycling practices, and green spaces and walkable communities. Concerns also include household current income, which is insufficient to cover their standard of living.

11. **Sister Islands:** The Sister Islands scored 83.8%, although overcrowded households were one of their main concerns. They were generally dissatisfied with entrepreneurial and small-business support, access to financial resources, investment in infrastructure, low personal disaster funds, recycling practices on the Islands, and episodes of loneliness.

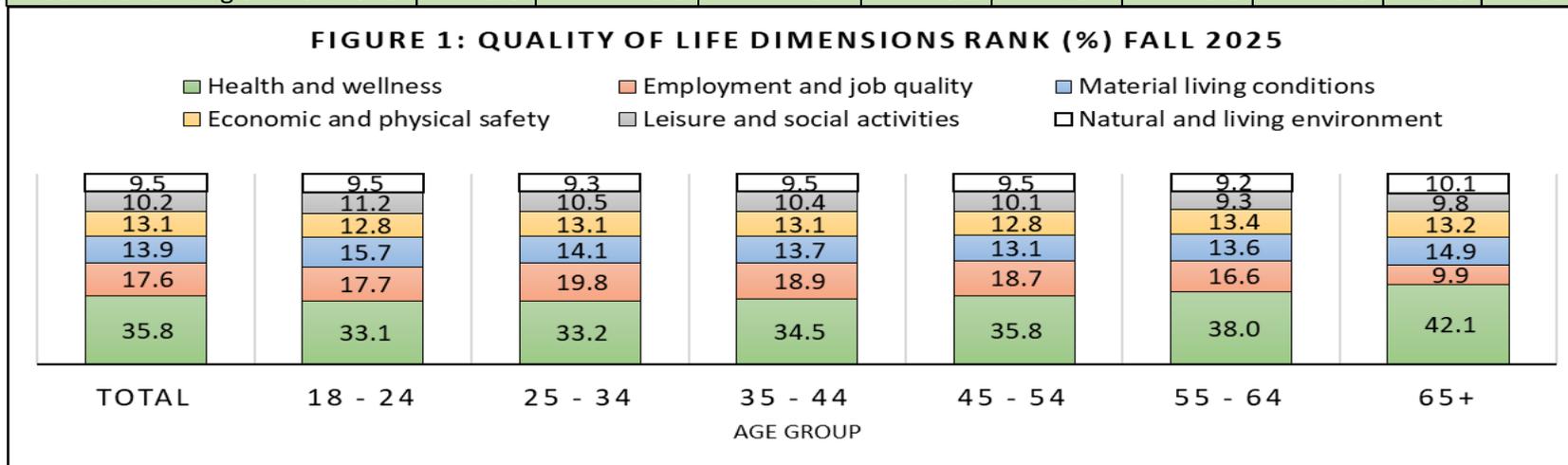
12. **Bodden Town:** A satisfaction score of 81.7% was achieved by Bodden Town residents. Some of the concerns included: wait times for health services at public hospitals and clinics; lack of neighbourhood social cohesion, green spaces and walkable communities; travel times on roads; low household reserve disaster funds; and support for small businesses.

13. **North Side:** With an overall score of 81.0%, respondents from North Side expressed strong dissatisfaction with the waiting times for health services at public hospitals and clinics. In addition, 3 in 10 people living in North Side do not feel physically safe in their community or elsewhere in the Cayman Islands. Despite low crime in North Side itself, 36.5% believe crime has increased elsewhere in the Cayman Islands, and 41.6% believe police protection has decreased throughout the Cayman Islands. Other dissatisfactions expressed included disaster management, disaster preparedness, entrepreneurial and small-business support, and adult education and lifelong learning. About 75% of Caymanian North Siders expressed dissatisfaction with travel times on the roads. Regarding Cayman's social and economic development, 48.2% were satisfied with current trends.

Dimensions Ranking of the Quality of Life.

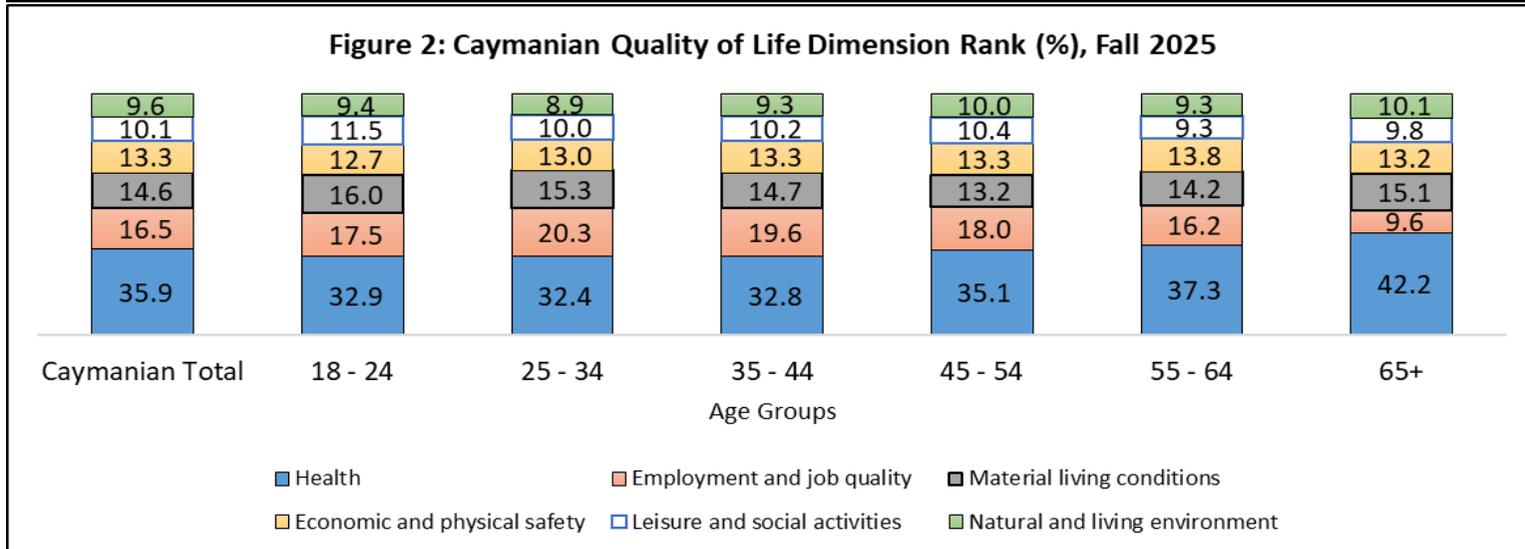
The QOL ranking was derived from the Fall 2025 survey. The survey results are similar to those of the Fall 2024; the Fall 2025 survey results are as follows:

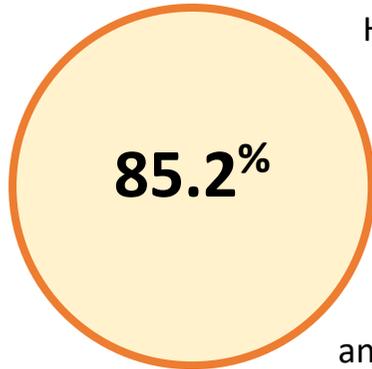

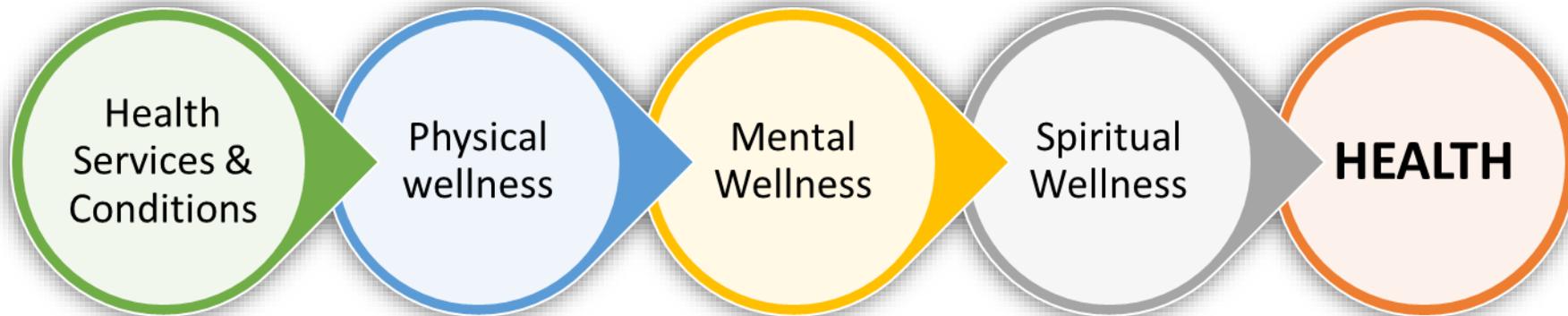


5. HEALTH AND WELLNESS



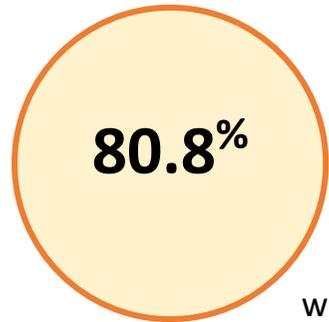
Health is not just the absence of disease but a critical enabler that allows individuals to live life to the fullest. It is shaped by how individuals grow, live, learn, work, and age. Emotional well-being and a positive outlook are key indicators of how people perceive and experience quality of life. Reliable access to timely and appropriate health care provides peace of mind and promotes positive health outcomes. The survey captures data on self-perceived health' (SPH), a measure of physical well-being and a tool for predicting mortality and chronic disease incidence. Studies have shown that this self-assessment is a reliable indicator of chronic diseases, functional ability, and psychological well-being. To this end, overall health is evaluated and scored using the following

categories.



The overall health score was **85.2 percent**, calculated as the simple average of the sub-components: health services and conditions (80.8%), physical wellness (81.6%), mental wellness (85.4%), and spiritual wellness (92.9%).

Health Services and Conditions



Quality in healthcare encompasses the degree to which healthcare services meet the expectations and needs of patients and healthcare providers. As populations age, so does the workforce, creating a growing need for healthcare and healthcare workers to maintain quality healthcare. In response to the Survey question: *On the last occasion you went to the public hospital/clinic, how satisfied were you with the staff's competence, the overall cleanliness of the facility, the friendliness and courtesies of the staff, the treatment/medicine prescribed, and the waiting time for services?* The weighted satisfaction scores¹ of the Fall QOL survey's average weighted score for health services and conditions was 80.8 percent (see Table 4.1). This is an average of all weighted response components in Table 4.1. The satisfaction score averaged 85.1 percent, with all components achieving higher satisfaction than the weighted response, except for waiting time for service.

Respondents to the QOL survey ranked services and conditions at public hospitals and/or clinics on staff competence, facility cleanliness, staff friendliness and courtesy, treatment and prescribed medicine, and waiting time for service (on the day of the appointment and for appointment booking). As exhibited in Table 4.1, the highest weighted response satisfaction was the overall cleanliness of the facility (84.5%). This was followed by the friendliness and courtesy of staff (82.6%), skills and competence of staff (82.5%), prescribed treatment/medicine (81.9%), and waiting time for service (72.6%). When only the satisfaction score (very satisfied and satisfied) is considered, the overall score was 85.1 percent, and all the scores were in the high 80s except for the waiting time for service, which was 68.9 percent.

The weighted average score of Caymanian respondents for services and conditions at public hospitals and/or clinics was 79.7 percent. Except waiting time for service (see Table 4.2), most components were rated higher than the overall ranking of all residents.

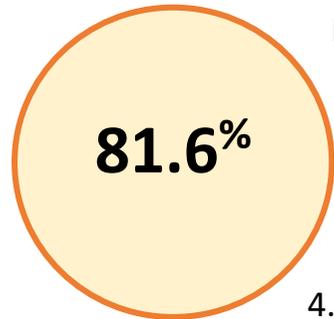
Responses indicate that, across the districts, residents of the Sister Islands were most satisfied with the services and conditions of public hospitals and clinics (83.1%). They are followed by residents of West Bay (83.7%), George Town (80.9%), East End (80.3%), North Side (80.4%), and Bodden Town (76.9%) (see Table 4.3). The district scores represent satisfaction ratings for all public hospitals and clinics, not necessarily the location where services were rendered.

Using the satisfaction score (satisfied and very satisfied), the highest would still be the Sister Islands (89.5%), followed by East End, George Town, West Bay, North Side, and Bodden Town.

Physical Wellness



Physical wellness involves recognising the need for physical activity, healthy foods, and rest to help prevent illness and injury, or to manage chronic health conditions. Physical health enables people to perform everyday activities without undue fatigue or physical strain. In response to “*How satisfied are you with your Physical Health?*” on average, 81.6 percent of respondents were generally satisfied, using the weighted average satisfaction. The overall satisfaction score was 85.3 percent; among Caymanians, 79.2 percent; and among non-Caymanians, 92.8 percent (see Table 4.4). Generally, male respondents (88.0%) were more satisfied with their physical health than females (82.7%).

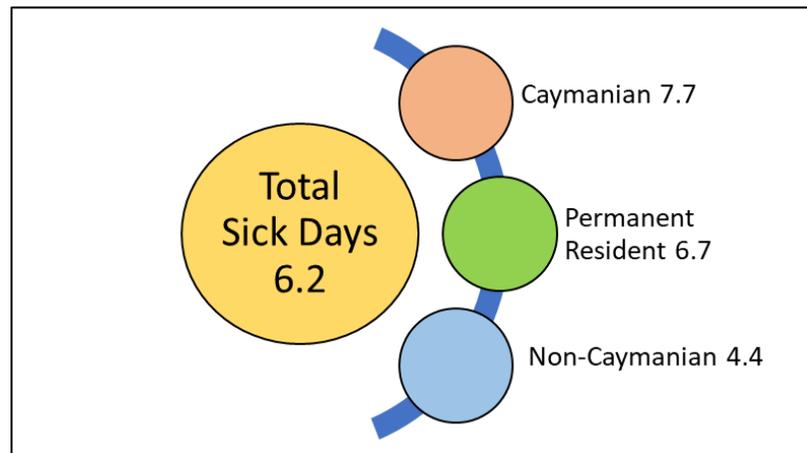

Among the districts, respondents in West Bay had the highest rate of physical health satisfaction at 88.2 percent (see Table 4.5). This was followed by George Town (87.1%), East End (83.4%), Bodden Town (80.9%), and North Side (79.1%). The Sister Islands had the lowest satisfaction rate of 74.0 percent. In response to the question “*In the past year, how many days were you absent from work due to*



illness?”, on average, respondents (employed persons) were away from work 6.2 sick days (or 2.5% of working days²) a year. Caymanians had 7.7 sick days (3.1%), permanent residents had 6.7 sick days (2.7%), and non-Caymanians had 4.4 sick days (1.8% of working days), the lowest.

The productive work days for the employed labour market were 97.5 percent after accounting for the 2.5 percent of unproductive work days (sick days).

Mental wellness

Mental wellness, a key determinant of job satisfaction and productivity, is a state of well-being in which an individual realizes their abilities, copes with the everyday stresses of life, works productively and fruitfully, and contributes to the community. It

encompasses the emotional, physical, spiritual, and mental aspects of the self. Research on well-being underscores that promoting positive mental health and alleviating chronic challenges such as anxiety and depression are significant avenues for enhancing quality of life. In response to the survey question, *“In general, would you say that your mental health is... {excellent, good, fair, poor, or very poor}”*, respondents' weighted average rating for their mental health was 85.4 percent (see Table 4.6), and the satisfaction score was 86.9 percent. Among female respondents, the mental health positive response (85.2%) (excellent & good) was lower than that of their male (88.6%) counterparts. Approximately 2.4 percent of

females rated their mental health as poor or very poor (see Table 4.6). Non-Caymanian respondents rated their mental health at 92.9 out of 100. In contrast, Caymanians rated their mental health at 81.1 percent. Alternatively, a higher proportion of Caymanians rated their mental health as poor or very poor (4.0%).

Among West Bay respondents, 89.9 percent rated their mental health as excellent or good (see Table 4.7). Among North Side respondents, 4.9 percent rated their mental health as poor and very poor (see Table 4.7).

Of the estimated 1,144 respondents with self-rated “poor” mental health, 25.6

percent are within the 25-34 age group, while another 16.1 percent are 65+ (see Table 4.8). Of the estimated 549 respondents with “very poor” mental health, 18.2 percent were from the 18 to 24 age group, 16.1 percent were from the 45 to 54 age group, and another 26.1 percent were from the 65+ age group.

As shown in Table 4.9.1, among employed respondents, 43.9 percent rated their mental health as “excellent,” 42.4 percent as “good,” and 9.9 percent as “fair.” Among unemployed respondents, 70.6 percent were rated as “excellent” or “good”, and 74.5 percent for persons not in the labour force. The highest proportion of “poor” and “very poor” mental health was among unemployed or not in the labour force, with 6.0 percent and 4.2 percent, respectively.

Of the persons who reported “poor” mental health, 65.8 percent were employed, 6.1 percent were unemployed, and 28.1 percent were not in the labour force (see Table 4.9.2). Relative to the reported “poor” mental health displayed in Table

4.9.2, the share of persons reporting “very poor” mental health was 4.7 percent, who were unemployed, and another 30.1 percent were not in the labour force.

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), morbidity and mortality weekly report, “loneliness and isolation are indicators of social disconnection that can lead to poor mental and physical health outcomes, including increased risk for heart disease, stroke, dementia, type 2 diabetes, depression, anxiety, and premature mortality. Loneliness and lack of social connection are widespread and pose a threat to mental and physical health.³”

Responses to the QOL survey revealed that 27.8 percent of persons who reported loneliness as “often/always” also reported “poor” mental health, and 37.5 percent reported “very poor” mental health (see Table 4.10).

Persons responding with “some of the time”, 25.3 percent of respondents reported “fair” to “poor” mental health. Most of the people reporting “excellent” mental health also reported “hardly ever” (20.5%) and never (50.4%) being lonely. Persons reporting “good” mental health also reported “hardly ever” (21.4%) and “never” (39.4%) being lonely (see Table 4.10). As shown in Table 4.10B, 745 persons are deemed at risk. These are lonely people with poor mental health, who account for about 1.0 percent of the population 18 years and older.

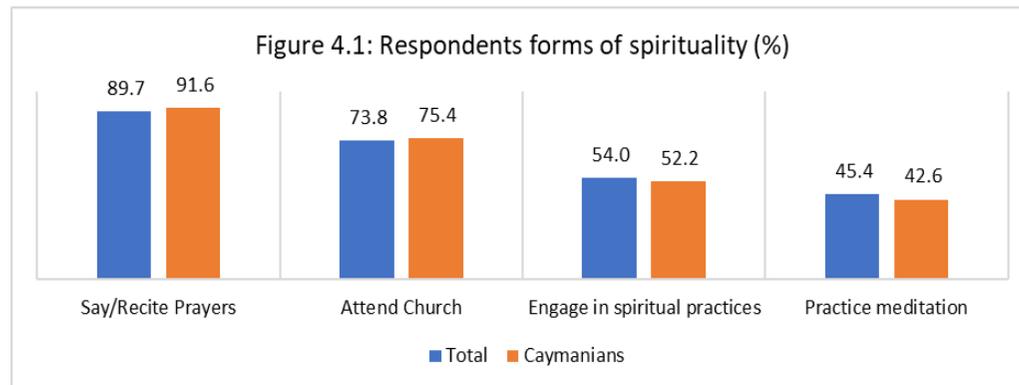
Spiritual wellness

Spiritual wellness encompasses a sense of purpose and meaning in life, including one's morals and ethics, which may or may not involve religious activities. Spirituality is expressed in many forms, whether tied to a religion, a moral philosophy, or an inherent sense of connectedness with something greater than oneself. Therefore, intense spirituality means contemplating one's purpose in life, achieving greater mindfulness of individual impact on others, living in harmony with one's surroundings, and balancing personal needs. In response to the survey question: *"How often do you say/recite prayers, attend church/religious gatherings, engage in spiritual healing/practices, and practice meditation?"*

89.7 percent of respondents say or recite prayers, 73.8 percent attend church (including online) and religious gatherings, 54.0 percent engage in spiritual healing⁴, and 45.4 percent practice some form of meditation (see Table 4.11).



An estimated 7.1 percent of respondents did not engage in any form of spirituality. Therefore, 92.9 percent of persons are involved in at least one form of spirituality (see Figure 4.1).

⁴ Spiritual practices is a systematic and purposeful intervention performed by one or more people to help each other, focused on improving their condition. Ways to enhance spiritual health include connecting with the faith community, volunteering or helping others, practicing yoga, meditating, spending time in nature, focusing on hobbies, and speaking with a chaplain or a trusted person.

6. EMPLOYMENT AND JOB QUALITY

The Cayman's economy should work better for everyone. To achieve this, businesses, workers, investors, and the government should work together to create good jobs that allow workers to thrive and benefit.

Workers thrive when quality jobs are created that value employees' work, contribute to the organisation's goals, offer a voice in the workplace, provide opportunities to learn and grow, and allow for financial security and future planning. It also includes wages to cover living expenses and build wealth, safe and welcoming working conditions, predictable work hours, and benefits such as health insurance, paid leave, and retirement savings. Improving job quality requires better communication and relationships among stakeholders to ensure that more jobs in the local economy

are of good quality.



The overall satisfaction was **83.6 percent**, averaged from the subcomponents above.

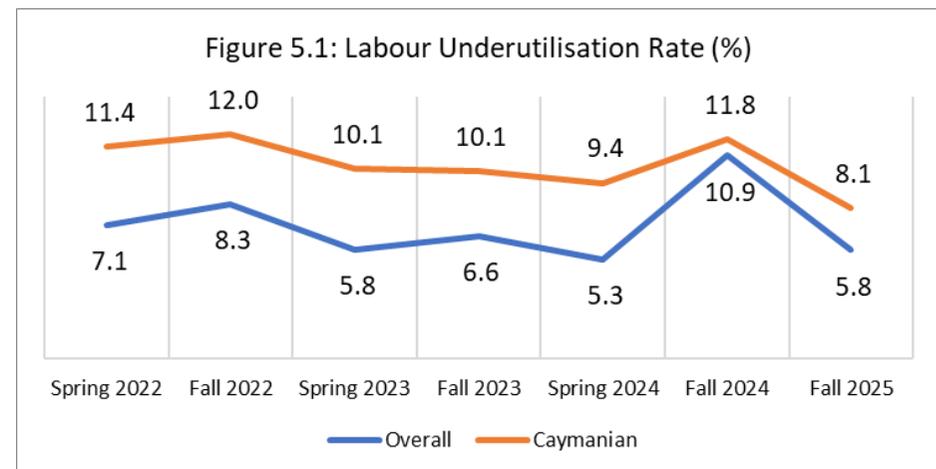
Employment Opportunities and Employability

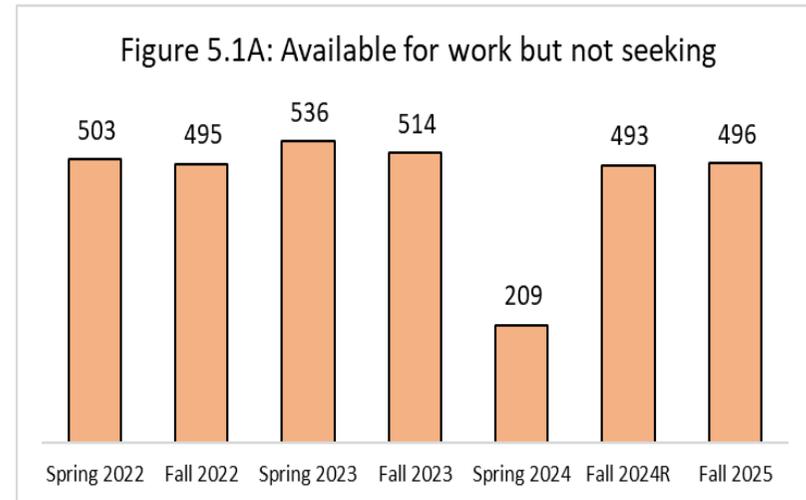
Employment Opportunities and Employability: Employability is the lifelong process of acquiring experience, new knowledge, purposeful learning, and skills that improve marketability and enhance the potential to obtain and maintain employment through various shifts in the labour market. It is based on a set of individual characteristics. It is not equivalent to employment but is a prerequisite for gainful employment. Essentially, employability is the relative ability to find and stay employed,

as well as to make successful transitions from one job to the next, within the same company or field, or to a new one, at the discretion of the individual and as circumstances or economic conditions may dictate. The employment opportunity score was **94.2 percent** [100 – LUR% (6%)], derived from the labour underutilisation rate (LUR). This gives an estimate of the overall job creation in the economy relative to the available labour supply.

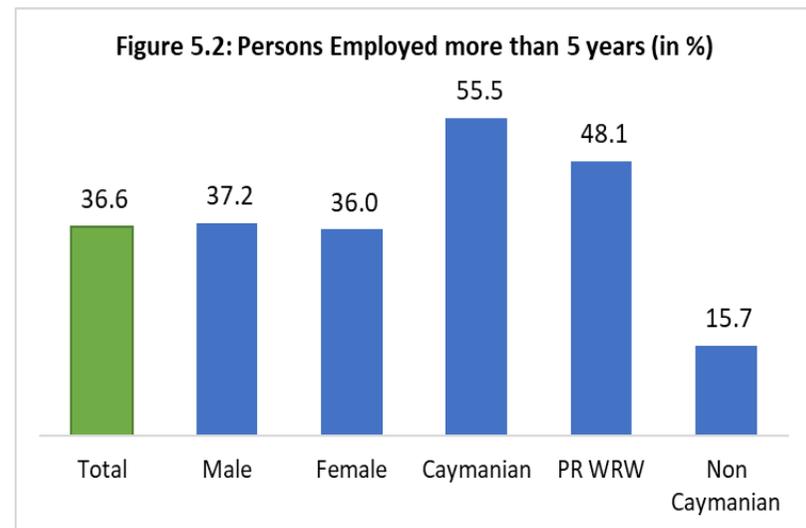
Labour Underutilisation Rate (LUR). The LUR indicates the number of persons classified as unemployed, plus those classified as part-time under-employed, and those outside the labour force who are available for work but not seeking work (disgruntled workers) as a percentage share of the total labour force. This shows mismatches between labour supply and demand, resulting in an unmet employment need among the population.



In the Cayman Islands, the labour underutilisation rate ranged from 5.3 to 10.9 percent (see Figure 5.1). In Spring 2025, it improved to 5.8 percent following the previous year’s 10.9 percent. This indicates a labour utilisation rate of **94.2 percent** in Fall 2025. The LUR for Caymanians improved to 8.1 percent in Fall 2025, from 11.8 percent in Fall 2024. This suggested that the labour market had less unused labour capacity in Fall 2025, suggesting fewer people were available for jobs. Among Caymanians, the number of people who want to work but are not actively seeking a job declined to 496. These are persons included in the labour underutilization count but excluded from the unemployment count.

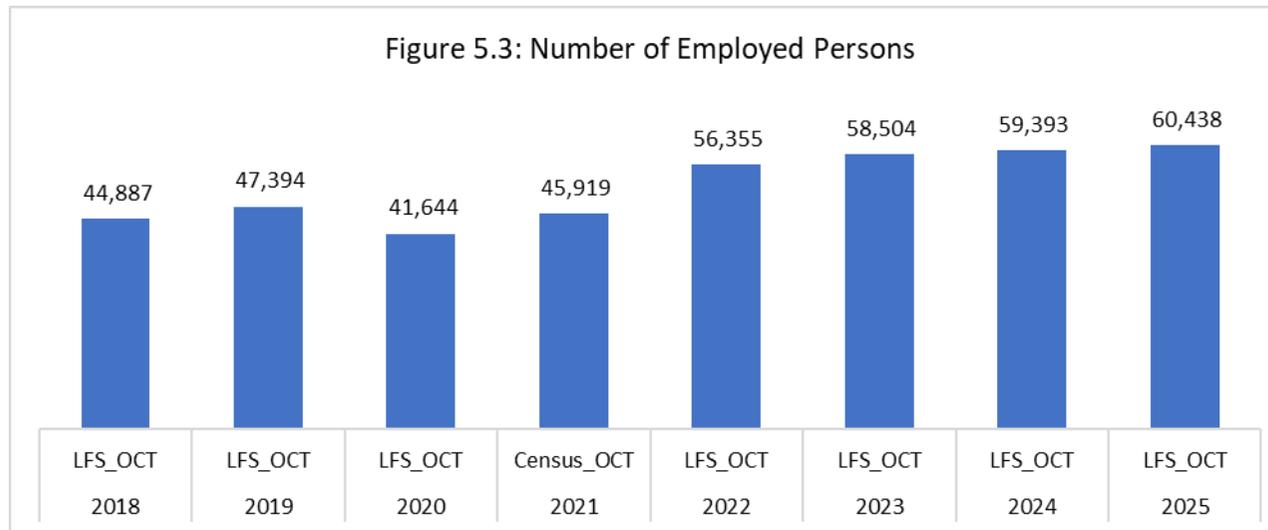


Length of Employment. Long-tenured employees have worked for a company for more than 5 years, while short-tenured employees have worked there for less than 5 years. Fair and competitive compensation packages play a crucial role in employee retention. Employability encompasses the ability to find and retain jobs. In addition to remuneration, employees value opportunities for career growth and professional development, workplace recognition, work-life balance, meaningful and challenging work, job security, strong company values and culture, and supportive management and co-workers. In Fall 2025, the share of **residents (36.6%)** and **Caymanians (55.5%)** spent more than five (5) years at the same

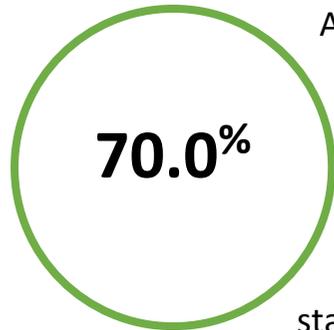


place of employment (see Figure 5.2). The transient nature of the non-Caymanian labour market impacted the overall low job retention rate.

Job Creation. Over the six years from Fall 2021 to Fall 2025, approximately **18,794 jobs** were created, averaging **3,759 per year**. Creating jobs is crucial, but developing quality or good jobs is more essential. Quality jobs pay well enough to allow for a reasonable living standard, provide stability and security, and provide opportunities for career progression. Over time, good jobs equip workers with opportunities for self-development, responsibility, purpose, and fulfilment. Alternatively, some ‘low-quality jobs’ come with a range of social and economic costs, which have social consequences like exclusion, fractured families, addiction, and crime, as well as reduced mental and physical well-being.



Job Quality.



A quality job is one in which an employee's work is valued and allowed to contribute to the organisation's goals. These jobs offer employees a voice in the workplace, opportunities to learn and grow, and allow for financial security and future planning. Other defining characteristics of a quality job include wages to cover living expenses and build wealth, safe and welcoming working conditions, predictable work hours, and benefits such as health insurance, paid leave, and retirement savings. Improving job quality requires fostering better communication and enhancing stakeholder relationships to ensure more quality jobs in the local economy. To assess quality jobs, the

percentage of employees with income above their self-assessed standard of living costs was compared, as shown in the table. The job quality score (70.0%), the average income relative to standard of living costs (61.0%), and the job satisfaction survey (79.0%).

Individual Total Income vs. Standard of Living Costs. In the quality of life and labour force surveys, respondents were asked, *“What is the estimated monthly cost that you think is necessary to maintain your standard of living?”* and to provide their total income (employed or otherwise), which was compared. The overall comparison revealed that **61.0 percent** of persons' total income exceeds their standard of living costs. The share of Males (66.4%) with income exceeding their standard of living costs was higher than that of females (55.8%). Employed persons with an income-to-standard-of-living gap were 37.1 percent, unemployed persons had a gap of 72.7 percent, and persons not in the labour force had a gap of 47.1 percent.

Current Income Covers the Standard of Living. Respondents were asked, *“Is your current/shared income enough to cover the current standard of living?”* In response, 68.5 percent of persons said that their current income covered their standard

of living, with males at 71.7 percent and females at 65.3 percent. For Caymanians, it was 63.5 percent while for non-Caymanians, it was 73.4 percent.

Job Satisfaction.

How satisfied are you with your occupation/job? Generally, job satisfaction occurs when employees feel they have a stable job, room to grow in their careers, and a good balance between work and personal life. In other words, employees are happy because the work meets their standards. Several studies conclude that employee satisfaction can stimulate positive energy, creativity, and motivation to succeed, and good job security makes people happier. Therefore, satisfied employees can work towards long-term goals and feel a greater sense of purpose. The Job weighted satisfaction score was 79.0 percent (see Table 5.1).

Overall, 82.2 percent of respondents expressed satisfaction (very satisfied and satisfied) with their occupation/job (see Table 5.1). Among Caymanian respondents, 80.4 percent are satisfied, with more males than females reporting job satisfaction.

Across the districts, the Sister Islands recorded the highest percentage of satisfied (very satisfied and satisfied) respondents with their jobs, at 85.1 percent (see Table 5.2). George Town residents were the second-happiest with their jobs, at 84.4 percent. The North Side

district had the lowest percentage of respondents expressing job satisfaction, at 72.3 percent, while 12.5 percent reported dissatisfaction or very dissatisfaction (see Table 5.2).

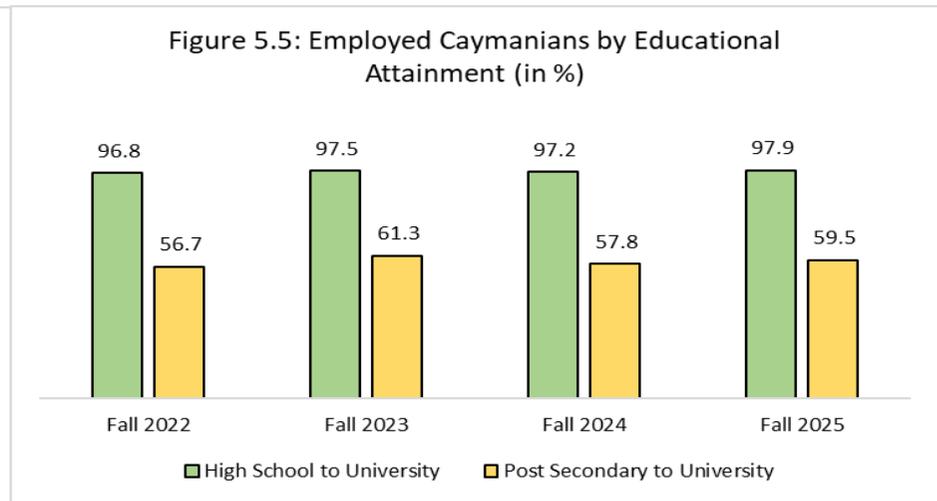
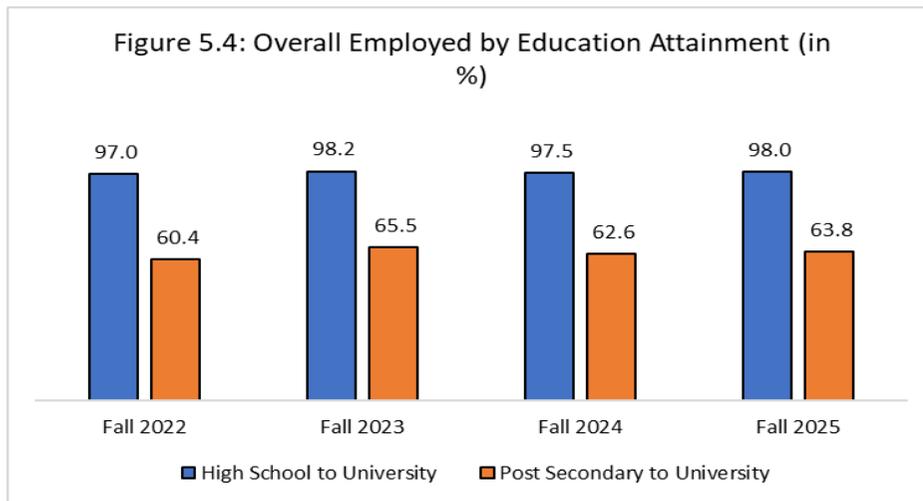

Employable Skills

Employment opportunities are available for individuals’ seeking jobs in specific fields or industries, taking into account factors such as job market conditions, required skills, and career growth prospects. Generally, a decent/good job ensures employees can work and live with dignity, earn enough money to avoid poverty, and have employment rights. In addition to educational requirements, good jobs help build vital skills, earn stable incomes, and contribute to economic growth. In a thriving economy, the changing job market must be characterised by high-quality jobs, worker security, extensive job training, and a good work-life balance. To this end, employee skills were examined. The overall score of **86.7 percent** is a simple average of satisfaction scores from educational attainment (98.0%), relevant employment skills (91.5%), qualification for the current job (95.0%), salary and benefit package (72.2%), and career progression (76.7%).



Education and Training. For the Cayman Islands, post-High combined with university education as a proportion of the employed labour force increased from 62.6 percent in Fall 2024 to 63.8 percent in Fall 2025, indicating that education and training are instrumental in embracing available job opportunities. Education levels from high school to university as a share of the employed labour market declined marginally, from 97.5 percent in Spring 2024 to **98.0 percent in Fall 2025** (see Figure 5.4). Among Caymanians, the movement was similar. The labour force share of persons with high school and university education declined slightly from 97.2 percent to 97.9 percent between Fall 2024 and Fall 2025 (see Figure 5.5).

Relevant Employment Skills⁵. *How closely is your current job related to your education, training, and experience?*

Approximately **91.5 percent** of employed persons felt that their qualifications matched (exactly—63.3%; closely—16.3%, and somewhat—11.9%) their current job. For Caymanians, it was 92.3 percent (exactly—62.9%; closely—16.4% and somewhat—13.0%).

Qualification for Current Job⁶. *Considering your education, training, and work experience, how would you rate your qualifications for the current job?* Approximately 18.1 percent of employed respondents felt overqualified for their current job, while 77.9 percent felt exactly right for it. **Therefore, 95.0 percent of employed workers were either exactly matched or overqualified for their current jobs.** For Caymanians, it was 78.8 percent an exact match with 16.7 percent overqualified. Among the employed persons, 2.3 percent were underqualified for their jobs; for Caymanians, it was 2.7 percent.

Salary and Benefits Package. As part of an employee benefits package, a remuneration package is the total compensation offered to an employee for their services or work. It may include a base salary, additional cash, and non-cash incentives (such as flexible work arrangements and other benefits). As depicted in Table 5.3, 66.0 percent of respondents were satisfied (very satisfied and satisfied) with their remuneration package, and Caymanians were marginally less satisfied at 64.3 percent. About 18.9 percent of all respondents were dissatisfied (dissatisfied and very dissatisfied) with the salary and benefits, and Caymanians had marginally higher dissatisfaction at 21.9 percent.

Respondents from Bodden Town were the least satisfied with their pay and benefit package. The most satisfied were West Bay residents, with a 75.5 percent satisfaction rate. Generally, males were more satisfied than females, and non-Caymanians were more satisfied than Caymanians (see Table 5.4).

Career Progression. Career progression encompasses personal or professional growth and advancement, often characterized by skill development, increased responsibilities, and expanded roles. It may not necessarily include a job promotion, which involves moving to a higher position or rank within an organization, usually accompanied by a change in title, salary, and authority. Career progression is essential for achieving career goals and overall professional and personal development, and it is accompanied by benefits (satisfaction, new opportunities, and a hastened timeframe for goal achievement).

To assess respondents' sentiments regarding their career progression, the survey question was: *“How satisfied are you with your career progression?”* Approximately 76.7 percent of respondents were satisfied (satisfied and very satisfied) with their career progression, and another 16.0 percent were indifferent. Respondents' dissatisfaction rate (dissatisfied and very dissatisfied) was 9.0 percent. Among Caymanians, the satisfaction rate was 73.5 percent, with 9.6 percent dissatisfied (see Table 5.5). More females (10.2%) were dissatisfied with their career progression than males (7.8%).

Across the districts, the satisfaction score for career progression was strongest among persons living in East End, at 80.7 percent, followed by George Town (78.4%), West Bay (77.0%), North Side (66.7%), Bodden Town (66.9%), and the Sister Islands (62.3%) (see Table 5.6).

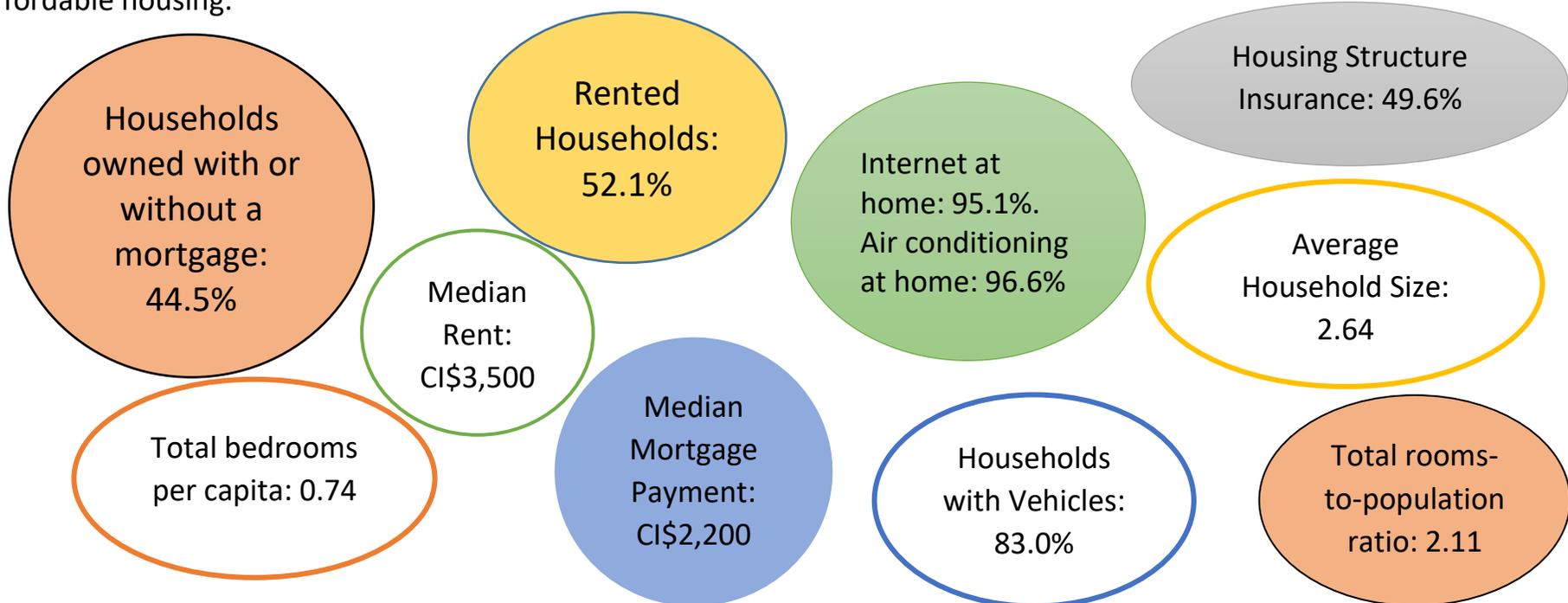

7. MATERIAL LIVING CONDITIONS

Material living conditions refer to an individual's living standard, expressed through three sub-dimensions: household income, household debt, household consumption, and housing conditions.

Housing conditions. Poor living conditions are usually associated with substandard and unsanitary housing, lack of access to basic amenities such as clean water and proper sanitation, overcrowding, and unhealthy environments. The leading cause of these problems worldwide is the severe lack of affordable housing.



Housing needs and overcrowding

In Fall 2025, the total number of households⁷ were estimated at 34,182, at an average of 2.64 persons per household⁸. Bodden Town had the largest average household size, with 3.11 persons, while George Town had the smallest, with 2.38 persons. Almost half (46.7%) of the households are in the capital city, George Town. Population growth and density can lead to a shortage of homes, and if affordable housing supply lags behind demand, it can result in overcrowding. Furthermore, rising rents make homes even less affordable, especially for low-income workers. Generally, this leads to an increase in inadequate housing, that is, housing in poor condition or located in hidden, high-density

areas.

Generally, overcrowding is where more people are located within a given space (especially for sleeping) than is considered tolerable from a safety and health perspective. Safety and health perspectives vary by environment and local cultural norms.

Table 6.1 shows the rate of overcrowded households, measured as the ratio of household adult counts to household dwelling room counts, at **10.3 percent**.⁹ The estimated number of overcrowded households indicates that 89.7 percent of households are not **overcrowded**.

Income inequality. The income quintile share ratio (S80/S20 ratio), which is a basic measure of income distribution, is calculated as the ratio of total income received by the top twenty (20) percent of the population with the highest income (the top quintile) to that obtained by the twenty percent of the population with the lowest income (the bottom quintile)¹⁰. According to the Labour Force Survey Fall 2025 data, the income quintile share ratio for employed persons who reported their income on the survey was 13.4 times. This income inequality ratio means that people at the top of the income scale earn, on average, 13.4 times as much as those at the bottom. Similarly, **the top 20% of households (with employment**

income) earn **10.3 times as much as the bottom 20%**. The Gini index¹¹, or Gini coefficient, measures income inequality by determining how income is distributed across the population and is **calculated at 0.414**. An improvement in income distribution means the GINI coefficient should be trending toward zero (0).

Arrears in Bills Payment: *During the past six (6) months, were you behind in paying any of the following expenses?* About **84.4 percent of respondents reported not being behind on any bill payments in the last six months**. Of all respondents, 3.7 percent were behind on electricity payments, 3.2 percent on other loans, 2.5 percent on water payments, 1.9 percent

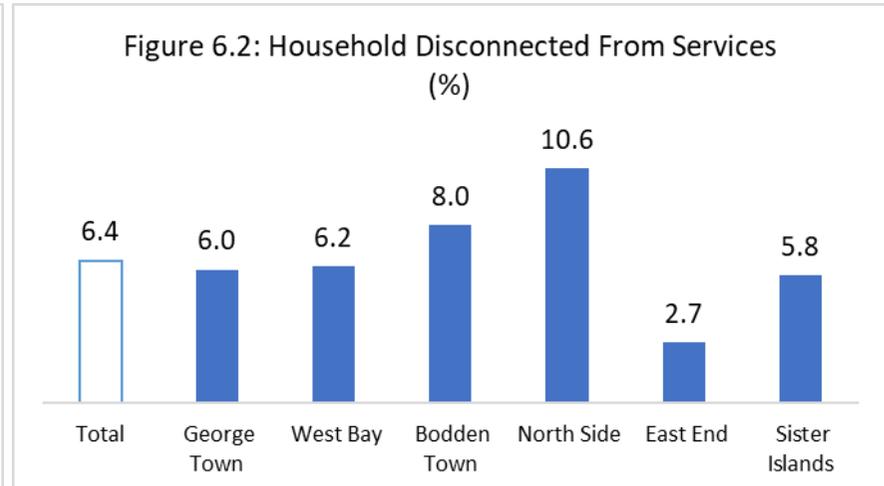
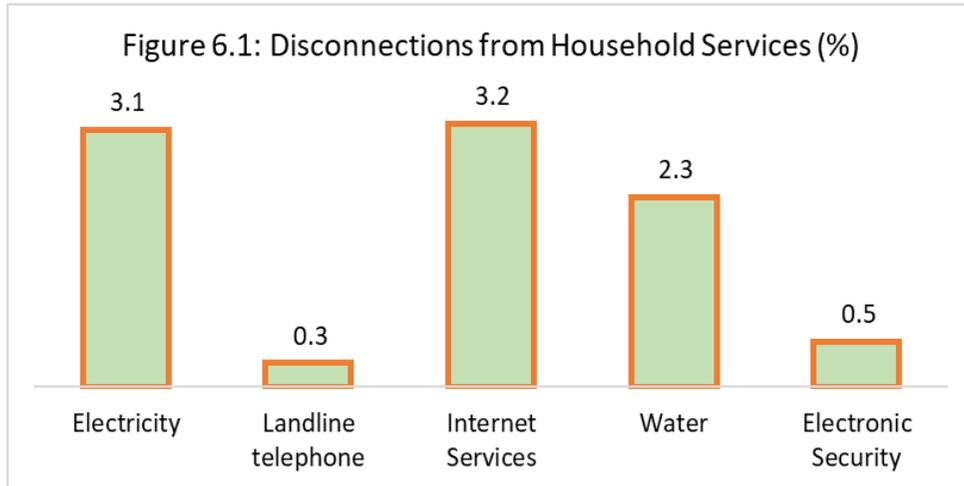
on rent payments, 1.4 percent on credit card payments, 0.9 percent on insurance services, and 0.8 percent on telephone payments. Approximately 0.7 percent was behind on mortgage payments and 0.5 percent on child support payments (see Table 6.2).

Household Expenses. Regarding household expenses (electricity, rent, mortgages, and water supply), approximately 8.3 percent were behind, and for Caymanians, it was 10.0 percent (see Table 6.2). For overall expenses, respondents' responses indicate that 14.6 percent of the adult population (18+) was behind on paying their bills, while for Caymanians, it was 18.5 percent.

Disconnection from household services. *Has this household ever been disconnected from services during the past 6 months?* Of the estimated 34,182 households in the Cayman Islands, 3.1 percent reported being disconnected from electricity and internet services within the last six months (March – September 2025), and 2.3 percent from city water. As

shown in Figure 6.2, the highest disconnection was in North Side (10.6%), followed by Bodden Town (8.0%), West Bay (6.2%), and George Town (6.0%). The East End district had the lowest disconnection rate of 2.7 percent.



8. ECONOMIC AND PHYSICAL SAFETY

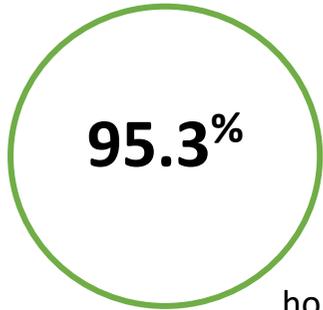

In the context of quality of life, economic security, and vulnerability, wealth and debt are analysed. At the same time, physical and personal safety is measured by recorded crime rates and perceived crime levels in areas where people live. Economic security is analysed using statistics that measure situations in which people may find themselves, such as being unable to cope with unexpected financial expenses or being in arrears with mortgage, rent, utility bills, or hire purchase payments. The analysis of physical safety is based on crime statistics and information on the population's perceptions regarding crime, violence, or vandalism in the area where they live. The overall satisfaction

was **87.1** percent, averaged from the subcomponents below.



Self-assessed Poverty and Food Security



Looking back over your life in the Cayman Islands, how often do you think you lived in poverty?

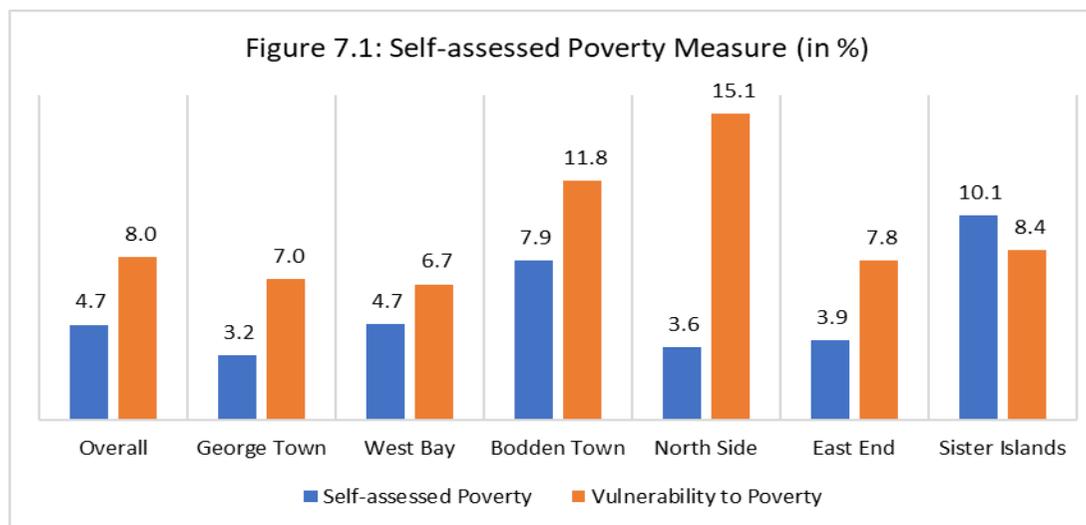
Poverty is a state or condition in which an individual lacks the financial resources and essentials for a certain standard of living. It can have diverse environmental, social, economic, and political causes and effects. Self-assessed poverty focuses on relative poverty rather than absolute poverty. The former is when households receive 50% less than the average household income. So, they have some money, but still not enough to afford anything above the basics. Absolute poverty is when household income is below a predetermined poverty level. This makes it impossible for the person or family to meet basic needs, including food, shelter, safe drinking water, education, and healthcare.

Self-assessed poverty. Responses to the QOL survey questions answering “often” and “most of the time” are considered to have been living in poverty, and those persons responding “occasionally” are deemed to be vulnerable to poverty. This self-assessed poverty measure is 4.7 percent, while another 8.0 percent were vulnerable to the effects of poverty (see Table 7.1). Therefore, **the proportion of persons not in poverty (self-assessed) was 95.3 percent.** For Caymanians, the self-assessed poverty measure is 5.6 percent, and the poverty vulnerability measure is 8.9 percent. The effects of poverty are not limited to a lack of income and material resources. In addition to economic deprivation, poverty violates human dignity and erodes and nullifies the rights to adequate food, housing, health, safe water, education, and others.

The lowest level of self-assessed poverty was in George Town, at 3.2 percent, followed by North Side at 3.6 percent, while the highest was in Sister Islands at 10.1 percent (see Figure 7.1). Responses of “occasionally” were deemed a poverty vulnerability measure, which was highest in North Side (15.1%), followed by Bodden Town (11.8%) and Sister Islands (8.4%). West Bay had the lowest poverty vulnerability.



Self-assessed Food security. *Have you had to give up meals within the last four (4) weeks due to a lack of resources of any kind?* As shown in Table 7.2, approximately 4.5 percent of persons gave up meals within the last four weeks due to a lack of resources to obtain food. Caymanians had a food insecurity rate of 5.1 percent compared to 4.4 percent for non-Caymanians. Food insecurity among females (4.5%) was lower than among males (4.6%) (see Table 7.2). Across the districts, 8.8 percent of North Side residents have had to give up meals, followed by Bodden Town (8.5%), Sister Islands (6.2%), West Bay (3.8%), George Town (3.0%), and East End (1.3%).

Meal Days given up. *How many days in the last four (4) weeks have you given up at least one meal due to a lack of resources of any kind?* As depicted in Figure 7.2, of the approximately 2,815 persons who have given up at least one meal in the last four weeks of the reference period, the vast majority (75.7%) gave up a meal for up to 5 days. On the other hand, 13.1 percent gave meals for 24 days or more for the month. Caymanians gave up the most meals (7.8%), and non-Caymanians (5.5%). Approximately 4.0 percent of persons gave up a meal, with more Caymanians than non-Caymanians doing so (see Figure 7.5). Similarly, more males (4.0%) than females (3.9%) skipped meals due to a lack of resources. The highest proportion of people giving up meals was from North Side (9.0%) and Bodden Town (8.4%), followed by the Sister Islands (3.8%). George Town and West Bay each had about 2.4 meals, and East End had the lowest.

Figure 7.2: No. of Persons gave lunch in last 4 weeks

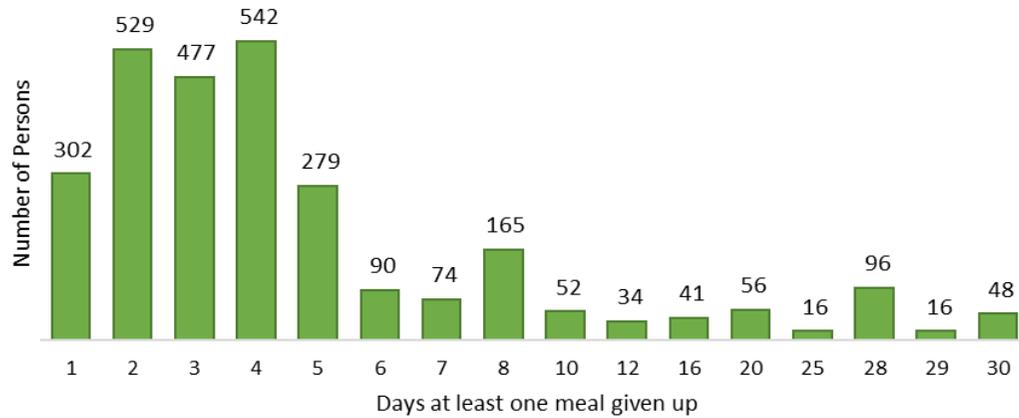


Figure 7.3: Percentage of meals given up

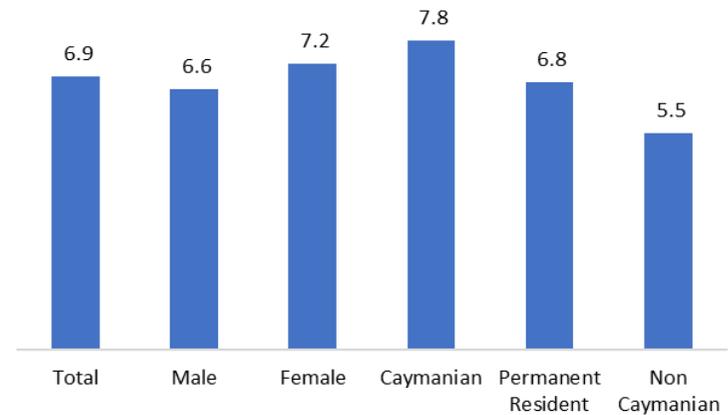


Figure 7.4: Percentage of Persons giving up meal

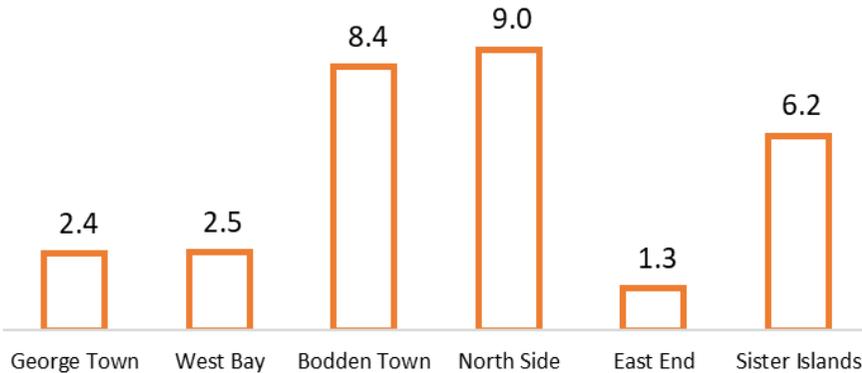
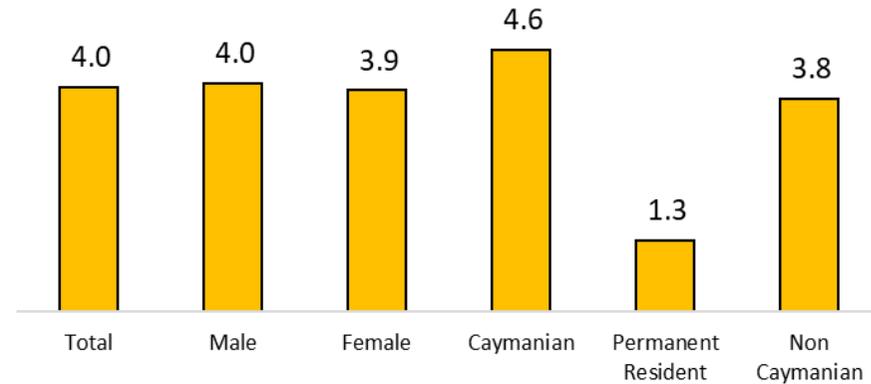


Figure 7.5: Percentage of Persons giving up meals



Expenditure priorities. In addition to goods and services that were unaffordable to households due to a lack of money, to ascertain what household members are giving up to keep their budget from exploding, the question asked was, *which of the following items have you personally gone without in the last six months due to a lack of resources?* Using these multiple responses, 67.9 percent of household members reported not having a shortage of money during the last six months of 2025. In responding to this multiple response question, by category, household members gave up the following to keep their budgets from exploding: new clothing (19.0%); dining out (17.6%); new shoes (16.4%); paid holiday with family (17.3%); going to social gatherings (12.9%); paid hobby or sports (11.1%); and personal transport expenses (5.8%).

Coping with insufficient money. In the last six months of 2025, among those with inadequate spending power, 13.6 percent have been involved in an expenditure reduction strategy (see Table 7.5). This reduction strategy is used by 13.2 percent of Caymanians (see Table 7.6). During the last six months, approximately 21.0 percent of respondents continued wearing worn clothing, while another 16.6 percent resorted to buying second-hand or used clothing (see Table 7.5). Roughly 12.2 percent of residents will go without vehicles and needed household items, while 4.7 percent will liquidate assets to obtain additional cash. Similarly, about one in five Caymanians (20.9%) will continue wearing worn clothing when faced with strained financial resources (see Table 7.6). One in eight Caymanians (13.9%) would buy used clothing, 12.8 percent would go without needed household appliances and vehicles, and 5.1 percent would sell assets to raise needed cash.

In North Side, 35.1 percent of Caymanian respondents continued to wear worn clothing due to financial constraints. Approximately 19.4 percent in West Bay, Bodden Town 28.8 percent, and George Town 18.0 percent (see Table 7.7).

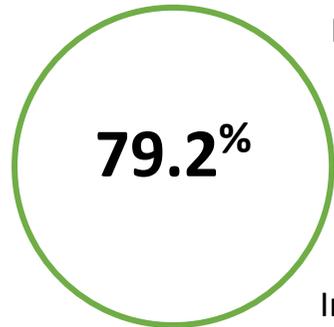

On average, 21.6 percent of North Side respondents engage in expenditure reduction. This was followed by Bodden Town (18.0%), Sister Islands (17.8%), George Town (13.2%), and West Bay (10.6%). The East End district had the lowest proportion of expenditure reduction.

Economic/Financial Security – income and savings



Financial security is the ability to cover living expenses, live comfortably on income, and save for the future. An important indicator of financial security is having enough emergency savings to cover unexpected costs and avoiding high-interest debt. In other words, financial security means an individual is comfortable affording regular expenses and optimistic about their financial future. Financial security is essential because it gives an individual the confidence to rebound after a crisis.

In response to “*What is the main source of financing you would use to immediately finance an unexpected payment ...*” the results are displayed in Table 7.9. Using the middle option between CI\$2,000 and CI\$5,000, which includes the monthly mean and median incomes, financial security is measured by the financial resources available from savings (50.7%), relatives (19.7%), friends (7.8%), and the sale of an asset (1.0%). Therefore, it stood at **79.2 percent**.

Unexpected Finance of less than \$2,000. 72.8 percent of individuals said they could finance less than CI\$2,000 of unexpected payments from personal savings, with 18.8 percent borrowing from relatives and friends. However, approximately 6.4 percent of individuals would need to borrow from institutions (formal and informal), and 0.8 percent sell assets to finance up to CI\$2,000 unexpectedly.

As depicted in Table 7.10, Caymanians, 69.7 percent could be financed from personal savings. Approximately 20.0 percent would be borrowed from relatives and friends, followed by institutions (formal and informal) at 7.9 percent and others at 2.5 percent.

Unexpected Finance of between \$2,000 and \$5,000. The Cayman Islands employed labour force median and mean incomes fall within the range of CI\$2,000 and CI\$5,000, and the ability to finance unexpected expenditures was as follows: savings, 50.0 percent; relatives/friends, 28.0 percent; financial institutions, 19.4 percent; and others, 2.6 percent.

Table 7.10 demonstrates that 50.9 percent of Caymanians would finance unexpected expenses from personal savings. Approximately 25.9 percent would be borrowed from relatives and friends, followed by institutions (formal and informal) at 20.2 percent and others at 3.0 percent.

Unexpected Finance of between \$5,000 and \$10,000. As the unexpected payment of over CI\$5,000 exceeds the monthly median and mean incomes of CI\$3,600 and CI\$4,807, respectively, approximately 34.6 percent of individuals are prepared to cover such an expenditure from personal savings. Respondents would seek help from relatives and friends (21.6%), financial institutions (39.2%), and other sources (4.6%).

As financing requirements increase, the proportion of financing from individuals decreases. 34.4 percent of Caymanians finance unexpected expenses from personal savings. Approximately 21.0 percent borrow from relatives and friends, followed by institutions (formal and informal) at 39.9 percent, and other sources at 4.6 percent.

As depicted in Table 7.11, approximately 83.9 percent of West Bay residents could finance an unexpected payment of up to CI\$5,000 from personal savings, borrow from relatives and friends, or sell assets (see Table 7.11). George Town was similar at 83.4 percent, East End at 76.4 percent, the Sister Islands at 71.8 percent, Bodden Town at 66.9 percent, and North Side at 65.7 percent.

Caymanians in the Sister Islands seem to have the least personal savings available for unexpected expenses, with 37.0 percent. George Town and West Bay are more likely to afford unexpected expenditures up to CI\$5,000. Caymanian Residents from Bodden Town and the Sister Islands are more likely to borrow from the financial institutions.

More people rely on financial institutions for unexpected expenses between CI\$5,000 and CI\$10,000 (see Appendix Table 7A).

Economic/financial outlook



Economic outlooks are mainly influenced by various factors such as income, education level, family size, financial literacy, risk perception, and emotions. Changes in spending patterns and income levels also play a crucial role in shaping household financial outlook.

Is there anything you expect to happen within the next two

years that will improve or reduce the standard of living, increase or decrease income, or none of these?

Generally, 48.8 percent of people expect their income and standard of living to increase over the next two years. By contrast, approximately 6.3 percent of residents see a dim economic and financial

outlook (lower income and standard of living). 45.7 percent of Caymanians hold an optimistic view of improved income and living standards over the next two years. 44.9 percent of respondents believe their circumstances will stay the same. Nonetheless, when combined, **93.7 percent of respondents didn't think their economic circumstances would worsen over the next two years.**

Among the districts, East End leads the way with the highest optimism, followed by North Side and the Sister Islands.

Approximately 3 in every 5 people in East End expect higher income in the future, while for North Side it's 1 in every 2 people, and in all other districts it's around 50 percent.

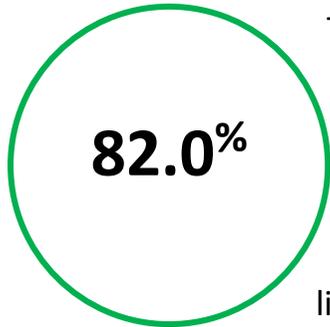

East End residents are the least pessimistic about their economic prospects, with 2.7 percent. In contrast, at least 1 in 5 North Side residents (20.2%) expect their income and living standards to decline over the next 2 years (see Table 7.13).

Among Caymanians, 56.6 percent of those in East End remain optimistic about the near term, followed by Bodden Town (53.9%), North Side (50.5%), West Bay (45.9%), Sister Islands (45.5%), and George Town (38.1%) (see Table 7.14).

Resources to support the standard of living



The standard of living is the material well-being of the average person in a given population, typically measured using gross domestic product (GDP) per capita. In contrast, quality of life refers to the more intangible aspects of the standard of living. One alternative standard of living data set is the Human Development Index (HDI), which uses many factors, including life expectancy, education, and gross national income (GNI). The standard of living focuses on basic material factors such as income, gross domestic product (GDP), life expectancy, and economic opportunity. This quality of life (QOL) indicator gauges Cayman Islands residents' perceptions of their standard of living.

Standard of Living. In response to *How satisfied are you with the following aspects of your standard of Living?* 79.9 percent of respondents were happy (satisfied and very satisfied) with their current standard of living (see Table 7.15). Similarly, 76.6 percent of Caymanians, 83.2 percent of non-Caymanians, and 78.6 percent of females were content with their standard of living.

Across the districts, a higher proportion of East End residents (88.7%) were satisfied with their standard of living than in the other districts. West Bay respondents' satisfaction was 87.1 percent, followed by George Town (82.1%), North Side (74.0%), Bodden Town (68.8%), and Sister Islands (65.9%) (see Table 7.16).

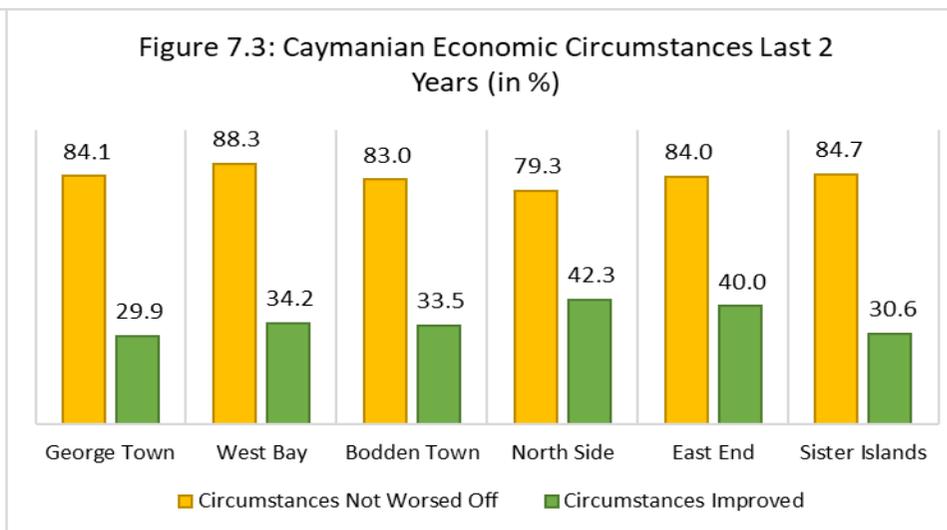
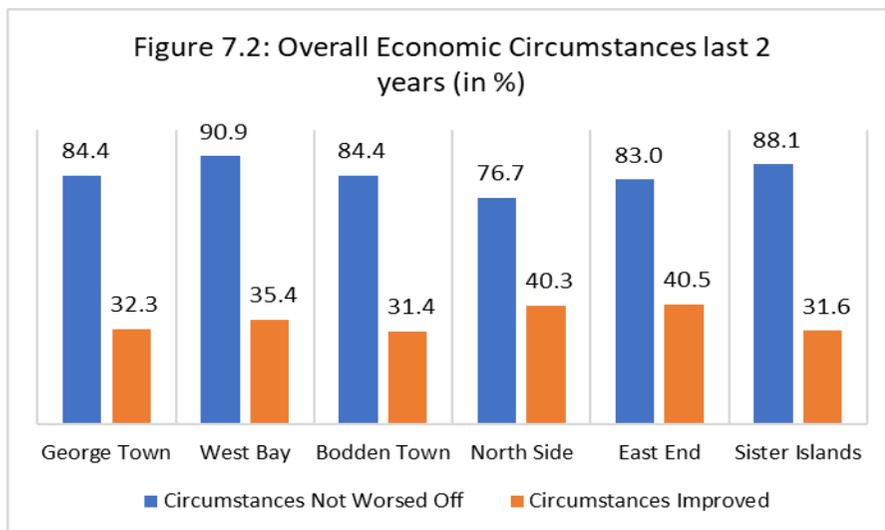

Life Circumstances. In response to the QOL survey question, *“Has anything happened within the last two years to you which has improved or reduced standard of living; increased or decreased income; remained the same, 85.8 percent of those surveyed responded that their living circumstances improved or stayed the same (Did not worsen).* Among Caymanians, it was 84.6 percent, and among non-Caymanians, 87.2 percent (see Table 7.17).

Among the districts, West Bay recorded the highest percentage of residents whose life circumstances had not deteriorated during the last two years, 90.9 percent (see Figure 7.2). This was followed by Sister Islands and George Town with 88.1 and 84.4 percent, respectively. The districts with the highest percentage of residents whose living circumstances improved the least in the last two years were Sister Islands (31.6%) and Bodden Town (31.4%).

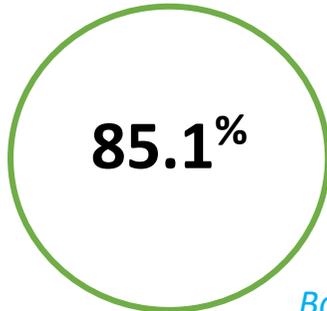

Across all districts, 32.7 percent of Caymanians' livelihoods improved over the last two years, with higher proportions of improvement in North Side (42.3%), East End (40.0%), and Bodden Town (33.5%). On average, 15.4 percent of Caymanians circumstances deteriorated over the last two years (see Figure 7.2).

Physical Safety



Physical safety refers to protection from bodily harm, danger, and threats. Individuals who do not feel physically safe are unable to focus on higher levels of needs as they are preoccupied with survival. The most important element of human survival is keeping themselves and their family safe. Without a sense of physical safety – both individually and more broadly as a community – persons are unable to focus on other factors that support their wellbeing

Based on your knowledge and awareness, did your personal security feeling increase, stay about the same, or decrease? Approximately 85.1 percent of respondents reported feeling safe in the Cayman Islands. Respondents felt safe in their community and in the Cayman Islands, with a safety score of 86.5 percent and 86.1 percent, respectively (see Table 7.18).

Generally, their sense of safety extends to visiting public spaces, with a score of 86.3 percent. Going out at night was scored lowest, with 80.1 percent of respondents reporting safety concerns.

Similarly, as shown in Table 7.19, on average, 85.0 percent of Caymanians felt safe going about their business in the Cayman Islands. 19.9 percent of Caymanians felt that going out at night was less unsafe than going around their community, around the islands, and utilising public spaces (see Table 7.19).

Among all residents, 29.1 percent felt unsafe going out at night in the East End district, and 25.8 percent felt unsafe in public spaces (see Table 7.20). Across the districts, approximately 25.9 percent of persons residing in East End generally felt unsafe (74.1% felt safe; the remainder felt unsafe), and 17.0 percent of Bodden Town residents felt unsafe. Approximately 8.4 percent and 9.3 percent of Sister Islands and North Side residents, respectively, felt unsafe in the Cayman Islands.

Caymanians in the Sister Islands reported the highest level of safety, at 90.2 percent, followed by North Side (90.0%), George Town (85.3%), West Bay (84.5%), Bodden Town (82.1%), and East End (75.4%) (see Table 7.20).

Public education regarding crime constitutes one of the most fundamental strategies for crime prevention. Individuals who are informed about the actions they can take to mitigate criminal risk and ways to improve community safety are central to a more secure society. By informing the public about the existence of such issues and demonstrating methods for effective response, empowerment for proactive engagement is fostered.

In assessing their knowledge of crime and policing, respondents were asked, *“Based on your knowledge and awareness, rate the crime rate, policing, and security as increased, stayed about the same, or decreased.”* About 48.0 percent of respondents believed that crime in the Cayman Islands stayed the same, 44.3 percent thought it increased, and only 7.7 percent said it decreased. On average, only 11.4 percent believed that crime increased in their community, and 14.5 percent responded that crime declined.

In response to awareness of changes in police protection, 86.0 percent expressed a positive response (stay the same & increase) that police protection increased or stayed the same in their communities. The positive response was similar in the Cayman Islands, with 87.7 percent.

Regarding knowledge and awareness of crime, 71.9 percent of Caymanians believe that crime in their community stayed the same, 15.2 percent decreased, and 12.9 percent increased. However, in response to crime in the Cayman Islands, 53.0 percent said crime increased, 39.5 percent said it stayed the same, and 7.6 percent said it decreased.

Caymanians’ positive responses (increase & stayed the same) regarding police protection in the community and the Cayman Islands were 87.1 percent and 47.0 percent, respectively. Alternatively, police protection decreased in the community and the Cayman Islands by 17.9 percent and 17.0 percent, respectively.

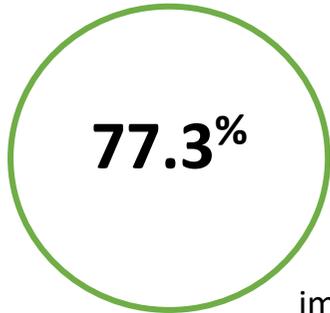
9. LEISURE AND SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

Leisure activities are the actions individuals undertake during their time off from work. Leisure activities encompass the practices individuals engage in during their spare time for different reasons, such as relaxation or growth. Leisure activities enhance personal satisfaction and promote social interactions, increasing access to social resources. These interactions play a significant role in improving the overall quality of life. The rationale for including this dimension is that effectively using one’s free time can enhance personal happiness and foster greater success in social interactions. To this end, the dimensions examined were work-life balance, social cohesion, and connections. Overall, this dimension averages satisfaction with work-life balance (77.3%) and social cohesion and interactions (85.6%) to yield a score of 81.4%.



Work-life balance



How satisfied are you with your work-life balance? 77.1 percent of residents indicated they are happy with their work-life balance, equivalent to three out of every four people.

It is generally accepted that rest is essential to maintaining a healthy work-life balance when engaging in various activities. Similarly, overworking can lead to negative consequences such as burnout, fatigue, and decreased productivity. Employees and employers must recognise the importance of maintaining a healthy balance between work and personal life. Achieving a healthy work-life balance varies based on individual circumstances and preferences, but it's crucial for promoting overall well-being. The weighted average satisfaction was 77.3 percent, with Caymanians at 76.4 percent and non-Caymanians at 78.0 percent.

The Fall QOL survey satisfaction score was 78.9 percent.

Caymanians who are content with their work-life balance scored 75.5 percent, while another 10.2 percent are generally dissatisfied (dissatisfied or very dissatisfied).

How do you allocate 24 and 48 hours on a typical weekday and weekend? On average, during a typical weekday, 30.8 percent of the time was spent sleeping (7.4 hrs per day), similar to the average work time (7.1 hrs per day). Leisure hours averaged 3.9 hours, and family time 3.2 hours per day. Local travel time averaged 1.4 hours per day, and 0.9 hours is used for physical exercise.

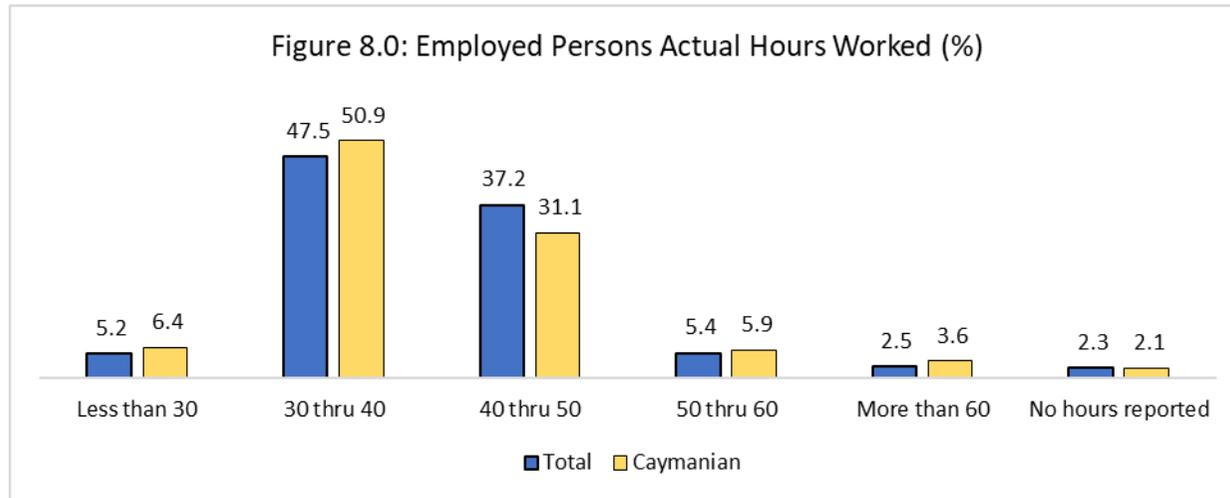
Regarding Caymanians, family and leisure time are higher than the average at 3.5 and 4.4 hours, respectively. Non-Caymanian work time is higher than the average, and leisure and family time are lower (see Table 8.2).

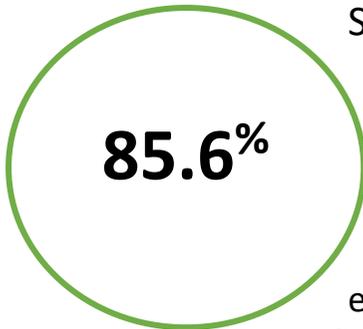

On weekends, 44.8 percent of total hours were spent on family and leisure time. Non-Caymanians spent more time working on the weekends and less time with family (see Table 8.2).

Figure 8.0 shows that at least 84.7 percent of the employed worked between 30 and 50 hours per week (see Figure 8.0). Approximately 7.9 percent of residents and 9.5 percent of Caymanians worked more than 50 hours per week. Persons who are said to be overworked work more than 50 hours per week.

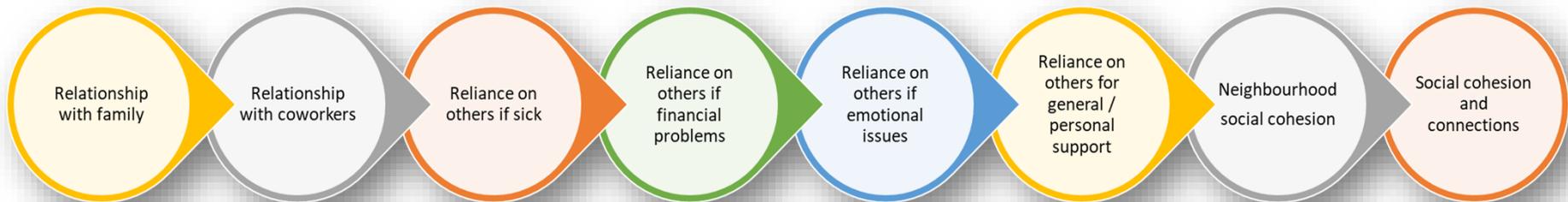


Social cohesion and connections



Social cohesion measures the interconnectedness and unity of different groups within a society. It encompasses the sense of belonging to a community and the relationships between its members. This concept embodies efforts to establish societal balance, foster economic growth, and strengthen national identity. Additionally, social cohesion aims to advance equal citizenship by reducing inequality, economic disparities, and societal divisions. It reflects people's aspirations for personal development, a sense of belonging that links individual freedom to social justice, economic efficiency to equitable resource allocation, and pluralism to shared mechanisms for conflict resolution.

Social cohesion is crucial to societal well-being and health outcomes. Socio-demographic factors affect perceptions of social cohesion. A cohesive society focuses on economic growth and a stable political structure built over time through a sense of belonging, values, and commitment. The following indicators were used to gauge social cohesion and connection. The overall satisfaction was **85.6** percent, which is the average of the subcomponents below.



Relationship with Family. *How satisfied are you with your relationship with your family?* The

results show that family relations remain strong in the Cayman Islands, with 92.2 percent of respondents reporting satisfaction. It was led by 94.6 percent of non-Caymanians, 94.1 percent of permanent residents, and 89.9 percent of Caymanians.

Comparing the districts, satisfaction with family relationships is highest in East End (94.6%), West Bay (93.8%), and George Town (93.6%). The two lowest were North Side and Sister Islands. All districts had satisfaction rates above 80 percent.

Relationship with Co-workers. *How satisfied are you with your relationship with co-workers?* 86.2 percent of persons aged 18 and older are generally satisfied with their co-workers. The satisfaction score among Caymanians was 83.6 percent, and 89.0 percent for non-Caymanians (see Table 8.5). Males' relationships with co-workers slightly edged out females, with 87.1 percent.

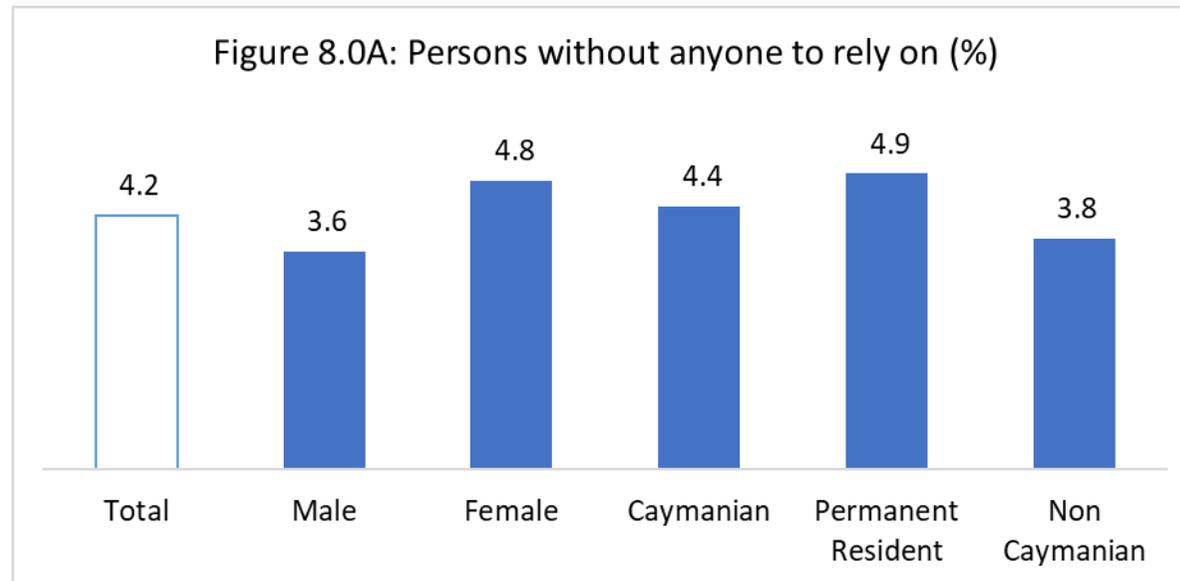

Social Support Network.

Researchers have said that having a strong support system has many positive benefits. Some of the best benefits include higher levels of well-being, better coping skills, and a longer, healthier life. Having a support system has also been proven to reduce depression, anxiety, and stress. In obtaining public sentiments on social support systems, the question posed was, *how many persons can you count on for help if you are sick, have financial problems, have emotional issues, or need other support?* Approximately 4.2 percent have no one to rely on for help. For Caymanians, the average was 4.4 percent, and for non-Caymanians, 3.8 percent. There are also more females (4.8%) than males (3.6%) without people to rely on in the event of needed help.



Sickness. *In the Cayman Islands, how many persons can you rely on if you are sick?*

About 5.3 percent of the population has no one to rely upon in the event of sickness. By contrast, 94.7 percent had one or more persons to rely on; this support network was highest among non-Caymanians (95.2%), followed by permanent residents (94.2%) and Caymanians (94.1%) (see Table 8.6).

Financial problems. *In the Cayman Islands, how many persons can you rely on if you have financial problems?*

12.0 percent of Caymanians indicated that if they have financial problems, they have no one to turn to for help (this excludes institutions like Social Services); 11.1 percent of all residents, including permanent residents and non-Caymanians, indicated that they had no one to rely on for financial assistance. Generally, 88.9 percent of persons in the Cayman Islands indicated they have one or more persons to rely on if they encounter financial hardship.

Emotional issues. *In the Cayman Islands, how many persons can you rely on if you have emotional issues?* If emotional problems arise, 91.9 percent of people in the Cayman Islands reported having at least one person in their lives they can rely on to help shoulder their emotional burdens. For Caymanians, it was 91.6 percent, and for females, it was 91.8 percent.

General Personal Support. *In the Cayman Islands, how many persons can you rely on if you need support in other personal events?* Regarding other personal support (losses in disasters, funerals, etc.), 7.2 percent had no one to turn to for help; this was lower among non-Caymanians, at 6.7 percent. Approximately 7.5 percent of Caymanians had no one to rely on for personal support, as they were more likely to have their support structure abroad. Among genders, there were more females without support (“None”) than males.

Loneliness.

Loneliness is the distress or discomfort that results from perceiving a gap between one's desires for social connection and one's actual experiences of social connection. It can be seen as emotional or social loneliness. The former refers to the feeling of lacking a meaningful relationship with a significant other or a close friend. Social loneliness is the experience of an insufficiently broad social network, including friends, neighbours, or colleagues. According to many experts, it is not necessarily about being alone. Instead, the feeling of being alone and isolated impacts the individual's state of mind. And as such, researchers suggest that loneliness is associated with social isolation, poor social skills, introversion, and depression. To gauge public sentiment on loneliness, the question was: *"How often do you feel lonely?"* Approximately 76.4 percent of respondents reported occasional loneliness (occasionally, hardly ever, never). For Caymanians, occasional loneliness was 80.2 percent.

As displayed in Table L1, more females (24.7%) reported episodes of loneliness (often/always and some of the time) than males (22.4%). Loneliness is more prevalent among non-Caymanians (29.2%) than Caymanians (19.7%) and Permanent Residents (20.8%). The inability of most low-paid non-Caymanian workers to afford to have their families reside in the Cayman Islands or to travel regularly could be a plausible reason.

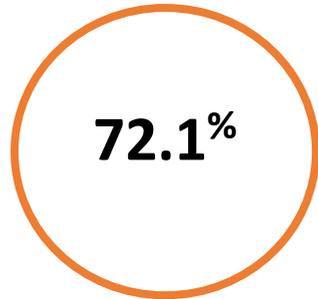
Loneliness is more prevalent in the Sister Islands than in the other districts, with 35.2 percent reported. The Sister Islands were followed by North Side (25.1%), Bodden Town (24.4%), East End (24.2%), and George Town (23.9%). West Bay reported the lowest loneliness response rate, at 20.1 percent.

Neighbourhood Social Cohesion.



In the Cayman Islands, how much do you agree or disagree with neighbourhood social cohesion? Regarding neighbourhood social cohesion, 72.1 percent of respondents believe that neighbourhoods accept others' social behaviour. Among Caymanians, it was 72.1 percent, with the lowest percentage of persons in the neighbourhood sharing the same values (67.5%).

Helpful Neighbourhood. Good neighbours are considerate, tolerant, and understanding of others and their different lifestyles, which helps build thriving communities. Despite this, different behaviours can cause problems for neighbours, and some are more serious than others. Nonetheless, a good neighbourhood is all about people helping people and creating positive energy. Approximately 66.7 percent of respondents agreed that their current neighbourhood comprises people willing to help others (see Table 8.11). This is slightly lower among Caymanian respondents (64.8%), non-Caymanians (66.9%), and females (66.1%). Overall, 25.8 percent were indifferent, and 6.5 percent disagreed.

Close-knit neighbourhood. Close-knit neighbourhoods generally comprise trusted networks of immediate neighbours, which encourages sharing

items, helping each other out, combining buying power, organising events, and generally increasing local trust, sharing, and resilience. Respondents expressed some agreement that their neighbourhood is somewhat close-knit, with 55.5 percent agreeing. While only 13.3 percent of persons disagreed with the close-knit neighbourhood question, some 31.1 percent were indifferent (neither agree nor disagree). Just about 54.2 percent of Caymanians agreed with the evaluation of the close-knit neighbourhood. However, 28.2 percent of Caymanians were “on the fence (neither agree nor disagree)”, with another 17.6 percent disagreeing (see Table 8.12).

Trusted neighbourhood. Trusted neighbours should have their neighbours' best interests at heart. They should treat their neighbours' homes and families as their own, keep their commitments, and be willing to help the neighbourhood.

Approximately 61.5 percent of respondents agreed that people in their neighbourhood could be trusted,

while 8.0 percent disagreed and 30.4 percent neither agreed nor disagreed. Among respondents' responses, 62.1 percent of Caymanians agreed, and 58.0 percent of non-Caymanians (see Table 8.13).

Incompatible neighbours.

Neighbourhood disputes are disagreements between neighbours that result in distress and frustration. When faced with the statement “*people in this neighbourhood generally get along*”, 67.4 percent agreed, 6.1 percent disagreed, and 26.6 percent were indifferent (see Table 8.14). Of Caymanian respondents, 70.1 percent agreed with the statement, 6.3 percent disagreed, and 23.7 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

Neighbourhood cultural differences.

Cultural differences are variations in customs, beliefs, values, and behaviours between individuals from different cultural backgrounds. Recognising and respecting cultural differences is essential for fostering an inclusive and diverse work

environment. 46.6 percent of respondents agreed that *“people in his neighbourhood share the same values”*, while 13.6 percent disagreed and 39.8 percent abstained from agreeing or disagreeing (see Table 8.15). Approximately 47.4 percent of Caymanians agreed, and 44.9 percent of non-Caymanians disagreed.

Neighbourhood members know each other.

Neighbourhood lacking in friendliness or warmth feeling. That is unfriendly behaviour towards others in the neighbourhood, showing a lack of interest in speaking with or helping them.

Approximately 58.3 percent of respondents believe that most

people in their neighbourhood know each other (see Table 8.16). Most responders disagreed that neighbourhood members know each other; 14.2 percent and 27.4 percent were indifferent.

10. NATURAL AND LIVING ENVIRONMENT

The environment is often discussed in the context of sustainability, but it's also crucial for an individual's quality of life.

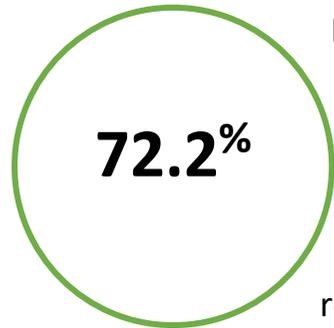

Environmental conditions directly affect human health and well-being and indirectly impact ecosystems and biodiversity. They can also lead to more severe consequences, like natural disasters or industrial accidents. Many residents increasingly desire to enjoy the benefits of a high-quality environment, from fundamental rights such as access to clean water to intangible aspects like noise-free residential and work environments and easy access to nature and green spaces.

Local environmental factors mainly influence an individual's quality of life. Therefore, an accurate quality of life assessment can be obtained through surveys that collect individuals' self-reported perceptions of environmental issues, rather than relying solely on aggregated measures of environmental conditions, such as air pollution or emissions. The following indicators, averaging 76.4 percent, were used to gauge the natural and living environment.



Environmental Preservation



Recycling converts waste materials, usually thrown away, into new materials and objects. Recycling waste reduces the number of harmful materials in the environment by keeping them out of landfills. The Department of Environmental Health (DEH) oversees all recycling on the Islands. There are many reasons why recycling is essential. It can help reduce the carbon footprint, reduce the need to harvest raw materials, save energy, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and prevent pollution. The most effective way to reduce garbage is to avoid creating it in the first place. The principle of reducing waste, reusing, and recycling resources and products is often called the "3Rs." REDUCING means choosing to use things carefully to minimize waste. REUSING involves the repeated use of items or parts of items that still have usable aspects. RECYCLING means using garbage itself as a resource.

Household Environment Engagement. Respondents were asked, *"In the past 6 months, how often did this household {Reuse/recycle; separate/sort waste; conserve electricity; reduce waste; conserve water}?"* Responses are displayed in Table 9.1.

An optimal indicator for waste management would be the treatment rates for waste generated in the Cayman Islands, by treatment type. In the absence of this metric, our focus is on household responses. At the household level, 67.8 percent reported recycling and reusing materials sometimes, most of

the time, or always. In embracing the Department of the Environment's “Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle”, 93.5 percent engage in sorting waste for the landfill. In addition, 59.7 percent of households reported reducing waste, albeit to varying degrees; conservation of energy and water was 92.3 percent and 76.8 percent, respectively.

Environmental Satisfaction. *“How satisfied are you with the following aspects of Cayman’s Natural Environment?”*

Respondents' environmental satisfaction was scored at 71.0 percent. This emanated from scoring waste management, recycling practices, green spaces and walkable communities, marine and land protected areas, and marine and coastal ecosystems (see Table 9.2).

Waste Management Satisfaction. Waste management is the collection, treatment, recycling, and disposal of different waste materials. Respondents' satisfaction score for waste management was 67.8 percent. 17.6 percent were dissatisfied with waste management practices and policies, and 14.5 percent were indifferent. Dissatisfaction was highest among

Caymanians, at 23.8 percent, while among non-Caymanian respondents it was 9.3 percent. Satisfaction among gender respondents, males (68.9%) were more satisfied than females (66.8%).

Caymanian respondents from Bodden Town (30.5%) and George Town (29.5%) were the most dissatisfied with waste management practices (see Appendix Table 19A to G). This was followed by the Sister Islands (25.5%), North Side (11.3%), West Bay (9.8%), and East End (6.2%).

Recycling Practices Satisfaction. Recycling is the action or process of converting waste into reusable material. Approximately 56.3 percent of respondents were satisfied and very satisfied with known recycling practices (see Table 9.4). Caymanians (26.4%) and permanent residents (21.6%) respondents had higher overall dissatisfaction than non-Caymanians (13.1%).

Approximately 38.5 percent of Sister Islands Caymanian respondents were dissatisfied with the current recycling practices (see Table 19A to G). This was followed by Bodden Town (31.8%), George Town (30.9%), North Side (16.0%), West Bay (14.2%), and East End (6.2%).

Green Spaces and Walkable

Communities indirectly impact health by improving air quality and limiting the impact of heat waves by reducing urban temperatures. Green spaces can also positively affect humans' physical health by filtering the air from pollutants and reducing noise pollution. Building walkable communities helps reduce reliance on automobiles. The weighted-average satisfaction score for the provision of green spaces and walkable communities was 68.7 percent.

Approximately 56.8 percent of respondents to the QOL survey were satisfied or very satisfied with the current green spaces and walkable communities. Non-Caymanian (66.5%) respondents were more satisfied with the number of green spaces and walkable communities than Caymanians (48.9%). Approximately 29.6 percent of Caymanians were dissatisfied with the provision of adequate green spaces and walkable communities.

Caymanian respondents from the Bodden Town district were most dissatisfied with the current stock of green spaces and walkable communities, 41.1 percent (see Appendix 19D). The other districts following Bodden Town were George Town (34.1%), Sister Islands (17.4%), North Side (16.0%), West Bay (15.7%), and East End (5.1%).

Marine and Land Protected Areas.

Marine and land-protected areas are meant to preserve biodiversity and buffer coasts against rising tides and storm surges, such as sea grapes and mangroves. Similarly, the wetlands provide value to the ecosystem. These include improved water quality, flood protection, shoreline erosion control, opportunities for recreation and aesthetic appreciation, and natural products for the Island's use at no cost. Respondents were asked about the Cayman Islands' environmental zone, marine reserve, wildlife interaction zone, line fishing zone, terrestrial protected area, port anchorage area, and port control zone. The weighted-average satisfaction score for marine and land-protected areas was 72.9 percent.

Although 1 in 4 respondents was indifferent toward the marine and land protection areas, approximately 64.9 percent expressed satisfaction (satisfied & very satisfied). Caymanian respondents (16.9%) were dissatisfied with the current protected areas.

Regarding the districts, Caymanian respondents' dissatisfaction was highest in the Sister Islands (18.3%), George Town (17.7%), Bodden Town (17.7%), North Side (13.2%), West Bay (9.6%), East End (2.0%), and (see Appendix Table 19A to G).

Marine and Coastal Ecosystems. Marine ecosystems are habitats and ecosystems found in the ocean, while coastal ecosystems are habitats and ecosystems found at the boundary between land and sea. Protecting important marine and coastal ecosystems that provide a wide range of benefits, including natural solutions to climate impacts through mitigation, adaptation, and resilience, complementing essential efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, contributes to the quality of life for residents. Marine ecosystems include marshes, mangrove forests, and coral reefs. The weighted-average satisfaction score for the marine and coastal ecosystem was 72.4 percent.

Approximately 12.0 percent of respondents were dissatisfied with the marine and coastal ecosystems. Nonetheless, 62.7 percent were satisfied, with Caymanian satisfaction being 59.8 percent (see Table 9.7).

As depicted in Table 9.8, Caymanian residents in all districts except East End and West Bay are between 15 and 21 percent dissatisfied with marine, coastal, and land-protected areas and ecosystems.

Natural disasters and emergencies

Disaster risk management involves implementing policies and strategies to minimise new disaster risks, alleviate existing risks, and handle residual risks. This helps enhance resilience and reduce disaster losses. Prevention focuses on halting the occurrence of hazards, whether natural, technological, or human-caused. While preventing all hazards is impossible, effective evacuation plans, environmental planning, and design standards can reduce the risk of loss of life and injury.

Mitigation involves preventing emergencies, reducing their likelihood, or minimising their harmful effects. Preparedness includes planning, organising, training, and taking corrective action to respond to various hazards and emergencies. Recovery activities begin after the emergency to restore critical community functions and manage stabilisation efforts, including debris clean-up, financial assistance, rebuilding infrastructure, and providing care for displaced populations. Reducing the negative impact of disasters at the national and household levels correlates directly with residents' quality of life.

Disaster or crisis management involves preparing for, responding to, and recovering from disasters. From natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes, and hurricanes to accidents, terrorist attacks, and war, disaster management aims to minimise their impact when they occur and to support emergency response efforts.

The response to the question *“How satisfied are you with disaster and emergency management in the Cayman Islands?”* The satisfaction scores **averaged 82.5 percent**. This comprised disaster mitigation (82.7%), disaster preparedness (82.6%), disaster response (82.3%), and disaster recovery (82.3%) (see Table 9.9A). As shown in Table 9.9B, the satisfaction score was highest in East End (95.1%) and lowest in North Side (72.7%), reflecting a low satisfaction with disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery.

Disaster Mitigation. Mitigation can be perceived as a sustained action that reduces or eliminates long-term risk to people and property from natural hazards and their effects. It describes the ongoing effort at the government and individual levels to lessen the impact of disasters upon families, homes, communities, and the economy. The department responsible for disaster management in the Cayman Islands government is the Hazard Management Unit, and the evaluation is conducted in the context of this unit's work, alongside other organisations. The weighted-average satisfaction score for disaster mitigation was 82.7 percent.

Generally, respondents rated disaster mitigation efforts at 88.0 percent (satisfied and very satisfied), with only 2.3 percent dissatisfied (see Table 9.10). Non-Caymanian respondents' satisfaction was 88.8 percent, and Caymanians was 87.0 percent.

Respondents from the East End district rated their satisfaction (satisfied and very satisfied) with disaster mitigation efforts at 93.5 percent, followed by West Bay at 89.7 percent (Appendix Table 20B to G). All the districts scored in the mid-80s, except East End, which scored 75.4 percent.

Disaster Preparedness. Disaster preparedness consists of measures undertaken in advance by governments, organisations, communities, or individuals to better respond to and cope with the immediate aftermath of a disaster. The objective is to reduce the loss of life and livelihoods. Simple initiatives can go a long way, such as training for search and rescue, establishing early warning systems, developing contingency plans, or stockpiling equipment and supplies. Disaster preparedness plays a vital role in building communities' resilience. The weighted-average satisfaction score for disaster preparedness was 82.6 percent.

Generally, respondents rated disaster preparedness at 88.5 percent (satisfied and very satisfied), with only 2.0 percent dissatisfied (see Table 9.11). The satisfaction score for non-Caymanian respondents was 88.8 percent, and for Caymanian respondents, 87.6 percent.

Respondents from the East End district reported the highest satisfaction (satisfied and very satisfied) with disaster preparedness at 95.4 percent, followed by West Bay at 90.4 percent (see Appendix Table 20A-G). All the districts scored in the 80s, except East End, which scored 73.7 percent.

Disaster Response. Disaster response includes the actions taken directly before, during, or immediately after a disaster. The objective is to save lives, ensure health and safety, and meet the subsistence needs of affected people. As shown in Table 9.12, the weighted average score for disaster response was 82.2 percent, while the proportion of respondents who were satisfied or very satisfied was 88.1 percent.

Caymanian respondents rated it at 88.6 percent, while non-Caymanians rated it at 86.9 percent satisfaction.

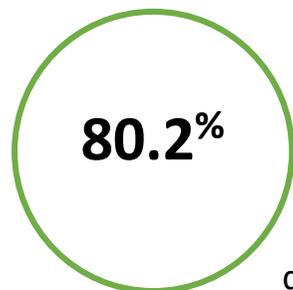
Respondents from East End rated satisfaction (satisfied and very satisfied) regarding disaster response efforts at 96.7 percent, followed by West Bay, with 90.4 percent (Appendix Table 20A to G). Bodden Town satisfaction was at 88.7 percent, followed by George Town (88.0%), Sister Islands (88.0%), and East End (72.4%).

Disaster Recovery. The ability to restore access and functionality to infrastructure after a disaster event. Overall, respondents rated disaster recovery at 88.0 percent satisfaction (satisfied and very satisfied). The Caymanian rating was 87.8 percent, compared with 87.2 percent for non-Caymanians (see Table 9.13).

Household Disaster Preparedness



Family education about disasters and how they affect household members, the development of a plan, the practice of its implementation in authentic and organised ways, and ensuring that supplies to support the household in the event of an emergency are crucial parts of household disaster preparedness. Households ranked their satisfaction with disaster preparedness in terms of supplies, medicine, the safety of the occupied dwelling, the ability to reach a shelter, and financial savings for disaster recovery.

The weighted average household satisfaction with disaster preparedness was 80.2 percent. Among Caymanian respondents, satisfaction with financial savings set aside for unexpected disaster expenditure (75.1%) was generally lower than in other areas of disaster preparation (see Table 9.15). Nonetheless, the Caymanian weighted satisfaction score was 80.5 percent, even higher when only positive satisfaction (83.6%) is considered.

By district, the highest disaster preparedness satisfaction score was West Bay, with an average score of 87.2 percent (see Table 9.15). Following West Bay were George Town (84.7%), East End (83.7%), North Side (82.2%), Bodden Town (80.3%), and the Sister Islands (78.5%).

Supply of food, medical, and other items for disasters.

Generally, respondents were satisfied with their stock of disaster items available for household use during a disaster. The satisfaction score (satisfied and very satisfied) was 88.8 percent, and 3.8 percent were unhappy with the disaster preparations. Caymanians' satisfaction was 87.9 percent, while non-Caymanians' satisfaction was 89.5 percent (see Table 9.16).

Among the districts, West Bay (91.1%) and George Town (88.9%) had the highest levels of satisfaction, while Sister Islands (82.9%) recorded the lowest (see Appendix Table 21A-F).

Safety of residence for disaster.

Regarding the safety of their dwelling, 86.5 percent of respondents are satisfied with its ability to withstand a disaster. Approximately 5.1 percent of respondents were unsatisfied with its safety, and 8.4 percent were unsure. Caymanians were satisfied with a satisfaction rating of 88.1 percent, while non-Caymanians were 83.9 percent (see Table 9.17).

Respondents across the districts are generally satisfied with the safety of their dwellings during disasters (see Tables 21A-F). The district of West Bay was the highest, followed by East End, Bodden Town, George Town, North Side, and the Sister Islands.

Getting to a shelter in the event

of a disaster. Regarding the ability to get to a shelter, 85.5 percent of respondents are satisfied. Approximately 3.5 percent of respondents were unsatisfied with its safety, and the other 11.0 percent were unsure. Caymanians were satisfied at 85.0 percent, while non-Caymanians were at 85.9 percent.

76.4 percent of respondents are satisfied and sure of their reserve recovery funds for unexpected disasters. Approximately 11.9 percent of respondents were unsatisfied with their financial ability to withstand a disaster, and the

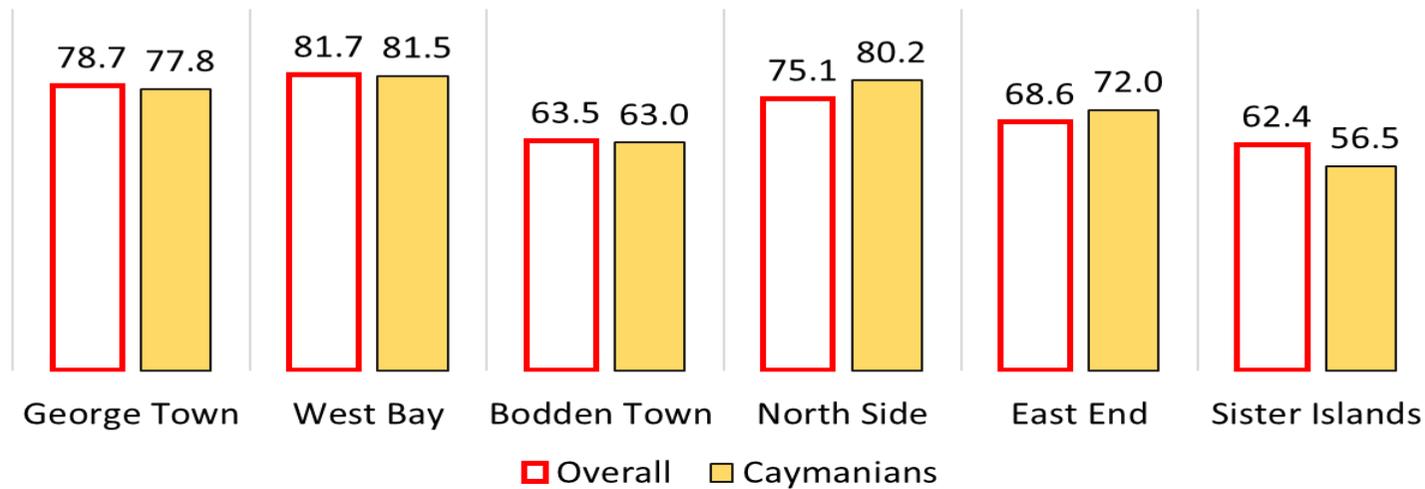

other 12.7 percent were unsure. Caymanian respondents were satisfied with their disaster reserve funding rating of 73.4 percent, while non-Caymanians' rating was 77.1 percent.

West Bay respondents are more satisfied with their financial preparedness than the other districts. Bodden Town was on the lower end of satisfaction, with 63.5 percent overall and 63.0 percent among Caymanians (see Figure 9.1).

Economic and Social Development



Economic development and growth are often synonymous, but that is not always true. They are, in essence, different. Economic development focuses on the standard of living and includes qualitative and quantitative measures. Economic development aims to foster an economy in which members benefit from wealth, education, health, and prosperity, making it a multidimensional tool. In contrast, economic growth focuses on the increase in an economy's output from one period to another. It solely considers opportunities to stimulate economic growth to increase real GDP.

Overall Development. To obtain respondents' sentiments on Cayman's overall development, the question was *"How satisfied are you with the following aspects of Cayman's development"*¹². 71.4 percent of respondents were satisfied with the development in the Cayman Islands. Investment in infrastructure (72.0%), Human Capital development (70.7%), technological progress and innovation (72.6%), access to financial resources (70.5%), and good governance and institutions (71.1%). Among Caymanians, the weighted average was 69.0 percent (see Table 9.20).

Investment in infrastructure. As shown in Table 9.21, using the satisfaction score, 59.6 percent of respondents were satisfied with the Cayman Islands' infrastructure development. This metric was highest among Permanent Residents (68.2%) and non-Caymanians (67.8%) and lowest among Caymanians (51.8%). Males (62.0%) had a more favourable view of Cayman's infrastructure development than females (57.3%). Considering the total dissatisfaction, 21.9 percent of Caymanians were dissatisfied.

Human capital development. Human capital consists of the knowledge, skills, and health that people accumulate throughout their lives, enabling them to realise their potential as productive members of society. Investment in human capital involves incurring training costs for individuals with the hope of realizing a future return (for example, through increased

earnings). This return on human capital investment can reduce poverty, create a more inclusive society, and enhance quality of life.

Among respondents, 56.0 percent were satisfied with the current state of human capital development, while 14.0 percent were dissatisfied. Similarly, Caymanians were 50.0 percent satisfied and 21.6 percent dissatisfied (see Table 9.22).

Technological progress and innovation. Technological progress and innovation involve discovering new and improved methods of producing goods and services. Changes in technology increase labour productivity, capital, and other factors of production. As exhibited in Table 9.23, the satisfaction score for technological progress and innovation was 61.9 percent, slightly lower for Caymanians (58.7%).

Access to financial resources. This includes access to capital, funding, and financial support for pursuing education, starting businesses, or investing in personal development. As development matures, so does individuals' and enterprises'

ability to access financial services, including credit, deposits, payments, insurance, and other risk management services. Over half of the respondents were satisfied with access to resources to finance private ventures.

The overall satisfaction score was 57.7 percent, with almost 1 in 5 (19.1%) Caymanians being dissatisfied with their access to financial resources for financing their investments and daily activities.

Good governance and institutions. Good governance measures how public institutions conduct public affairs, manage public resources, and guarantee the realisation of human rights, essentially free of abuse and corruption, and adherence to the rule of law. *The UN's Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific summarises good governance as “participatory, consensus-oriented, accountable, transparent, responsive, effective and efficient, equitable and inclusive, and follows the rule of law.”*

Generally, 57.2 percent of respondents expressed satisfaction with good governance and institutions. Non-Caymanians rated good governance and institutions at 60.2 percent satisfaction, while Caymanians rated them at 53.5 percent. Approximately 1 in 6 Caymanians (15.7%) were dissatisfied with good governance and institutions. As shown in Table 9.25, roughly 26.2 percent of Caymanian respondents were indifferent (neither satisfied nor dissatisfied) regarding the quality of governance and institutions.

Road Transportation.

To obtain respondents' views on road transportation, the question was *“How satisfied are you with the following aspects of road transportation?”*¹³

The overall satisfaction score for road and transportation among residents of Bodden Town was 36.5 percent, with Caymanian respondents rating it 31.6 percent, the lowest transportation rating. This low satisfaction or high dissatisfaction emanated from travelling time on the roads, as well as the knowledge and training of road users.

As shown in Tables 9.26 and 9.27, satisfaction with travelling time on the roads for Bodden Town was 24.0 percent, and 19.5 percent among Caymanians.

The travelling time satisfaction score for North Side was even lower than that of Bodden Town, with 20.6 percent. It was 11.3 percent among Caymanians.

In addition to road travel time, Caymanian respondents were most dissatisfied with the knowledge and training of road users. This scored 13.2 percent among residents of Bodden Town, followed by North Side (21.2%), George Town (34.9%), West Bay (46.3%), and East End (52.9%). Sister Islands had a reasonable satisfaction score of 61.6 percent.

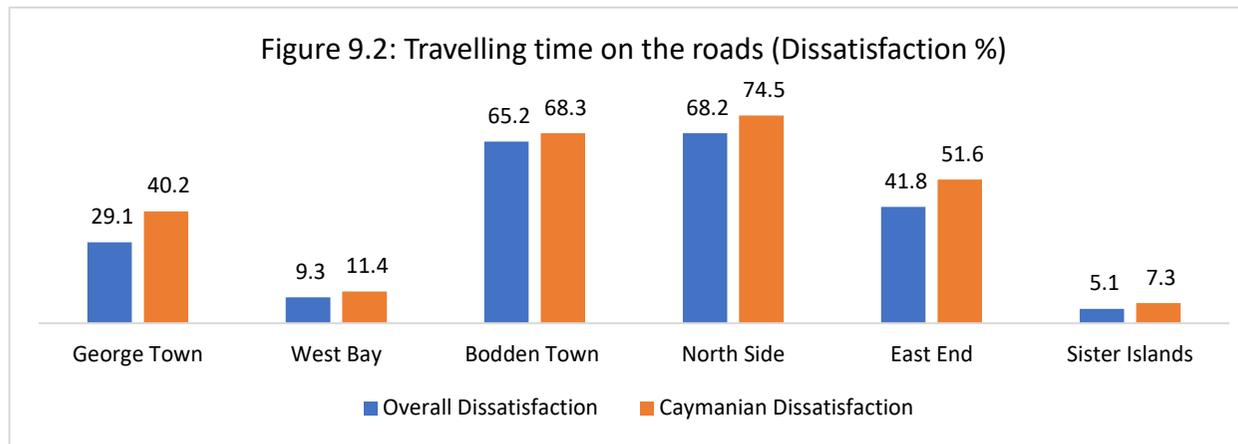
Travelling time on the roads. Long drives on the road can leave commuters feeling physically drained (fatigued eyes and muscles). These short-term effects can show the strain driving puts on the body. From sitting posture to the glare of the road, every aspect of driving can contribute to immediate health issues and the quality of life. Generally, approximately 53.3 percent of commuters are satisfied with their

travelling time, another 32.3 percent are dissatisfied, and 14.4 percent are indifferent (see Table 9.28). The percentage of satisfied Caymanian commuters was higher (44.5%) than that of those who were dissatisfied (41.5%) with the travel time on the roads. It is plausible to assume that respondents' satisfaction or dissatisfaction depends upon the residential location relative to the intended destination.

The eastern districts expressed the highest dissatisfaction with travel time due to traffic congestion. As depicted in Figure 9.2, Bodden Town, North Side, and East End expressed dissatisfaction rates of 65.2 percent, 68.2 percent, and 41.8 percent, respectively. Caymanians led these dissatisfaction rates in the respective districts with 65.2 percent in Bodden Town, 74.5 percent in North Side, and 51.6 percent in East End.



Water drainage on the roads. Caymanian respondents are generally unhappy with the inadequate road drainage during weather events and heavy rain. The dissatisfaction score was 24.8 percent, compared with the satisfaction score of 56.0 percent, while the remaining 19.2 percent remained indifferent. Among Caymanian road users, 52.9 percent were satisfied with the water drainage system.

Road users' knowledge and training. About 33.0 percent of respondents believed that road users were adequately trained and followed the road code rules. Approximately 43.9 percent were dissatisfied with the knowledge and training of road users. Satisfaction among Caymanians (25.8%) was lower, while dissatisfaction (55.7%) was higher.

Adequate road network. Roads play a vital role in the logistics industry and the economy, keeping goods on grocery shelves and supply chains protected. Is the current road network short of the many economic demands that are expected of it? Quality of life survey respondents rated their satisfaction with the adequacy of the road network at 56.8 percent, while Caymanians rated it at 49.7 percent. Dissatisfaction was highest among Caymanians at 26.3 percent and non-Caymanians at 9.3 percent (see Table 9.31).

Road construction/repair. The overall satisfaction was 60.4 percent. In contrast, Caymanians (53.2%) were generally satisfied with the timing of road construction and repair, while non-Caymanians (69.6%) were even more satisfied (see Table 9.32).

Human Capital Development.

Human capital consists of the knowledge, skills, and health that people accumulate throughout their lives, enabling them to realise their potential as productive members of society. Developing human capital can reduce poverty and create a more inclusive society. To obtain respondents' sentiments on human capital development in the Cayman Islands, the question was *“How satisfied are you with the following aspects of human capital development¹⁴?”*

As shown in Table 9.33, East End respondents (66.6%) rated human capital development highest among all districts. Caymanian respondents also rated East End highest, with 72.1

percent satisfaction. The lowest overall satisfaction rating was from Bodden Town, with 47.7 percent. The lowest rating among Caymanians was from Bodden Town, with 46.5 percent strongly influenced by a low rating for entrepreneurial support for small business development (29.0%).

Education and schools.

Education and schools are crucial for acquiring foundational knowledge, developing social and personal skills, preparing for future careers, and contributing to societal development. They play a central role in individual growth and the advancement of society as a whole. In the

assessment of investment in education and schools, 65.9 percent of respondents were satisfied with the current facilities and curriculum, with 11.3 percent dissatisfied (see Table 9.35). Although Caymanian respondents were generally happy, 65.8 percent were satisfied, while 16.3 percent were dissatisfied.

Healthcare and public health. Public Health is essential to the local population, as it ensures everyone understands health hazards through educational programmes and campaigns, thereby influencing government policies. Public health supports individuals, organisations, and society in tackling preventable disease, mortality, and disability through prevention (reducing the incidence of ill health and supporting a healthier lifestyle) and protection (surveillance and monitoring of infectious diseases, emergency response, and immunisation). About 73.4 percent of respondents were satisfied with

investments in health care and public health, and Caymanian satisfaction was 72.6 percent (see Table 9.36). Caymanians had the highest dissatisfaction at 11.6 percent, with another 15.9 percent indifferent between satisfied and dissatisfied.

Job training and vocational programs.

While traditional academic paths have value, vocational and technical education offers a unique approach that aligns with industry needs, fostering greater job readiness and economic mobility. Vocational education differs from technical education because it teaches the hands-on skills needed to do a job; many skills are combined to learn a vocational trade. Approximately 54.4 percent of respondents were satisfied with job training and vocational programs (see Table 9.37). The dissatisfaction score was highest among Caymanians with 18.2 percent. About 53.1 percent of Caymanians were satisfied, while 28.7 percent were indifferent.

Entrepreneurship support (small business training, etc.). Entrepreneurship includes developing and managing new business ventures to make a profit or achieve another aim. It is frequently credited as a major driver of economic growth, spurring transformation, the creation of new markets, innovation, and building wealth. Additionally, it is often key to developing ideas and solutions to problems while creating new products. Almost one in five Caymanian respondents (17.7%) was dissatisfied with the entrepreneurial support offered in the Cayman Islands. Table 9.38 shows that most respondents (46.6%) were neither satisfied nor dissatisfied. 35.8 percent of Caymanians were indifferent, and 46.5 percent were satisfied.

Community centres and recreational facilities. Access to recreational facilities significantly enhances the quality of life.

Communities with ample green spaces and trails are more attractive places to live, work, and raise families. These activities may include beaches, non-motorized racetrack activities, sports fields, picnic areas, parks, and other similar uses.

Table 9.40 shows that 52.5 percent of Caymanian respondents were satisfied with the community centres and recreational facilities; the overall satisfaction rate was slightly higher at 54.8 percent. The dissatisfaction rate among Caymanians was 21.4 percent.

Adult education and lifelong learning.

Lifelong learning starts at birth and extends across the whole lifespan. It provides people of all ages with learning opportunities that respond to their specific needs at different life and professional stages. Adult learning is part of lifelong learning and is geared toward adult participants (people 25 years or older). It enhances the learning process with experience and is also geared to give adults a second chance at education and personal development.

Quality of life survey respondents rated their satisfaction with current initiatives and policies to enhance adult education and lifelong learning at 47.3 percent. Caymanian respondents (48.6%) were slightly higher than non-Caymanian respondents (46.4%) (see Table 9.41).

Approximately four in ten persons are indifferent to adult education and lifelong learning (40.4%), and one in two non-Caymanians are indifferent.

Fieldwork was conducted from September 28 to November 19, 2025. Trained enumerators conducted household interviews. Of the 2,000 randomly selected household samples, 1,782 were actual occupied households, and of these, 1,722 completed (fully or partially) the survey.

11. METHODOLOGY

Quality of life (QOL) is broader than economic production and living standards and includes individuals’ overall satisfaction and well-being. This concept is shaped by physical, psychological, social, and environmental factors. A high quality of life makes individuals feel happier, healthier, and more fulfilled.

Similar to leading countries with quality-of-life indicators, the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO) proposes to build on the following six (6) dimensions: health, employment and job quality, material living conditions, economic and physical safety, leisure and social activities, and natural and living environment.

To implement the framework, a set of indicators based on existing survey data covering as many dimensions as possible. Several headline indicators were selected for each dimension, which will be monitored annually. Data was collected jointly with the Labour Force Survey (LFS). ESO enumerators administered a representative sample (proportional to the number of households in the district) survey to obtain Quality of Life (QOL) indicators, including both subjective and objective indicators. Subjective indicators are survey responses based on

personal opinions and feelings, while objective indicators are verifiable facts and evidence. The quality-of-life survey questions were administered ONLY to persons 18 years of age or older.

Analytical tables were calculated for the actual responses, excluding “Don’t Know” and “Not Stated,” which were treated as non-responses.

QOL Scoring. The QOL dimensions were scored on a 100-point scale. A higher score indicates that respondents and residents are more satisfied with their quality of life, while lower scores indicate greater dissatisfaction.



QOL Weighting. A weighting system derived an overall QOL score from the six dimensions. Weights were derived by asking respondents to indicate their preference for maintaining a good quality of life, allocating 100 points across the six dimensions, with more points to the most important dimension and fewer to the least important.
